## CALL TO ORDER AND ROLL CALL

State Superintendent Joy Hofmeister called the State Board of Education regular meeting to order at 1:00 p.m. and welcomed everyone to the meeting. Ms. Cheadle called the roll and ascertained there was a quorum.

## STATE SUPERINTENDENT

#### **Information from the State Superintendent**

Superintendent Hofmeister said the large scale assessment state testing opens Monday, April 1<sup>st</sup>. The five-week test window allows school district time to accomplish the required assessments and fulfill Civil Rights requirements of meeting the needs of all school children. Preliminary results will be available May 23 for educators and families. Student results can be accessed through the Oklahoma School Report Card dashboard portal with a 10-digit ID number/STN or by contacting the school district.

## Recognition of recipients of the Presidential Award for Excellence in Mathematics and Science Teaching (PAEMST): Michelle Rahn Claremore Public Schools, Will Rogers Junior High and Macey Smith, Norman Public Schools, Washington Elementary

Superintendent Hofmeister introduced/recognized the Oklahoma elementary level national recipients of the Presidential Award of Excellence for science, Michelle Rahn, Will Rogers Junior High, Claremore Public Schools and for mathematics, Macey Stewart, Washington Elementary, Norman Public Schools.

A state committee of scientist/mathematic education researchers and educators selected applicant finalists; and a national committee recommended winners for outstanding K-12 science and math teaching. President Trump announced the 140 recipients in June 2018, all received \$10,000 from the National Science Foundation, and will attend an awards ceremony in Washington, DC summer 2019.

Superintendent presented Certificates of Recognition for their service as models to colleagues, community inspiration and as leaders improving mathematics and science education.

Ms. Rahn's husband, Eric accompanied her to the meeting and Superintendent, Bryan Frazier.

# **GOVERNMENT AFFAIRS**

## Legislative Update

Caroline Thompson, Chief of Government Affairs/Deputy Chief of Staff said as of March 14 House and Senate Bills have processed out of chamber origins. Approximately 2844 were filed, 844 are still alive of which 186 are relating to education.

Ms. Thompson reviewed bills that included **Assessment**-HB 1988, SB 601; **Curriculum**-HB 2641, SB 593, HB 1228; **Teacher**-HB 1780, SB 430, HB 1373; **Funding/Budget**-HB 1926, HB 2520, SB 362, SB 192; **Student Safety**-HB 1308, SB 446, SB 33; and **School Sites**-SB 92, SB 441.

Board members discussed and asked questions on bills regarding school day/hours, rule amendments/development and SBE authorization.
