Chapter 10. School Administration and Instructional Services

Subchapter 1. General Provisions

- a. **What is the purpose of the proposed rule change?**
The State Board of Education revoked by emergency action rules relating to the implementation of the Oklahoma Education Transfers Act. Previous rules were outdated and did not reflect current law. Proposed rules have been updated to reflect current statutory requirements and clarify departmental policy and procedure. Proposed rules address open, emergency, special education and gifted transfers.

Parents and students seeking transfers, and both receiving and resident school districts will be affected by the rule. There is no additional cost to implementation of this rule.
