The State Board of Education (Board) met in regular session at 1:03 p.m. on Thursday, December 16, 2021, in the Board Room of the Oliver Hodge Education Building at 2500 North Lincoln Boulevard, Oklahoma City, Oklahoma. The final agenda was posted at 11:30 a.m. on Wednesday, December 15, 2021.

CALL TO ORDER ROLL CALL

State Superintendent Joy Hofmeister called the State Board of Education regular meeting to order at 1:03 p.m. Ms. Cheadle called the roll and ascertained there was a quorum.

PLEDGE OF ALLEGIANCE, OKLAHOMA FLAG SALUTE, AND MOMENT OF SILENCE

Superintendent Hofmeister led Board Members and all present in the Pledge of Allegiance to the American Flag, a salute to the Oklahoma Flag, and a moment of silence.

LEGAL SERVICES/STATE BOARD OF EDUCATION OFFICE

Withhold \$9,111,727.60 from Epic Charter Schools, pursuant to 70 O.S. § 18-118 - Approved

Brad Clark, General Counsel, said the Office of the State Auditor and Inspector conducted a special investigative audit July 2019 of Epic Charter Schools and all Epic entities. Mr. Clark presented the three-year audit (2016, 2017 and 2018) released October 1, 2020 that disclosed \$11.23M improper apportionment, disbursements, and fund classification and recommendation to withhold \$9,111,727.60 from Epic Charter Schools.

Board members discussed an asked questions regarding the presentation that included Administrative Cost laws and regulations, administrative codes, functions discrepancies/penalties; Title VII fund disbursements; State Board of Education (SBE) responsibilities, reimbursement demands, SAI Audit findings and penalties; Epic response timeline; OSDE independent review; school and board change of power, current administration working with SDE and State Auditor in timely responses, no financial determination disputes and final determination.

Board member Bobek moved to approve withholding \$9,111,727.60 from Epic Charter Schools' state aid, over the next 12 months, beginning with the next allocation. Board member Hernandez seconded the motion. The motion carried with the following votes: Mr. Smith, yes; Ms. Hernandez, yes; Mr. Bobek, yes; Ms. Monies, yes; and Superintendent Hofmeister, yes.

PUBLIC COMMENT

Patricia Fuentes, NAACP Chair, signed up to address pandemic impact and changes effect Oklahoma children, public schools, and teaching environment of black, Hispanic, and low-income students to guarantee their quality education.

Resolve into Executive Session

pursuant to 25 O.S. §§ 307 (B) (4) (7) and (8) for the purpose of conducting confidential communication between the State Board of Education and legal counsel concerning Western Heights Independent School District No. I-41 of Oklahoma County and Mannix Barnes, Superintendent v. State of Oklahoma, ex rel., Oklahoma State Board of Education, et al., Case No. CV-21-9457, in the District Court of Oklahoma County, State of Oklahoma, Case No. 119799, in the Supreme Court of the State of Oklahoma, the State Board having been advised by legal counsel that disclosure will seriously impair the ability of the State Board to conduct the litigation in the public interest.

Convene into Executive Session

Board member Bobek moved to convene into Executive Session at 11:35 a.m. Board member Monies seconded. The motion carried with the following votes: Mr. Smith, yes; Ms. Hernandez, yes; Mr. Bobek, yes; Ms. Monies, yes; and Superintendent Hofmeister, yes.

Return to Open Session

Board member Bobek moved return to Open Session at 2:32 p.m. Board member Monies seconded. The motion carried with the following votes: Mr. Smith, yes; Ms. Hernandez, yes; Mr. Bobek, yes; Ms. Monies, yes; and Superintendent Hofmeister, yes.

Superintendent Hofmeister said no decisions made during the Executive Session. Mr. Jett remained in the Executive Session.

Approved, modify, and/or deny actions and inactions of Western Heights Public Schools Board of Education at its November 8, 2021, and December 13, 2021, meeting pursuant the terms of conditions of State Intervention and Accredited with probation, as modified on July 12, 2021 – Approved

Board members asked questions and discussed Mr. Clark's review of the July 2021 modified accreditation status, state intervention, terms and conditions, local school board meetings; Mannix Barnes emergency suspension of teaching certificates court appeals, Judge Timmons November 19 ruling, OSDE authority of accreditation and operations, SBE statutory, constitutional authority and intervention actions; SBE support to Western Heights community, address local school board decisions to service students, board member resignation requests and new board leadership.

Travis Jett, Counsel to the Board advised on the court ruling CV-21-945, SBE authority, intervention, and modification of local school board's denial to hire two 8th grade coaches.

Board member Monies said pursuant to the State Board's authority, as outlined in CV-21-945, to intervene and operate Western Heights School District moved to modify and revise the Western Heights School Board's decision and hire William Boone and Brian McBee. Board member Bobek seconded the motion. The motion carried with the following votes: Mr. Smith, yes; Ms. Hernandez, yes; Mr. Bobek, yes; Ms. Monies, yes; and Superintendent Hofmeister, yes.

Approve the renewal of the charter school sponsorship contract between the Academy of Seminole, and the State Board of Education - Approved

Mr. Clark advised on Agenda item 4. (d) (e) and (f) related to the State Board of Education five-year renewal contracts for charter school sponsorship expiring June 30, 2021. Charter schools recommended for five-year renewal included Academy of Seminole, LeMonde International Schools, and Office of Juvenile Affairs.

Board member Smith moved to approve the Academy of Seminole charter school sponsorship 5-year contract renewal and to present framework later. Board member Bobek seconded the motion. The motion carried with the following votes: Mr. Smith, yes; Ms. Hernandez, yes; Mr. Bobek, yes; and Ms. Monies, yes.

Approve the renewal of the charter school sponsorship contract between the Le Monde International School, and the State Board of Education - Approved

Mr. Clark advised a correction was made to the grade span to reflect preK-8 not preK-12.

Board member Monies moved to approve the charter school sponsorship 5-year contract renewal with LeMonde International School with the caveat to change the grade span from pre-K-12 to preK-8. Board member Hernandez seconded the motion. The motion carried with the following votes: Mr. Smith, yes; Ms. Hernandez, yes; Mr. Bobek, yes; and Ms. Monies, yes.

Approve the renewal of the charter school sponsorship contract between the Office of Juvenile Affairs, and the State Board of Education - Approved

Board member Hernandez moved to approve the charter school sponsorship 5-year contract renewal with Office of Juvenile Affairs. Board member Monies seconded the motion. The motion carried with the following votes: Mr. Smith, yes; Ms. Hernandez, yes; Mr. Bobek, yes; and Ms. Monies, yes.

GOVERNMENT AFFAIRS

Presentation on the American Rescue Plan's (ARP), Coronavirus Response and Relief Supplemental Appropriations (CRRSA) Act and the Coronavirus Aid, Relief and Economic Security (CARES) Act

Carolyn Thompson, Chief of Government Affairs/ Deputy Chief of Staff presented an update on the use of congressional appropriated COVID relief funds for common education that included federal and state funding legislation (CARES Act, CRRSA, ARP), funding in Elementary and Secondary Emergency Relief (ESSER I, II, III) required distributions, reserve percentages, and State Education Agency (SEA) flexibilities and waivers; United State Department of Education (USDE) grant process, awards, state allocation requirements and expenditure timelines.

Board members discussed and asked questions regarding USDE ESSER I, II, III, and required ARP state plan, application process, stakeholders, and fund distributions/timelines; use of prescribed percentages to prepare/respond to COVID-19, expenditures, and emergency needs grant; administrative fund use and initiatives.
