
Please accept this letter as notification that Bishop John Carroll School intends to participate in the Lindsey Nicole Henry Scholarships for Students with Disabilities Program. Bishop John Carroll is located in Oklahoma City, OK and we serve students who are 4 years old through the 8<sup>th</sup> grade.

Before accepting a student with disabilities, Bishop John Carroll School interviews the student and his/her parents or legal guardian to insure that the services we provide can best serve the student with disabilities, both academically and socially. In addition, we review all official documentation provided by the parent or legal guardian and/or the transferring school such as IEPs, test scores, evaluations by medical and special service professionals, etc. to insure that we are aware of the student's needs. Students with disabilities who are served by Bishop John Carroll are serviced in the regular classroom setting with implementation of Response to Intervention.

Bishop John Carroll School has been educating students since 1919. The school is fully accredited by the Oklahoma Conference of Catholic Schools Accrediting Association (OCCSAA). Current accreditation status began in June 2008 and will run through June 2015. We are in compliance with the antidiscrimination provision of 42 U.S.C., Section 2000d; we meet state and local health and safety laws and codes; we will be academically accountable to the parent or legal guardian for meeting educational needs of the students; we employ or contract with teachers who hold baccalaureate or higher degrees; we comply with all state laws relating to general regulation of private schools; and we will adhere to the tenets of our published disciplinary procedures prior to the expulsion of a scholarship student.
