SUBJECT: Reimbursement for Alternative Reading Proficiency Tests - 2015-2016 School Year

(Please forward this memo to the person responsible for reimbursement claims for the 8th Grade Reading Proficiency Alternative Tests.)

Based on Section 6-107.3, Title 47, of the Oklahoma Statutes, any person under the age of 18 years wishing to apply for a driver's license or permit must demonstrate a satisfactory reading ability at the eighth-grade level (unless the student is on an individualized education program [IEP] and performing satisfactorily in reading according to the IEP). Public school students must therefore successfully complete the eighth-grade state reading test or an alternative test approved by the State Department of Education.

Public schools must give an alternative reading test four times per year to students who attend public school as well as to nonpublic school students. The first alternative administration is free to all students but reimbursable to schools. Schools may charge students up to \$25 for subsequent test administrations.

Contingent on the availability of appropriated funds, the State Department of Education will reimburse schools up to \$25 for each student who is given the first alternative reading test. Reimbursements will be disbursed until funds are exhausted. To request reimbursement, submit the following information by e-mail to amy.nicar@sde.ok.gov for the testing claim windows below:
