

## RULE IMPACT STATEMENT

### TITLE 210. STATE DEPARTMENT OF EDUCATION CHAPTER 20. STAFF SUBCHAPTER 9. PROFESSIONAL STANDARDS: TEACHER EDUCATION AND CERTIFICATION

- a. **What is the purpose of the proposed rule change?**  
The proposed amendment to 210:20-9-95 implements changes to the effective dates of renewed teaching certificates under Senate Bill 29, which went into effect July 1. Under SB 29, a certificate that expires on June 30 will be renewed with an effective date of July 1, if the applicant for renewal submits a completed renewal application and fee to the State Department of Education by December 31 of the same year the certificate expired. The proposed amendment incorporates the new statutory effective date, and also provides that an applicant for renewal who submits their application and fee after December 31 will have their certificate renewed with an effective date of the first day of the month in which the application and fee are received. This rule change is necessary as an emergency amendment to incorporate the new statutory effective date for certificates renewed by December 31 of the same year they expire.
- b. **What classes of persons will be affected by the proposed rule change and what classes of persons will bear the costs of the proposed rule change?**  
The proposed changes will affect certified teachers and their employing school districts.
- c. **What classes of persons will benefit from the proposed rule change?**  
The proposed changes will benefit certified teachers and their employing school districts.
- d. **What is the probable economic impact of the proposed rule upon affected classes of persons or political subdivisions?**  
The agency does not anticipate any economic impact upon affected classes of persons or political subdivisions as a result of implementation of the proposed rule change at this time.
- e. **What is the probable cost to the agency to implement and enforce the proposed rule change?**  
The agency does not anticipate any cost to the agency to implement and enforce as a result of the proposed change in the rule at this time. Additional record keeping, if any, will be performed by existing staff.
- f. **What is the economic impact on any political subdivision to implement the proposed rule change?**  
The agency does not anticipate any economic impact on any political subdivision to implement the proposed rule change at this time.
- g. **Will implementing the rule change have an adverse effect on small business as provided by the Oklahoma Small Business Regulatory Flexibility Act?**
