Information from the State Superintendent

Update on EngageOK Summer Conference

Heather Griswold, Deputy Chief of Staff, Events updated and presented highlights/features of the EngageOK Summer Conference held at the Cox Convention Center, July 7-9. Update on status of the Alexis Rainbow Arts Academy

David Kinney, Assistant Attorney General presented an update on the status of Alexis Rainbow Arts Academy (ARAA) that included a six-month appearance timeline before the State Board of Education (SBE), SBE June 25 Superintendent authorization to accept ARAA annual audit and releasing state funds, June 30 delivery of compliance records and forfeiture of state funding for noncompliance.

Board members discussed and asked questions pertaining to the noncompliance of federal and state laws for public schools and charter schools.

EDUCATOR EFFECTIVENESS AND POLICY

Residency Program Approved

Dr. Robyn Miller, Deputy Superintendent, Educator Effectiveness and Policy, presented a request to administer a residency program per House Bill 2885 of 2014. The 1980 Oklahoma residency program was suspended in 2010, and subsequently school districts were required to mentor their new teachers. Dr. Miller reviewed the comprehensive residency program guidelines, criteria and descriptions that promotes teacher effectiveness, student learning and acknowledges current school district induction programs.

Awarding of grants for a Program of Parent Education Approved

Dr. Rene Axtell, Assistant State Superintendent, Special Education, presented a recommendation request for 29 school districts to receive grants for a program of Parent Education. The 1993 Parent Education Program law assisted parents as their child's first teacher, serving children from birth to three years old, and Senate Bill 285 made changes in the law. Dr. Axtell reviewed the changes, effective November 1, 2015, that included program name changes, participant flexibility, program operations, and grant requirements, applications and deadlines.

Board members asked questions and discussed parent education programs and participation.

ACADEMIC AFFAIRS and PLANNING

Report on the U.S. Department of Education (USDE) approval of Oklahoma's Elementary and Secondary Education Act (ESEA) Flexibility Waiver Extension request

Dr. Cindy Koss, Deputy Superintendent, Academic Affairs and Planning, presented an overview of the USDE 1 year extension approval of Oklahoma's ESEA Flexibility Waiver. The principles of the waiver, approval and requirements were highlighted.

Board members asked questions and discussed waiver requirements, flexibility and results.

Update on the English Language Art/Mathematics State Academic Standards pursuant to the provisions House Bill 3399

Dr. William Radke, Executive Director updated that the first public roll out of the standards occurred at the EngageOK conference. Audience feedback from the multiple sessions was good. Currently live links are available on the standards website along with surveys. Stakeholders identified in House Bill 3399 were provided survey information for comment. The final draft is on track for the October due date and will be presented at the December SBE meeting for consideration and action.

Board members discussed the standards timeline schedule and for commendable efforts made for acceptance amongst stakeholders.
