Site Data Profile 2012-2013



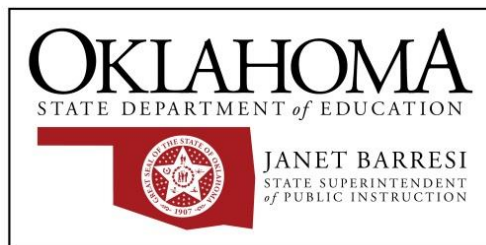

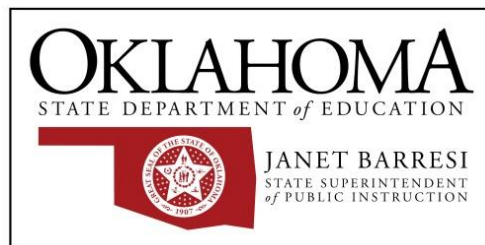
