"In order to receive credit for a course, a student cannot be absent more than 10 days each semester. Oklahoma State law requires school officials to keep attendance records and report excessive absences to the District Attorney's office."

"Students must be in the classroom when the tardy bell has stopped ringing or he/she will be counted tardy. All tardies are counted unless the student has a pass from a staff member. Records of tardies will be kept by each teacher. Two tardies constitute an absence and will be counted as such in conjunction with the attendance policy.

If a student misses more than 5 minutes of class, he/she will be marked in the grade book as absent from the class, and it will count toward the ten days allowed per semester."

VISTA Junior High Specific Policy is as follows:

- Students need to be in the cafeteria by 7:45. After 7:45 students MUST sign in at the office.
- 7:46-7:51 Students are marked tardy. 7:52 and later students are marked absent/truant.
- Trains frequently block 4th street. This is not an excused tardy.
- Parents MUST CALL 735-4640 by 8am if student will be absent. This includes if the student is over 18.
- If a parent does not contact the office by 8am the absence is recorded as a truancy.
- Students with 5 unexcused absences will be reported to the District Attorney's office and student will be returned to homeschool at Principal Brown's discretion.
