

### **Advanced Placement Summer Workshops**

Each year, the Oklahoma State Department of Education offers week-long summer workshops for teachers of Advanced Placement courses. The workshops provide guidance and resources for effective instructional practices to support students in being successful in Advanced Placement courses and on Advanced Placement exams. The 2019 workshops were facilitated by the University of Oklahoma.

The University of Oklahoma provided 11 workshops for 243 participants in 2019



#### **Cost Versus Benefits**

Oklahoma, public high school students earned **12,726** qualifying AP® scores of 3, 4, or 5 in 2019.

- These scores translate into 38,178 potential college credits.
- At a cost of \$307.67 per college credit, the potential tuition and fee savings to Oklahoma students and families is \$11,746,225.
