FREQUENTLY ASKED QUESTIONS OKLAHOMA WORK ZONE SAFE COURSE

HB2418

HB2418 requires Oklahoma teens applying for an Intermediate Class D License to complete a free course approved by the Oklahoma Department of Transportation on teen driver work zone and first responder safety.

Where can applicants find the course?

The course is accessed online either at workzonesafe.com or through the Service Oklahoma website.

Who must take the course?

- Any Oklahoma teen who is obtaining their Intermediate License.
- Any person, aged fourteen to seventeen years of age, who is applying for a Farm Driving Permit.

How long is the course?

The course is approximately 45 minutes long.

Does the course have to be completed all in one setting?

The course can be taken at the user's pace, whether that is in one setting or multiple logins.

Does the course cost anything?

The course is free to all users.

Do adults need to take this course?

This only applies to teens who are moving from a Learner Permit to an Intermediate Class D License or for those applying for the Farm Driving Permit.





FREQUENTLY ASKED QUESTIONS OKLAHOMA WORK ZONE SAFE COURSE

How does the applicant show proof of completion?

Once a user completes the course, they are issued a completion certificate. The certificate can be printed and taken to a Service Oklahoma or licensed operator location.

When does the certificate need to be submitted?

An application is permitted to submit their completion certificate at the time they obtain their Learner Permit and, if they submit early, will not be required to resubmit when they obtain their Intermediate Class D License. The completion certificate must be on file no later than when the applicant is applying for an Intermediate Class D License.

Does this apply for out-of-state driver license transfers?

If the applicant is a teen with a Learner Permit who would like to obtain their Intermediate License, yes. If the applicant has the equivalent of an Intermediate License from their transferring state, no.

If the applicant already has an Intermediate Class D License prior to November 1, 2023, will the applicant be required to take the course prior to obtaining an unrestricted license after November 1, 2023?

No.

Is this retroactive?

No. The law is effective November 1, 2023 and will only apply to those obtaining an Intermediate Class D License on or after that date.
