The State Board of Education met in regular session at 9:34 a.m. on Thursday, July 25, 2019, in the Board Room of the Oliver Hodge Education Building at 2500 North Lincoln Boulevard, Oklahoma City, Oklahoma. The final agenda was posted at 9:15 a.m. on Wednesday, July 24, 2019.

CALL TO ORDER ROLL CALL

State Superintendent Joy Hofmeister called the State Board of Education regular meeting to order at 9:34 a.m. and welcomed everyone to the meeting. Ms. Cheadle called the roll and ascertained there was a quorum.

PLEDGE OF ALLEGIANCE, OKLAHOMA FLAG SALUTE, AND MOMENT OF SILENCE

Superintendent Hofmeister led Board Members and all present in the Pledge of Allegiance to the American Flag, a salute to the Oklahoma Flag, and a moment of silence.

STATE SUPERINTENDENT

Recognition of Oklahoma U.S. Presidential Scholars Sharara Kasem, Edmond North High School and Julian Zanders, Cascia Hall Preparatory School, Broken Arrow

Superintendent Hofmeister presented Certificates of Recognition to Sharara Kasem and Julian Zanders, Oklahoma's distinguished 2019 U.S. Presidential Scholars recipients. The scholars program recognizes students nationwide for their accomplishments in scholastics, talent, art and career. In June, both scholars traveled to Washington, D.C. to attend the annual National Ceremony and received the U.S. Presidential Scholars Medallion.

Ms. Kasem, a graduate of Edmond North High School, scored a 35 (a near-perfect score) on the ACT. The distinguished senior is an active speech and debate participant, passionate about medicine, global health and human rights, and a lead writer of women's empowerment online platform and political journal "You GO Girl."

Sharara plans to attend Columbia University and become a surgeon focusing on public health. Mr. and Mrs. Kasem, parents; Principal, Debreon Davis and Superintendent, Bret Towne accompanied Ms. Kasem to the meeting.

Board member Bollenbach and Hernandez concurred that after review of the waivers some applications did not provide adequate information in order to make decisions and proper oversight. Consent Docket items and schools identified needing detailed information included **6(a)** Abbreviated School Day-Purcell; **6(b)** Cooperative Agreements-Purcell, Putnam City Evening and SOAR programs; **6(c)** Library Media Services-Gracemont, Dover, Chandler, Checotah, Latta; and **6(e)** General Fund for Capital Expenditures-Bridge Creek, Brushy.

Board members discussed and asked questions regarding waiver requests, emergency/provisional certificates applications and new guidance instruction; and new fall conference "Engage for Administrators."

Brad Clark, General Counsel advised that a proper motion would be to table the identified Consent Docket items needing additional detailed information and vote to approve the remaining items.

Board member Bollenbach moved to approve the non-tabled items remaining on the Consent Docket. Board member Bobek seconded the motion. The motion carried with the following votes: Mr. Bobek, yes; Mr. Bollenbach, yes; Ms. Williams Bradley, yes; Ms. Hernandez, yes; and Superintendent Hofmeister, yes.

STATE BOARD OF EDUCATION

Accreditation status and mandatory annexation of Swink Dependent Elementary School District, C-021 of Choctaw County -Approved

Mr. Clark recapped the discussion on Swink Public School's current situation of at the June 27, 2019 State Board regular meeting. Mr. Clark reviewed Swink district location and surrounding school districts; school board June 2015-May 2019 financials; governing board and personnel resignations; inoperable noncompliant status; statutory compliance notices and timelines. Current activities reported included student transfers, teachers leaving, insurance lapse, school bus retrieved, minimal staff, and a local board meeting posted and convened; and OSDE July notice correspondence.

Mr. Clark recommended non-accrediting the Swink Dependent Elementary School District for the inability to comply with required state and federal laws and annexing Swink Dependent Elementary School to Fort Towson School District, Choctaw County, a four (4) mile neighboring school district.

A non-accrediting, standalone only option, does negatively impact the mechanism of the Consolidation Fund which provides additional funds with an annexation. If annexed, Fort Towson will receive approximately \$773,000 and remaining Swink employees will have access to and opportunity to receive severance.

Board members were advised approving non-accrediting and annexation immediately engages the department to notify families, community members and districts affected, as well as third party entities (banks, vendors, etc.).

Board members discussed and asked questions regarding student enrollments, prospective districts, county and community feedback.

SWINK PUBLIC SCHOOL PATRON PUBLIC COMMENT

Lewis Collins, remaining Swink school board member, and Randall Irwin signed up to address the accreditation status and mandatory annexation of Swink Dependent Elementary School District.

Mr. Collins provided an account of activities by the former administrator, school board members, staff and community. He presented board members with the school district's June bank statements of accounts in efforts to verify the stability of the school finances due to alleged instability; June/July reply to OSDE correspondences and request for assistance letter. Mr. Collins declared publicly he was filing a formal complaint that Mr. Wall be sanctioned by the State Board of Education due to deliberately destroying a school district, and displacing teachers and student.

Mr. Irwin said he was a (former) Regional Accreditation Officer (RAO), (former) State Representative in the Swink district; and experienced 20 year school superintendent. He and Mr. Collins had known one another many years, and knew he is a most fiscally conservative administrator servant. Mr. Collins reached out to him for assistance, and after reviewing the Swink finances determined the district sharing a superintendent was not a

good move. Sharing a superintendent, normally, is a good thing to save money when in the best interest of both schools. Mr. Irwin explained his efforts/results to assist which included contacting resigned local board members, SDE-RAO, new board member search, and state government officials.

Superintendent Hofmeister said the State Board of Education (SBE) previously approved a request from Swink to allow them time to find a way to comply.

Board members discussed and asked questions regarding local board controls and approvals, certified financial documents, audits; certification suspension; Oklahoma law, legislative changes; accrediting (no action) consequences; and mandatory annexation timeline.

Board member Bollenbach motioned to non-accredit Swink Dependent Elementary School District and mandatorily annex Swink Dependent Elementary School to Fort Towson Public School District. Board member Williams Bradley seconded the motion. The motion carried with the following votes: Ms. Hernandez, yes; Ms. Williams Bradley, yes; Mr. Bollenbach, yes; Mr. Bobek, yes; and Superintendent Hofmeister, yes.

Board member Hernandez said more communications, awareness and school board district accountability oversight is also needed.

School district and school site accreditation recommendations for the 2019-2020 school year - Approved

Mr. Clark presented the accreditation recommendations of school districts and school sites for the 2019-2020 school year pursuant to 70 O.S. §§ 3-104.3 and OAC 210:35-3-201. State statutes require the State Board of Education (SBE) to adopt, implement and oversee standards and rules for accreditation of public schools and annual review. Mr. Clark reviewed mandates for district and sites accrediting status, classifications, and defined categories.

Board member Williams Bradley motioned to approve the school site and school district accreditation recommendations for the 2019-2020 school year. Board member Hernandez seconded the motion.

Board member Bollenbach requested a searchable format be provided for the 2020-2021 recommendations.

The motion carried with the following votes: Mr. Bobek, yes; Mr. Bollenbach, yes; Ms. Williams Bradley, yes; Ms. Hernandez, yes; and Superintendent Hofmeister, yes.

Board member Bollenbach seconded the motion. The motion carried with the following votes: Mr. Bobek, yes; Mr. Bollenbach, yes; Ms. Williams Bradley, yes; Ms. Hernandez, yes; and Superintendent Hofmeister, yes.
