Instructions for Racial and Ethnic Data Instructions

- The sponsor is required to complete this form for each site under its jurisdiction each year. Sponsors of residential camps must collect this information for each camp session. For all other sites, the sponsor must count the participating children at least once during the site's operation.
- The sponsor must use data from the nearest school or other sources. Visual identification is no longer allowed. If parent's voluntarily share the racial and ethnic background, this may be recorded.
- To provide flexibility and ensure data quality, separate categories shall be used when collecting and reporting race and ethnicity. Ethnicity shall be collected first.
- The sponsor must retain ethnic data, as well as documentation for the data for 3 years and must safeguard this information to prevent its use for discriminatory purposes. Access to Program records containing racial and ethnic data should be limited to authorized personnel.
