In Oklahoma, it is legislated under the Reading Sufficiency Act (RSA) that all kindergarten through 3rd grade students must be screened for reading difficulties using a State Board of Education-approved screening instrument. The purpose of RSA is "to ensure that each child attains the necessary reading skills by completion of the third grade which will enable that student to continue development of reading skills and to succeed throughout school and life." RSA follows a Multi-Tiered Systems of Support (MTSS) framework to address the needs of all learners. Within this framework, all students are universally screened for reading difficulties three times a year (beginning, middle, and end) to	Page 37	In Oklahoma, it is legislated under the Strong Readers Act that all kindergarten through 3rd grade students must be screened for reading difficulties using a State Board of Education-approved screening instrument.
