

**TITLE III, PART A—SUBGRANT FOR IMMIGRANT CHILDREN AND YOUTH**  
**OKLAHOMA’S ELIGIBILITY REQUIREMENTS**

**Immigrant Children and Youth<sup>1</sup> Subgrant Eligibility Requirements:**

Only districts with a significant **increase** of at least **2% of the total immigrant population** and **20 immigrant students** are eligible. A “significant increase” is based upon a minimum 2% increase of the average of a district’s total **immigrant** student population over the previous two academic years.

**Definitions:**

Number	Key Term	Definition
1	Immigrant Children and Youth:	The term immigrant means individuals who: (A) are aged 3 through 21; (B) were <b>not born</b> in any State <sup>2</sup> ; and (C) have not been attending one or more schools in any one or more States for more than 3 full academic years <sup>3</sup> .
2	State:	This includes each of the 50 States, the District of Columbia, and Puerto Rico. This definition is for Title III purposes only and is unlike the definition of “State” in Section 9101 of the Elementary and Secondary Education Act (ESEA), which applies generally to ESEA programs. Section 9101 does include the outlying areas.
3	Full Academic Year (FAY):	The Title I definition of Full Academic Year <b>does not apply</b> to Title III. Note: Academic years are cumulative and do not start over each time a student reenrolls in a school in the United States.
