



What Can I do with my Mild/Moderate Certificate?

- › Be the Special Education Teacher of Record for a student of any age with mild or moderate disabilities in any disability category except: Hearing Impairment, Visual Impairment, or Speech Language Impairment
- › Carry a corresponding caseload as Special Education Teacher of Record on EDPlan
- › Write an IEP for a student of any age with a mild or moderate disability in any category except: Hearing Impairment, Visual Impairment, or Speech Language Impairment
- › Sign an IEP as the special education teacher for a student of any age with a mild or moderate disability in any category except: Hearing Impairment, Visual Impairment, or Speech Language Impairment
- › Provide instruction and assign grades in a special education setting to students of any age, disability category or disability level, **IF** also certified in that subject area
- › Provide co-taught instruction in any early childhood, elementary or secondary general education setting **WITH** a teacher who is certified to teach that subject area
- › Provide instruction and assign grades to students of any age, disability category or disability level in a non-core subject area class (i.e. resources, study skills, life skills)
- › Provide reinforcement and rehearsal of skills already taught by a teacher who is certified to teach that subject area
- › Administer assessments to determine present levels for students with disabilities of any age and in any area of need, except hearing, vision or speech
- › Administer DLM/OAAP assessment

What Can I do with my Severe/Profound Certificate?

- › Be the Special Education Teacher of Record for a student of any age with severe or profound disabilities in any category except: Hearing Impairment, Visual Impairment, or Speech Language Impairment
- › Carry a corresponding caseload as Special Education Teacher of Record on EDPlan
- › Write an IEP for a student of any age with a severe or profound disability in any category except: Hearing Impairment, Visual Impairment, or Speech Language Impairment
- › Sign an IEP as the special education teacher for a student of any age with a severe or profound disability in any category except: Hearing Impairment, Visual Impairment, or Speech Language Impairment
- › Provide instruction and assign grades in a special education setting to students of any age, disability category or disability level, **IF** also certified in that subject area
- › Provide co-taught instruction in any early childhood, elementary or secondary general education setting **WITH** a teacher who is certified to teach that subject area
- › Provide instruction and assign grades to students of any age, disability category or disability level in a non-core subject area class (i.e. resources, study skills, life skills)
- › Provide reinforcement and rehearsal of skills already taught by a teacher who is certified to teach that subject area
- › Administer assessments to determine present levels for students with disabilities of any age and in any area of need, except hearing, vision or speech
- › Administer DLM/OAAP assessment



What Can I do with my Category Specific Special Education Certificate?

- › (i.e. Mentally Handicapped, Autism, Other Health Impairment, Specific Learning Disability, etc.)
- › Be the Special Education Teacher of Record for a student of any age with a corresponding disability
- › Carry a corresponding caseload as Special Education Teacher of Record on EDPlan
- › Write an IEP for a student of any age with a corresponding disability
- › Sign an IEP as the special education teacher for a student of any age with a corresponding disability
- › Provide instruction and assign grades in a special education setting to students of any age, disability category or disability level, **IF** also certified in that subject area
- › Provide co-taught instruction in any early childhood, elementary or secondary general education setting **WITH** a teacher who is certified to teach that subject area
- › Provide instruction and assign grades to students of any age, disability category or disability level in a non-core subject area class (i.e. resources, study skills, life skills)
- › Provide reinforcement and rehearsal of skills already taught by a teacher who is certified to teach that subject area
- › Administer assessments to determine present levels for students with disabilities of any age in any area of need, except hearing, vision or speech.
- › Administer DLM/OAAP assessment

What can I do with my Early Childhood Certificate?

- › Provide content instruction in any content area in grades PK-3
- › Assign grades in these instructional areas

What can I do with my Elementary Certificate?

- › Provide content instruction in any content area in grades 1-8 (Exception: **CANNOT** teach 7th & 8th grade math)
- › Provide content instruction in any content area in grades 7-12 **ONLY** for students who are taught to Alternate Standards and assessed by DLM/OAAP
- › Assign grades in these instructional areas

What can I do with my Middle (subject specific) Certificate?

- › Provide content instruction in corresponding content area in grades 5-8 (Unless the course is for HS credit)
- › Assign grades in corresponding content areas

What can I do with my Secondary (subject specific) Certificate?

- › Provide content instruction in corresponding content area in grades 5-12
- › Assign grades in corresponding content areas
