

RULE IMPACT STATEMENT

210:20-37-2. Adjunct teachers [AMENDED]

a. What is the purpose of the proposed rule change?

The purpose of this rule is to implement the requirements of 70 O.S. § 6-122.3, 17-101, which repealed the 270 clock hours per semester cap on classroom teaching for adjunct teachers. This rule revises existing Oklahoma Administrative Code (OAC) Title 210 (State Department of Education) to conform with the change in law. Additionally, the rule clarifies that adjunct teachers are authorized to have work hours count towards retirement benefits, as is allowable for all other “Nonclassified optional personnel” employed by a school district.

b. What classes of persons will be affected by the proposed rule change and what classes of persons will bear the costs of the proposed rule change?

The rule change will directly affect employees of public school districts teaching in an adjunct capacity. This rule change will also affect school districts employing adjunct teachers.

c. What classes of persons will benefit from the proposed rule change?

The rule change will benefit employees of public school districts teaching in an adjunct capacity. This rule change will also benefit school districts employing adjunct teachers.

d. What is the probable economic impact of the proposed rule upon affected classes of persons or political subdivisions?

The agency does not anticipate any economic impact upon political subdivisions or affected classes as a result of implementation of the proposed rule change at this time.

e. What is the probable cost to the agency to implement and enforce the proposed rule change?

The agency does not anticipate any cost to the agency to implement and enforce as a result of the proposed change in the rule at this time.
