Academic Achievement Specialist</p> <p>Centennial MS will partner with the HS to employ an Academic Achievement Specialist (AAS) for FY 2013 and 2014, in an effort to boost student achievement. At the end of the first year of School Improvement, student proficiency rates are still very low and the school received an overall rating of a 'D'. This specialist will be responsible for coordinating all academic student interventions and supervising the intervention teachers (see number 6). These interventions will include students not meeting ACE/graduation requirements, as well as students not meeting standards. In addition to coordinating the interventions, the AAS will provide direct support to non-proficient students.</p>
(page 32) Item #12	<p>6. Attendance Advocate</p> <p>Oklahoma Centennial MS reported the 2011-12 Student Attendance Rate as 93.3%. Currently, Oklahoma Centennial HS and MS share an Attendance Advocate (funded through Title I funds). In an effort to improve the MS and HS attendance rates (HS was 87.9% in 2011-12), an additional Attendance Advocate will be hired to work with MS students. The current Attendance Advocate will focus on the HS.</p>

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page 7	With the carryover funds, Centennial HS was able to expand the grant to include the purchase of technology materials to support our Academy of Information Technology (AOIT) initiative. Centennial is opening the AOIT in the Fall of 2012 using the National Academy Foundation model as a vehicle for school reform. This model is intended to provide students with an education that is engaging and relevant to today's society. This program will also produce graduates who are employable, tech-savvy, college and career ready. Funds will be used to purchase specialized technology for the AOIT Learning Lab, as well as additional technology to support classroom instruction and authentic learning across the curriculum.
