The Scholarship

The DREAM Institute has established a scholar award for students with physical and/or learning disabilities that are pursuing a higher education degree at a state college or university (see eligibility below). The scholarship program can provide funds for tuition, fees, books, and academic (tutoring) assistance for full time students. Scholarship amounts are based on the student's financial need and is intended to fill the gap where funding is lacking per semester. While the scholarship program is awarded for two or four year programs, eligibility is reviewed annually based on performance at the discretion of the scholarship committee. If selected as a DREAM Institute Scholar, the scholar is eligible to receive tutoring (academic) assistance services and the funding of the service is at the discretion of the scholarship committee. (Note: scholarships are for tuition, fees, books, and/or additional funding are at the discretion of the HEAP Scholarship Selection Committee.)

In addition, the recipient will participate in an orientation workshop designed to equip the student with the basics on what they will need to know and do as they begin their academic experience in higher education. The DREAM Institute will match an academic and professional mentor(s).

DEADLINE TO SUBMITT APPLICATION is May 1, 2013!
(It must be post marked no later than May 1, 2013. No exceptions.
