CALL TO ORDER AND ROLL CALL

State Superintendent Joy Hofmeister called the State Board of Education regular meeting to order at 9:30 a.m. and welcomed everyone to the meeting. Ms. Cheadle called the roll and ascertained there was a quorum.

Ryan Pieper, Executive Director, Accreditation, reported October 1st is the accreditation waiver request deadline, unless other reasons prohibit compliance. Felt Public School District complied with the deadline but the request was sent to the wrong location which delayed the process.

Brad Clark, General Counsel, recommended no action be taken on the waiver request of Kale Hixon-Shattuck Public Schools in order to allow further review of (his) the teaching assignment.

STUDENT LEARNING & ACHIEVEMENT

Proposed Oklahoma Academic Standards for Fine Arts – Approved

Dr. Elizabeth Munn, Director of Fine Arts, presented a recommendation request of the proposed Oklahoma Academic Standards (OAS) for Fine Arts. Board members asked questions and discussed Dr. Munn's overview that included the standards legislation, SBE adoption, committees and teams; encompassed design, development/achievement, study/enrichment, student skills, grade levels; four artistic processes, disciplines; legislative approval and 2020-2021 implementation.

Board member Hernandez moved to approve the proposed OAS for Fine Arts. Board member Bollenbach seconded the motion. The motion carried with the following votes: Ms. Monies, yes; Mr. Bobek, yes; Ms. Williams Bradley, yes; Mr. Bollenbach, yes; Ms. Hernandez, yes; and Superintendent Hofmeister, yes.

Proposed Oklahoma Academic Standards for Science – Approved

Tiffany Neill, Executive Director, Office of Curriculum & Instruction, presented a recommendation request of the proposed revisions of the 2014 Oklahoma Academic Standards (OAS) for Science.

Board members asked questions and discussed Ms. Neill's overview that included SBE review/adoption; standards revision criteria, attributes, process, vision and committees/team participants; contributing research and resources; frameworks, investigative science dimensions, incorporate grade levels; statewide focus group/feedback; legislative approval and summer implementation.

Board member Bollenbach moved to approve the proposed OAS for Science. Board member Williams Bradley seconded the motion. The motion carried with the following votes: Ms. Hernandez, yes; Mr. Bollenbach yes; Ms. Williams Bradley, yes; Mr. Bobek abstain; Ms. Monies, yes; and Superintendent Hofmeister, yes.

Focused Field of Study for Biomedical Sciences at Pioneer Technology Center - Approved

Levi Patrick, Assistant Executive Director, Office of Curriculum & Instruction, presented a recommendation request for a Focused Field of Career Study in Biomedical Sciences academy offered to tenth grade students at Pioneer Technology Center.

Board members asked questions and discussed Mr. Patrick's review of the Career Tech advanced program services, SBE responsibility/requirements, career program application and process; course work requirements/review/findings; support structures, standards alignment, and education partnerships.

Kendra Keelin, Pioneer Technology Center, Ponca City, in response to Board member Monies questions why additional Bio Med program was needed, said Pioneer has industry partners that benefit from having more STEM related industries such as Phillip 66, as well as laboratories and hospitals.

Amended Rules Adoption Approved

Lori Murphy, Assistant General Counsel presented a request to adopt the following rule amendments:

Board member Monies moved to adopt the amended rules request. Board member Hernandez seconded the motion. The motion carried with the following votes: Ms. Hernandez, yes; Mr. Bollenbach yes; Ms. Williams Bradley, yes; Mr. Bobek yes; Ms. Monies, yes; and Superintendent Hofmeister, yes.

Current activities, operations and status, including accreditation of Albion Public Schools and Keyes Public Schools

Mr. Clark presented recommendation requests regarding the current status and operations for Keyes Public School District and Albion Public School District relating to federal/state public school program criteria, reports, finance, and special education compliances.

The school district status report includes district location, academics, 2018-2019 Report Card, yearly enrollment; SBE/State law regulations of administration, local school board, finance, personnel; accreditation deficiencies, state and federal standards noncompliance of special education and alternative education.

Mr. Clark said Keyes Public School District is currently accredited with warning and recommended accredited with probation status. The status meets the three state annexation considerations 1. District academically at-risk; 2. District non-accredited, and 3. District fails to open or maintain a school. The district Superintendent Freda Burgess is aware and believes the district should close. It is his understanding the local school board members have discussed annexation and do not want to make the decision, but rather the decision be made by the State Board of Education (SBE). In conjunction with the recommended accrediting status change also officially notify the school district that effective June 30, 2020, the SBE will consider annexation as early as March.

Board members asked questions and discussed district annex and personnel notification, personnel, *probable* school districts and proximity; consolidation fund availability, employee severance; community response/input; SDE monitoring, communications, support; and develop comprehensive accrediting process/progress.

The Albion Public School District report included district location, academics, 2018-2019 K-8 Report Card; non-compliant financial reporting, penalties, and forfeitures; declined enrollment; school auditor findings; and SDE onsite school review/findings/violations.

Mr. Clark said the recommendation is to accredit with probation, schedule an SDE onsite review team to include RAO, OCAS, and federal programs personnel; provide notifications of findings, corrective actions and recommendations leading up to the March SBE meeting; and notify local law enforcement authorities of the district exceeding of appropriations for action deemed appropriate.

Board member Bollenbach moved to approve the recommendations as set forth by General Counsel on Keyes and Albion Public Schools. Board member Monies seconded the motion. The motion carried with the following votes: Ms. Hernandez, yes; Mr. Bollenbach, yes; Ms. Williams Bradley, yes; Mr. Bobek, yes; Ms. Monies, yes; and Superintendent Hofmeister, yes.

Board member Bobek moved to suspend the teacher certificate and teacher numbers of **Trent Winters** and request the Oolagah Superintendent and board members to appear before the SBE (**OR** appear at the SBE...) at the March 25, 2020 meeting. Board member Hernandez seconded the motion. The motion carried with the following votes: Ms. Monies, yes; Mr. Bobek, yes; Ms. Williams Bradley, yes; Mr. Bollenbach, yes; Ms. Hernandez; yes; and Superintendent Hofmeister, yes.
