The longest view of success is of course students that are well equipped. How does the board evaluate and consider success, and what are the intermediary types of measurements, metrics, quantitative and qualitative? How does the board evaluate its performance, be it a number of charters, students or school quality, of the output and not knowing what these things are. Consider these and when we meet again there will be more discussions on ways we can evaluate performance as a board.

Update on status of Letter of Intent submissions

Derrel Fincher, Director of Learning Technologies presented Letters of Intent from ABLE Charter School, Arcadia, Oklahoma; Insight School of Oklahoma, Inc. (ISOK), and Oklahoma Connections Academy (OKCA). ABLE Charter and ISOK will serve underserved and at-risk youths, grades 6 through 12, and OKCA will serve all students kindergarten through twelfth grade. All schools look forward to starting in August 2014.

Update on 2014 Rule Promulgation

Ms. Stephanie Moser Goins, Assistant General Counsel, presented the Governor's Executive Order 2013-34 changes effective November 1, 2013. Ms. Goins reviewed agency requirements, submission, and timeline; SVCSB OAC code assignment-Title 777, Chapters 1 through 9; rulemaking process/criteria, requirements, recommendations, public comment and 2014 deadlines.

Ms. Goins overviewed charter school contract requirements per 70 O.S. § 3-137. She reviewed statutory language for written contracts, charter of charter school requirements; and contract length.
