



- Pre-Kindergarten is voluntary on the part of the students, parents, and the school district, yet a record number of students were enrolled in school year 2010.
- An estimated 75% of four-year-old children attend public school Pre-Kindergarten classes in Oklahoma.

- Attendance in a half-day Kindergarten program is required for all students aged 5 on or before September 1.
- More than 92% of Kindergarten students attend full-day programs.
- By 2011, all districts must offer a full-day program with the exception of districts with 85% bonded indebtedness.
- State funding for both Pre-Kindergarten and Kindergarten classes is provided to schools on a weighted basis in the school funding or "State Aid" formula.




