CALL TO ORDER ROLL CALL

State Superintendent Joy Hofmeister called the State Board of Education regular meeting to order at 9:33 a.m. Ms. Cheadle called the roll and ascertained there was a quorum.

PLEDGE OF ALLEGIANCE, OKLAHOMA FLAG SALUTE, AND MOMENT OF SILENCE

Superintendent Hofmeister led Board Members and all present in the Pledge of Allegiance to the American Flag, a salute to the Oklahoma Flag, and a moment of silence.

STATE SUPERINTENDENT

Information from the State Superintendent

Superintendent Hofmeister welcomed everyone to the meeting and advised the meeting will move swiftly to be respectful to board member schedules and maintain a quorum.

Updates were provided regarding the launch of the Oklahoma COVID-19 Prevention Program with OSDE and Oklahoma State Department of Health (OSDH) partnership. The Centers for Disease Control \$119 million grant will provide school districts, up to \$1 million and per student enrollment, funds to cover costs/resources to reduce spread of COVID-19; Congratulations to Oklahoma National Blue Ribbon Schools recognized by the United States Secretary of Education that included Ardmore Public School, Chisholm Middle School and Chisholm Public School, Edmond Memorial Elementary, McAllister Public School District, Huber Elementary School, Enid Public School District-Elementary School, Laverne Public School District, Pioneer School and Pioneer Public School District in Chickasha.

STUDENT LEARNING & ACHIEVEMENT

2020-2021 Statewide Assessment Results

Maria Cammack, Deputy Superintendent of Assessment, Accountability, Data Systems and Research, Dr. Bryan Koerner, Assistant Deputy Superintendent, and Dr. Juan D'Brot, Senior Associate, Center for Assessment, presented the spring 2021 statewide testing data results, state/nationwide effects of COVID-19 pandemic, instruction disruptions. Results review included federal and state required student testing Grades 3-8 assessments, mathematics and reading assessments, English language arts (ELA); Grades 5 and 8 science, Grade 11 ACT or SAT test and state science assessment; No spring 2020 assessments administered, COVID-19 school shutdowns and challenges, no accountability/report card data; 2020 State Board approved accountability flexibilities extending testing window, federal waiver for spring 2021 statewide testing participation, 2019 and 2021 spring assessment proficiencies, student grade level performance, test score

tools; and Tiffany Neill, Deputy Superintendent of Curriculum and Instruction addressed, national and local acceleration plans to fill student gaps, strategies to accelerate students up to grade level versus backfilling a year, acceleration programs and models, school support, resources and guidance accessible on OSDE website.

GOVERNMENT AFFAIRS

FY2023 State Department of Education Legislative budget request

Nat Barrack, Legislative Analyst, presented the \$3.26 billion FY2023 budget request recommended for the budgetary needs for school districts and includes state aid, supervision of general and special education functions, and administration.

Mr. Barrack and Mathangi Shankar, Chief Financial Officer-SDE overviewed and highlighted budgeted areas prioritized through the funding formula. Board members discussed and asked questions regarding funding increases and reduction areas due to student enrollment growth, program, and instructional materials cost; agency state/federal fund compliance, oversight, and legislative requirements; and state agency employee retention comparisons, discrepancies, and challenges.

Board member Smith moved to approve the FY2023 budget request. Board member Williams Bradley seconded the motion. The motion carried with the following votes: Mr. Smith, yes; Ms. Williams Bradley, yes; Ms. Hernandez, yes; Mr. Bobek, yes; and Superintendent Hofmeister, yes.

LEGAL SERVICES/STATE BOARD OF EDUCATION OFFICE

Update, discussion, and possible action regarding Western Heights Independent School District, and a possible action to amend the terms of the District's status of accredited with probation

Brad Clark, General Counsel, presented a report of the Western Heights Independent School District April 2021 accreditation with probation 90-day compliance, monthly updates, state interventions; interim superintendent, school opening, COVID-19 effects; district facility conditions, transportation challenges, staffing and professional development; district employee relations and local board of education court ordered compliance.

Monty Guthrie, Deputy Superintendent of Finance & Federal Programs, and interim superintendent, said things were working together due to the tremendous amount of teamwork and support from varied state agencies, OSDE, district employee and community commitments. The goal is to develop a 'I want to be at Western Heights long term regardless of culture or grade level' and for the local board to move forward.

Board members asked questions and discussed amended accredited with probation status recommendation to include periodic intervention plan status updates, staff recruitment, and retention.

Pending investigation, claim, or action relating to

Ninnekah Public Schools, and possible action to amend accreditation status – Approved

Mr. Clark reviewed the accreditation status of Ninnekah Public Schools, updates on district investigative findings, sexual assaults on students, prior years of alleged misconduct, Title IX violations, compliance, district obligations and student rights.

Based on reported failure of obligations by Ninnekah Public Schools to properly implement the Title IX protections that help guard against the sexual discrimination and harassment of students, Mr. Clark presented the OSDE recommendation to amend the Ninnekah Public Schools District's accreditation status to Accreditation with Probation, with conditions of probation to include: development and implementation of a Corrective Action Plan; regular updates to the State Board on progress and steps taken; and appropriate support of the district's new Title IX team.

Robin Morris, Interim Superintendent and Regina Jones, Title XI Coordinator, Ninnekah Public Schools provided school board policy revisions, corrective action plan and trainings.

Board member Smith moved to approve the accredited with probation with conditions of the district as recommended. Board member Bobek seconded the motion. The motion carried with the following votes: Mr. Smith, yes; Ms. Williams Bradley, yes; Ms. Hernandez, yes; Mr. Bobek, yes; and Superintendent Hofmeister, yes.
