- A non-profit with a 100-year vision founded by Paul Campbell
- That vison is based on the following beliefs
 - Genius is equally distributed across the planet, but opportunity isn't, yet
 - Every student has a unique gift and set of strengths
 - Self awareness and empowerment are critical to the future
- FREE PK-12 Life Planning Public Schools
- Based on inclusion and empowerment

Advance Rural EDUCATION

The Academy of Seminole



- Founded in January 2017 by Advance Rural Education
- Located on 10 acres in downtown Seminole, OK
- A free PK-12 Life Planning School
 - Our warm and supportive elementary focuses on relationships, reading, and self awareness
 - Our middle school introduces the student to the world via the lense of a rich STEAM program (Science, Technology, Engineering, Arts, Math)
 - In High School, your life plan kicks into high gear. More on that in a minute.



The Academy of Seminole



- Our results?
 - <u>US News ranked us</u> 37th out of 396th Oklahoma schools
 - OPSRC recognized TAOS as one of three OK schools to see "extraordinary growth in reading and math"
 - Top score in Seminole county on our State Report Card with a "B" overall and an "A" in Academic Growth. Ranked 5th on the State Report Card of Oklahoma charter schools.
 - 53 graduates so far, with 100% life plans complete
 - Of those 53, 34 chose college and had a least 1 year already completed, free (20 graduated with associate degrees)
 - Two years in a row TAOS students have led the honor society at Seminole State College
 - 12 graduated with at least one year of career tech
 - 7 went straight into the workforce or volunteering. We helped them all find jobs.

Life Planning – what is it?

- Life planning is the process of self awareness for Spartans
- At our schools, it's a 4-year process that begins the first of your freshman year and culminates on graduation night when each senior presents their life plan to the community
- A students life plan consists of a deep understanding of ...
 - the unique strengths and gifts they each bring to the community
 - their values of which they have integrated them into their behaviors
 - how they will contribute to the community through vocation and volunteering
 - what opportunities they have after graduation
 - what they need to do next with respect to the path they have chosen 1. College 2. Career Tech 3 Workforce/Entrepreneur



What's critical to our succuss?

- **Our belief:** is that Every student has a unique gift and set of strengths to contribute to our community. That they can become empowered and inclusive.
- **Our culture:** If the student has a problem, the school has a problem. We DO NOT delegate our student problems outside of our control.
- **Our community:** each school is designed by community members and the school, from startup to succuss, will look like the community it serves.
- **Our people:** we hire the educators that fit our philosophy and coach them to help create a culture of collaboration.
- **Our partners:** Each site partners with a college/university, industry and a technology center to facilitate life planning

The Academy of Okmulgee Launch

- With approval of the State Board, TAOS, in conjunction with ARE, will start grades PK-8 in the fall of 2024
- 2025-28 add one grade each until full PK-12 status
- The Academy of Okmulgee will be part of the TAOS public life planning school network, free and open to all.
- Projections of 180 students in the first year, growing to a school with somewhere between 250 to 320 students by the fifth year.
- The Board of Stonebridge Academy, a private school located in Okmulgee, Oklahoma has voted to transfer its facilities to The Academy of Seminole. Stonebridge Academy will close during the summer of 2024, and the assets of Stonebridge will transfer to the new site. The Board of Stonebridge, staff, and parents have been part of the planning process for the new school. We expect most of the current families to enter their child into the lottery process for the new site.
