**SUBJECT:** Statutory Waiver Concerning Cooperative Agreements for Alternative Education Programs.

The following schools are requesting a statutory waiver of 70 O.S. § 1210.568, which requires them to enter into a cooperative agreement with another school district if enrollment in their alternative education program is less than ten (10) students. Approval is recommended.

## ALTERNATIVE EDUCATION ACADEMIES AND PROGRAMS

### 210:35-29-2. Definitions

The following words and terms, when used in this Subchapter, shall have the following meaning, unless the context clearly indicates otherwise.

"Alternative Education" means an educational process incorporating appropriate structure, curriculum, interaction, and reinforcement strategies to stimulate learning with students who have not utilized their capacity to do so within traditional educational settings.

"Abbreviated school day" means, for purposes of an alternative education program approved by the State Board of Education, a school day which consists of not less than four (4) hours and 12 minutes per day devoted to school activities for the locally approved 180-day school calendar.

## STANDARD III

### ADMINISTRATION AND ORGANIZATION

#### 210:35-3-41. Statement of the standard

The school is organized to ensure the achievement of its goals. The working relationships among the local board, superintendent, principal, and staff are such as to facilitate the successful functioning of all phases of the school's program. The principal of the school has the autonomy and authority to provide the leadership needed to accomplish the goals of the school. The school is provided with sufficient professional and service personnel to ensure effective operation of all phases of the school's program. The school is organized in a manner that encourages new and innovative ideas designed to improve the program and to help the school adapt to changing conditions. (92)

#### 210:35-3-46. Administrative and supervisory services

- (a) The school site shall be part of a system employing a full-time superintendent. *No board of a school district having average daily membership (ADM) of fewer than 500 students shall be prohibited from allowing a superintendent with the appropriate certificate to serve simultaneously as a principal. [70 O.S. § 5-106]* If a vacancy occurs in the superintendency during the course of the school year, a certified replacement must be employed within 45 school days.
- (b) It shall further be the responsibility of the local board, upon the recommendation of the superintendent, to employ an administrative head to be known as a principal for each of the schools within the district. Private schools shall employ a full-time principal/headmaster. An elementary district shall employ a full-time elementary superintendent. With the exception of requirements for certification, the term superintendent as used in these standards shall mean an elementary school superintendent, headmaster, or superintendent. Full-time is defined as employed full time, and therefore allows these administrators to teach.
- (c) Instructional leadership shall be the chief function of the school's principal. The principal shall be responsible for the improvement of instruction and be given the authority and resources needed to accomplish this goal. The principal shall help clarify the goals of the school, help obtain resources for it, coordinate its various activities, and promote its continuous evaluation to determine improvements needed.
- (d) Lines of administrative and supervisory authority between the central office staff and the principal shall be defined clearly and shall give the principal responsibility for initiating appropriate changes to meet the needs of the students.
- (e) The principal shall be involved in the selection, assessment, evaluation, retention, and promotion of all personnel assigned to the school.
  - (1) *All certified administrative personnel designated by a local board to conduct evaluations shall be required to participate in training conducted by the State Department of Education prior to evaluating.. [70 O.S. § 6-101.10]*
  - (2) *No teacher shall be dismissed during the term of a contract or refused reemployment except at an official meeting of the board of education. The reemployment or*

*dismissal of teachers shall be in accordance with the school laws of Oklahoma. [70 O.S. § 6-101.20 through 101.30]*

- (f) While working with faculty, staff, or students in the school, central office and other supplementary personnel shall coordinate their activities through the principal.
- (g) The principal shall have the responsibility and the authority for the administration of the non-instructional programs in the school.
- (h) The local board shall adopt a school calendar and school day consistent with statutory requirements in Oklahoma.
  - (1) *The standard school year shall consist of not less than 180 days; or,*
  - (2) *For not less than one thousand eighty (1080) hours each school year, if a district board of education adopts a school-hours policy and notifies the State Board of Education prior to September 15 of the applicable school year.*
  - (3) *Not more than thirty (30) hours each school year may be used for attendance of professional meetings and teachers may be paid for a length of term in excess thereof, under conditions hereinafter outlined. Subject to district board of education policy or collective bargaining agreement, additional professional leave days may be granted for individual teachers to attend or participate in professional meetings, staff development training, or National Board certification portfolio development as provided for in Section 6-204.2 of this title. [70 O.S. § 1-109]*
  - (4) *The standard school day shall consist of not less than 6 hours devoted to school activities, exclusive of lunch, with the exception of nursery, early childhood education kindergarten, and alternative education. [70 O.S. § 1-111]*
  - (5) *The early childhood school day shall consist of not less than two and one-half hours per session.*
  - (6) *The kindergarten school day shall consist of not less than two and one-half hours per day. The requirement to attend kindergarten may be satisfied by attendance in either a half-day or full-day program. Membership in a kindergarten for either two and one-half (2 1/2) hours or six (6) hours per school day shall be counted as one (1) day for average daily membership purposes. Beginning with the 2011-2012 school year, it shall be the duty of every school district in this state to provide and offer a full six-hour day of kindergarten free of tuition for every child residing in the district who attains the age of five (5) years on or before the first day of September during the school year kindergarten is offered, provided that this duty may be satisfied by intra-district transfer to a school offering full-day kindergarten, by transferring kindergarten children to other school districts which will accept them and can provide kindergarten for such children, or by contracting for classroom space with a licensed public or licensed private child care provider based on the selection criteria established by the district. [70 O.S. § 18-108]*
  - (7) *A school district board of education may adopt and implement an extended day schedule for grades nine through twelve. All of the following conditions must be met:*
    - (A) *The annual number of hours of instruction must equal or exceed 1,080 hours which is equivalent to 180 days of instruction.*
    - (B) *Only one day per week shall consist of not less than five hours of academic instruction in a regular classroom setting.*

- (C) The district must hold a public hearing prior to the adoption of an extended day schedule.
- (D) The district must document the impact on student achievement as determined by the academic performance index score and any other relevant factors that are a result of the implementation of an extended day schedule.
- (E) The district must provide an annual report to the State Board of Education on the result of the extended day schedule and the impact on student achievement. [70 O.S. § 1-109]
- (i) If, because of emergency situations, school has been missed more than fifteen (15) days, the State Board of Education will consider forgiving a portion of those days or in rare instances all days missed, on a case-by-case basis. Exceptions to the fifteen (15) day minimum will be made at the recommendation of the State Superintendent and forgiveness will be considered by the State Board of Education on a case-by-case basis.
- (j) If a school district determines that it is necessary to deviate from the required 6-hour school day because of severe weather conditions or fire, the superintendent should report this, in writing, to the State Department of Education, Accreditation Section, within 72 hours. Any loss of school time shall require the superintendent to report the amount of time lost and the procedures to be used to make up the lost time.
- (k) *Schools shall obtain permission from the State Board of Education before conducting Saturday classes to complete a standard school term including professional days.* [70 O.S. § 1-112] (09)

### 210:10-1-4. Length of term

- (a) The minimum length of term will be ten (10) months (180 days actually taught). Provided not to exceed five (5) days of 180 days required may be used for attendance of professional meetings. Where professional days are taken, they shall be so recorded in the register of attendance in a like manner as holidays are recorded. The legal aggregate days attendance will be divided by days actually taught to obtain the legal average daily attendance. Any school district holding less than a full term will have its state aid reduced proportionately. No district may have less than a full term of school unless conditions over which it has no control exist that would prevent the district holding a full term. In cases where sites within a district have different length terms the average daily membership (ADM) and average daily attendance (ADA) shall be calculated for each site separately.

### 210:35-3-47. School reports and records

Well delineated policies and procedures for records and reports shall be developed and kept current.

- (1) Records and reports needed for effective planning, operation, evaluation, and reporting shall be kept relative to the following components of the educational program:
  - (A) Administrative operations
  - (B) Curriculum
  - (C) Guidance
  - (D) Health services

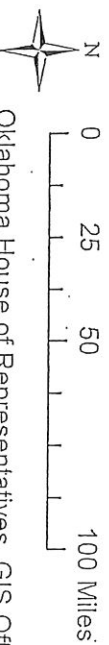

Our librarian is retiring with the looming budget cuts as a result of COVID 19 and the difficulty of finding and paying a librarian to serve only 165 students.

**B. List alternate strategies/plans which the district/site proposes, and how this plan will best serve the students of your district, i.e., a description of the educational benefits to the students and learning achievement.**

Each teacher will take their class to the library and check them out books following the CDC guidelines by grouping students by grades. Teachers will also know the Lexile level of their students and will be able to better serve their students.

I think putting teachers in control of their students in the library will benefit student learning. It will allow the district the ability to utilize that on funding on distance learning materials.

If the budget allows we would like to purchase reading software and programs.

F. Describe method of assessment or evaluation of effectiveness of the plan. The method we will use will be to require quarterly testing utilizing Accelerated Reader to evaluate the students. The Principal will seek for input from teachers, students and parents.



G. We will implement the DEAR Drop Everything and Read for the first 15 minutes of each day in order to practice our reading skills.


To Whom It May Concern:

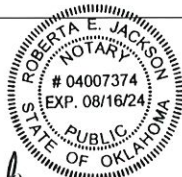



Peavine will serve fewer than 10 students. Also, staffing limits make it impossible to meet minimum time requirements for an Alt. Ed. program.

**B. List alternate strategies/plans which the district/site proposes, and how this plan will best serve the students of your district, i.e., a description of the educational benefits to the students and learning achievement.**

Students will receive in class remediation when it is determined the student is at risk and/or struggling with academics (excused or unexcused), as means to assist the student in making up work and catching up with peers. Also, Peavine School will provide an afterschool tutor for all core subjects throughout the year.

**C. Educational impact to the district: Results of the Statutory Waiver/Deregulation, i.e., effect on student performance levels, impact of plan on other sites in the district.**

The educational impact to the district and students should remain unchanged as this is the manner of operation in place. The students are served well and receive any and all assistance possible to ensure their academic success.

Peavine School will forfeit Alt. Ed. funding as a result of the waiver. These funds have been used in the past for salaries of Alt. Ed. personnel, as well as supplies and materials that served the students in the program.

**F. Describe method of assessment or evaluation of effectiveness of the plan.**

Students were monitored for grades and/or attendance among other factors. The students were served in the program until the area of need showed significant improvement and the student was no longer deemed to be at risk of failing. At this time students were placed back in the regular education program.



**ADDENDUM**  
**PEAVINE SCHOOL**

*A. The waiver is requested due mainly to the fact that our total enrollment typically runs in the 120's. We are a PK-8 school. Student population at grades 6-8 is typically between 30-40 students. Serving 10 or more students would be extremely disproportionate for a school our size.*

*B. With such idea class size numbers, our teachers are able to remediate students in class with extra 1/1 instruction, varied and individual instruction, as well as peer tutoring.*

*Teachers develop relationships with their students that allow the student to feel comfortable coming to them with problems or issues that are making it difficult to focus on school, whether it be personal or family. Parents come to some of our veteran teachers for advice and guidance, as they still foster the relationships built when they were students here.*

*F. Students in the program or former students of the program are monitored both during and after exiting the program to ensure that adequate progress is being made and/or continuing. Monitoring of grades, attendance & behavior among other indicators, are routinely checked by administration and teachers.*

*Any student who fails to maintain adequate progress will be placed back in the program to receive extra assistance in meeting academic goals.*

*Students and families also have access to counseling services.*

Burlington proposes that the students who qualify for alternative education stay in Burlington and participate in services at our district. The Burlington students would be able to participate in more school activities by remaining on campus to complete their education.

No, Burlington has not been in a coop previously. Yes, Burlington has been awarded this waiver before. The educational impact to the district was successful. The Burlington students who participated in this program were able to recover/accomplish needed high school credits to successfully complete his/her high school education. Additionally, the students who participated in our Alternative Education program at Burlington were able to stay active in extra-curricular activities while completing their education. Participating in extra-curricular activities served as motivation for the students to complete the program.

Each student's schedule is based on his/her need depending on individualized circumstances. Assessment is based on attendance, grades, and progress. Grade cards and progress are sent home on a regular basis. The timeline for the students participating in the Alternative Education program at Burlington is based on individual need. However, the teachers and students at Burlington work diligently to maintain the same timeline for completion as all students enrolled at Burlington. Maintaining the same timeline and schedule enables students the freedom to participate in all campus activities.

- E. Any financial impact to the District (positive or negative) for the proposed waiver/deregulation? If positive please describe where the available would be reallocated.

There are no financial reasons (positive or negative) for Burlington's proposal.

Assessment is based on annual review of dropout rate and student progress toward individualized goals and completion of graduation credits. Fewer dropouts in our small school district indicate effectiveness of this program.

Justice Public School is requesting a waiver from 70 O.S. § 1210.568: Any school district submitting a plan for an alternative education program serving fewer than ten students shall enter into a cooperative agreement with another school district to jointly provide the program unless the program has been granted a waiver from this requirement by the State Board of Education. Justice Public School is a PK-8 dependent district. We had a successful program last year being locally available and meeting the needs of our students and community. As stated in last year's request, our students' families understand the need for an alternative education program, but are reluctant to send their children to another district. Our alternative education program is structured with the needs of our students first. Due to the COVID-19 pandemic, we project six to seven students who will benefit from this program, and realize that does not meet the statutory requirements of ten students. We, therefore, request this waiver to better serve the needs of our students who are high risk to drop out of high school. Your consideration is greatly appreciated.

- B. List alternate strategies/plans which the district/site proposes, and how this plan will best serve the students of your district, i.e., a description of the educational benefits to the students, graduation rate if a waiver has been awarded prior to this year, and learning achievement.

We are using Odysseyware (through the East Central Oklahoma Online Consortium hosted by Gordon Cooper Technology Center), Acellus, and our prescriptive personalized learning program with our alternative education students to allow them to recover courses and/or complete courses not yet attempted. Our projected students are one or more years behind their peers and are at high risk of dropping out in high school. These students have had attendance issues in the past and would benefit from services by placement in our local program. The program runs from 8:00am -- 2:25pm each day. We are continually evaluating and developing our program to meet the specific needs of our students and community. Without this program, we truly believe these students are at high risk of dropping out and not finishing high school.

- C. Have you participated in an alternative education coop previously? Have you been awarded this waiver before and what was the educational impact to the district: Results of the Statutory Waiver, i.e., effect on student performance levels, impact of plan on other sites in the district.

Implementing an alternative education program in Justice School will have a significant impact on our District and the community. 

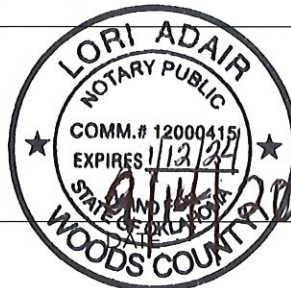

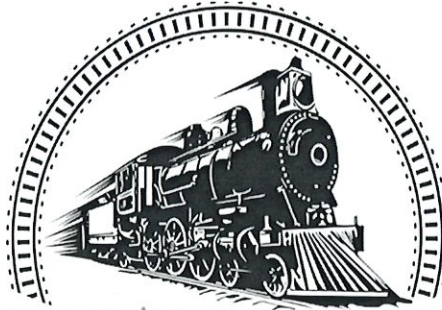

Currently, Peckham has 11 fifth grade students, 11 sixth grade students, 6 seventh grade students and 5 eighth grade students. The district has departmentalized these grades. Due to the small class size and numbers the district would like to opt out of Alternative Education. The district student needs assessment only qualifies one student, therefore we would like to return our allocation for alternative education.

**B. List alternate strategies/plans which the district/site proposes, and how this plan will best serve the students of your district, i.e., a description of the educational benefits to the students and learning achievement.**

The next three years are projected to be about the same needs assessment. The district has hired a half day counselor to help with behavior problems and due group counseling. Peckham also has Pioneer Technology counselor come to the school once a week and do career counseling. A life skills class has been added to the 5-8 curriculum for all students. As you can see Peckham School is a small district but we are addressing the needs of all students.

The departmentalization of 5-8 will allow the teachers more time with students on OAC curriculum. The teachers will also be able to help individual students with the small number in classes.

This will have little financial impact on the District. Peckham does not receive state aid.



To provide alternative education programming of less than 10 students on campus, rather than as part of a cooperative. It is our belief that students will be able to spend more time in alternative classing by receiving direct instruction on our campus than would be afforded in the cooperative setting. Students will benefit from the extra instruction time that would typically be spent in transport from home to the cooperative program site and will have better access to vocational and extracurricular programming at the district level as well as better access to CareerTech programming due to time and location logistics. Negative effects would include less availability to these programs, and not being able to best meet student needs should this be denied.

Also with smaller student to teacher ratio, students will benefit from additional one to one assistance which will increase their educational achievement.

At the start of the 2020-2021 school year, we do not have any current students enrolled in our Alternative Education program.. We are a small rural school with very little funds to offer a full alternative education program. We would have to give up one of our core teachers in order to staff our alt-ed. We feel the need to have core teachers in all grades, certified to teach their core subjects, is the best way to be a good steward of the funds we do have, and the best way to help our students become successful, productive citizens.

**B. List alternate strategies/plans which the district/site proposes, and how this plan will best serve the students of your district, i.e., a description of the educational benefits to the students and learning achievement.**

Our budget allows us to offer alternative education, however, at this point no one is enrolled. We use the budget to purchase software for the alternative education program; we currently use the software for credit recovery. If we do have a student who chooses the alternative education route, we have plans in place to serve them. With our small class sizes we utilize either our computer class teacher and/or special education room to help serve students. These teachers have both been trained in our software and have a flexible class schedule.

**C. Educational impact to the district: Results of the Statutory Waiver/Deregulation, i.e., effect on student performance levels, impact of plan on other sites in the district.**

Being a small rural school, we only have one site in the district. The Elementary and High School sit on the same property. Currently with zero students enrolled in alternative education a waiver/deregulation has no impact on our school.

We are constantly evaluating how to serve our students. We use student data to evaluate if someone is in need of Alt Ed. We use our credit recovery plan to evaluate if this software is sufficient for Alt Ed.

In the end, the Principal is the instructional leader of the school, and works side-by-side with teachers and students, working on strategies, and evaluating the success of the plan.
