OKMTSS on EDPlan Training for ALL Districts

OSDE is offering a FREE intervention management tool for all districts. This tool is intended to support district and site level intervention tracking that schools are already completing. Weekly sessions regarding how to use the OKMTSS on EDPlan data management system's intervention platform are open for all educators to attend. Terms to Know:

PCG, Public Consulting Group, is the company behind EDPlan.

EDPlan is our statewide system that houses many platforms including;

- EasyIEP (Special Education paperwork)
- Behavioral threat assessment
- Pepper training modules, and
- Soon to be much more!

Special education is often synonymous with EDPlan because of its robust usage for IEPs but EDPlan houses much more.

OKMTSS, is Oklahoma's Multi-Tiered System of Supports Framework, that comprises the components that are aligned with state level activities related to MTSS.

OKMTSS on EDPlan is the data management system that is available to schools:

- Intervention Management for all students (for all students, not only students on an Individualized Educational Program (IEP)).
- Early Warning Dashboard for all students.
- Advanced Reporting capabilities for sites, districts, and the state

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Frequently Asked Questions:

Q: What is the purpose of OKMTSS on EDPlan?

Answer:

- OKMTSS on EDPlan is intended to support a student level data dashboard **free to schools** to implement an effective decision-making process.
- It is not intended to supersede the decisions that teams make specifically for student level needs.
- However, it supports district and site understanding of the complexities of student outcomes and provides insight to support effective intervention and progress monitoring tools.

Q: Why would a district use OKMTSS on EDPlan?

Answer:

- Schools seeking to have a singular data dashboard for student level data tracking.
- Schools seeking to track intervention management in a seamless tool.
- Schools seeking to create and improve a robust MTSS system at their site/district.

Q: Who should have access to OKMTSS on EDPlan?

Answer:

- General Education teachers
- Site Principals
- Interventionists
- Academic Coaches
- Behavior interventionists
- RSA Leaders
- Title Coordinators
- Others as determined by site MTSS Leadership Teams
- Others who provide interventions to students for literacy, math, and behavior

Q: How do I access OKMTSS on EDPlan?

Answer:

- If you have an existing login for EDPlan, login with those credentials and go to Tools or Admin on the top banner to find OKMTSS



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- If you have never been in EDPlan before, you will need your unique district URL. You can access this URL from anyone in your district that has access to EDPlan.

Username: First and Last Name (include a space between each name)

Password: OKmtss2023Sy!!

This Password is only applicable for new users

Existing users should use their existing password

Note: If you aren't in the system, an Admin at your school can enter you into the system – reach out to someone with the following user type:

EDPlan/EasyIEP Administrator (Admin Edit)

Q: Is this tool required for my school/district to use?

Answer:

At this time, February 2024, the platform is not required for use. However, there are many benefits to using this tool.

Q: My school already has a tool and data dashboard that we like to use. Do we have to use this one?

Answer:

At this time, February 2024, the platform is not required for use. However, there are many benefits to using this tool.

Q: Is this for special education students?

Answer:

No, this tool is for all students.

Q: What are the benefits for using this tool?

Answer:

- The Intervention Management platform allows you to create intervention plans for students in the areas of literacy, math, and behavior.
- The Intervention Management platform facilitates intervention tracking from one grade level and one provider to another.
- The Early Warning Dashboard provides a visual representation of student level data for your district and site(s).
- The Advanced Reporting supports team data analysis as it relates to student level, site level, district level, and programmatic decisions.

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- A free behavior screener is embedded within the tool (SAEBRS).
- It is available for all students.

Q: Will admin be able to see what plans teachers have in place?

Answer:

Yes, user permissions will 'umbrella' and those with more access will be able to see more information. This is the way the current permissions are set up in EasyIEP.

Q: Why can't I log on?

Answer:

All certified educators as of August 2023 were pulled into the platform to generate new user types if they were not already EDPlan users. For user access specific to your district permissions, seek out a district level EDPlan administrator to add users. However, interventions should be provided by a trained educator and this may not be all professionals in the building.

Q: How can I add an intervention or progress monitoring tool that isn't on the list?

Answer:

On the OKMTSS Website users can submit recommendations for interventions, progress monitoring tools, and other suggestions to be considered for addition. Interventions must include a citation for research or evidence to be added. Progress monitoring tools will be carefully considered for validity.

Q: Will this tool be integrated with the Individual Program of Reading Instruction (IPRI)?

Answer:

The OKMTSS on EDPlan team is comprised of a multi-disciplinary team that supports the alignment of the IPRI documents required for RSA. However, as the platform is continually supported and improved these areas of alignment are highly considered. Stay tuned for more information.

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Q: I attended a session in February, March, or April 2024 will I get a PD certificate?

Answer:

The repeated sessions of this topic are considered informational and thus will not merit a certificate. However, future trainings that dive into the usage and implementation of how this tool could benefit instructional practice could merit a certificate as pedagogical information would be discussed during those sessions.

The informational session consisted of understanding the tool, logging into the tool, selecting a student to make a group, and the software specific steps to create an intervention plan. These sessions did not focus on the instructional considerations regarding student deficit identification, intervention selection, intervention intensity setting, progress monitoring, intervention decision rules regarding student outcomes, and other pedagogical considerations when using a tool such as this one.

We hope to be able to host more of these types of sessions that support the integral understanding of intervention decision making and how that relates to student outcomes.
