

Advanced Placement Summer Workshops

Each year, the Oklahoma State Department of Education offers week-long summer workshops for teachers of Advanced Placement courses. The workshops provide guidance and resources for effective instructional practices to support students in being successful in Advanced Placement courses and on Advanced Placement exams. The workshops are facilitated by Northeastern State University and the University of Oklahoma.

The University of Oklahoma provided 15 workshops for 244 participants in 2021



Cost Versus Benefits

Oklahoma, public high school students earned **9,434** qualifying AP® scores of 3, 4, or 5 in 2021.

- These scores translate into 28,302 potential college credits.
- At a cost of \$307.67 per college credit, the potential tuition and fee savings to Oklahoma students and families is \$8,707,676.
