This platform supports educators to create a group of students for interventions, to create an individual student intervention plan targeted to evidence-based intervention protocols provided within the platform, and to see how the progress monitoring data is graphed to provide the visual story necessary to determine if a student is or is not responding to the intervention.

A Multi-Tiered Approach to Family Engagement

Academic & Behavior Intervention Library

This session highlights the value of school-based mental health teams, building capacity through data-driven decision making, intentional referral systems, and teaming.

District Level Decision Rules (REPEATED)

Elementary Tier 2 Math

This session will review a step by step protocol for remediating deficits in early numeracy and basic calculation skills at the Tier 2 and Tier 3 level. Everyone deserves a coach, but not everyone has access to one...or do they?
