


#### Total Financial Support of Public Schools (Formula) and Average Daily Membership (ADM)






# Statewide Enrollment by Race/Ethnicity 2015-2016


# Students Eligible for Free and Reduced Lunch



# Students with Individualized Education Plans (IEPs)




