SUBJECT: Statutory Waiver Concerning Cooperative Agreements for Alternative Education

Programs.

The following schools are requesting a statutory waiver of 70 O.S. § 1210.568, which requires them to enter into a cooperative agreement with another school district if enrollment in their alternative education program is less than ten (10) students. Approval is recommended.

Section 915. Alternative Education Programs - Statewide System.

- A. Beginning with the first semester of the 1996-1997 school year, the State Board of Education shall implement a statewide system of alternative education programs which shall be phased-in within seven (7) years. The statewide system shall include but not be limited to Alternative Approaches grant programs, funded pursuant to Section 1210.561 of this title, and alternative academies or alternative programs implemented pursuant to this section.
- B. Beginning with the first semester of the 2002-2003 school year, all school districts of this state shall provide alternative education programs that conform to the requirements of statutes and rules applicable to alternative education. A program shall:
 - 1. Allow class sizes and student/teacher ratios which are conducive to effective learning for at-risk students;
 - 2. Incorporate appropriate structure, curriculum, and interaction and reinforcement strategies designed to provide effective instruction;
 - 3. Include an intake and screening process to determine eligibility of students;
 - 4. Demonstrate that teaching faculty are appropriately licensed or certified teachers;
 - 5. Demonstrate that teaching faculty have been selected on the basis of a record of successful work with atrisk students or personal and educational factors that qualify them for work with at-risk students;
 - 6. Reflect appropriate collaborative efforts with state agencies and local agencies serving youth;
 - 7. Provide courses that meet the academic curricula standards adopted by the State Board of Education and additional remedial courses:
 - 8. Offer individualized instruction;
 - 9. State clear and measurable program goals and objectives;
 - 10. Include counseling and social services components with the provision that providers of services are not required to be certified as school counselors;
 - 11. Require a plan leading to graduation be developed for each student in the program which will allow the student to participate in graduation exercises for the school district after meeting the requirements of the school district as specified in the individual graduation plan for that student; provided, for students who enter the ninth grade in or prior to the 2007-08 school year, the plan shall specifically address whether the student is required to meet the graduation requirements established in Section 11-103.6 of this title;
 - 12. Offer life skills instruction:
 - 13. Provide opportunities for arts education to students, including Artists in Residence programs coordinated with the Oklahoma Arts Council;
 - 14. Provide a proposed annual budget;
 - 15. Include an evaluation component including an annual written self-evaluation;
 - 16. Be appropriately designed to serve middle school, junior high school and secondary school students in grades six through twelve who are most at risk of not completing a high school education for a reason other than that identified in Section 13-101 of this title; and
 - 17. Allow students in the alternative education program, who otherwise meet all of the participation requirements, to participate in vocational programs and extracurricular activities, including but not limited to athletics, band, and clubs.
- C. The alternative education program of a school district shall be operational and serving students by September 15 of each school year.
- D. Each alternative education program of a school district shall receive funding based on the combined number of dropouts and students within the district who have been referred to a county juvenile service unit, a county juvenile bureau or who have been committed to the custody of the Office of Juvenile Affairs. Each alternative education program shall receive incentive funding as follows:
 - 1. For the first year of operation, One Thousand Dollars (\$1,000.00) per student;


- 2. For the second year of operation, Seven Hundred Fifty Dollars (\$750.00) per student; and
- 3. For the third year of operation and each year thereafter, Seven Hundred Dollars (\$700.00) per student.

Statewide alternative education funding shall not be used to supplant existing school district resources or to support programs that do not meet all the criteria for the statewide alternative education system. No alternative education program shall receive less than a total of Ten Thousand Dollars (\$10,000.00) per school year.

- E. By September 15 of each school year, all statewide alternative education funds received and expended for students participating in an alternative education program shall be reported to the State Department of Education by major object codes and by program classifications pursuant to the Oklahoma Cost Accounting System as adopted by the State Board of Education pursuant to Section 5-135 of this title.
- F. Elementary school districts, as defined in Section 5-103 of this title, may request a waiver from the State Board of Education from the requirements of this section to implement and provide an alternative education program. Any elementary school district that has not received funding pursuant to the provisions of subsection D of this section shall be automatically granted a waiver. If a school district is granted a waiver, no statewide alternative education funding shall be allocated to the district.
- G. 1. The State Board of Education shall contract for technical assistance for operation of an Alternative Education Technical Assistance Center. The technical assistance provider shall be an entity located in Oklahoma that has been officially recognized by the United States Department of Education to assess and facilitate dissemination of validated educational programs in Oklahoma. The technical assistance provider shall have priority, if its operations are deemed satisfactory by the State Board of Education and if funds are available, for annual renewal of the contract.
 - 2. The duties of the technical assistance provider shall include, but shall not be limited to:
 - a. providing initial and ongoing training of personnel who will educate at-risk populations through alternative education programs,
 - b. providing technical assistance to school districts to enhance the probability of success of their alternative education programs,
 - c. evaluating state-funded alternative education programs,
 - d. reporting to the State Board of Education the evaluation results of state-funded alternative education programs, and
 - e. providing in-depth program analysis and evaluation of state-funded alternative education programs.
 - 3. The State Board of Education shall not provide funding to an alternative education program that does not receive a recommendation for continued funding in the evaluation provided for in this subsection. Provided, any school district not receiving such a recommendation for continued funding may request a hearing before the Board with a review of the evaluation prior to the Board's final determination.
- H. All alternative education programs shall be subject to statutes and rules applicable to alternative education, including any exemptions from statutory or regulatory requirements authorized by statutes or rule.
- I. An alternative education program may be offered by an individual school district or may be offered jointly by school districts that have formed interlocal cooperative agreements pursuant to Section 5-117b of this title. Any school district submitting a plan for an alternative education program serving fewer than ten students shall enter into a cooperative agreement with another school district to jointly provide the program unless the program has been granted a waiver from this requirement by the State Board of Education.

- J. Any materials or equipment purchased by a school district with revenue received for students participating in an alternative education program shall be used only in or directly for the alternative education program offered by the district or any subsequent alternative education program offered to students enrolled in that district. Such materials and equipment shall be made available exclusively to alternative education students during the hours that the alternative education program is operating; provided, the material or equipment may be used for other purposes when the alternative education program is not operating.
- K. Upon implementation of this subsection as provided for in subsection M of this section and contingent upon the provision of appropriated funds designated for such purpose, all school districts in the state providing alternative education programs as required in subsection B of this section shall expand the programs to include middle-school-grade students. The program shall conform to the requirements of subsection B of this section.
- L. Upon implementation of this subsection as provided for in subsection M of this section and contingent upon the provision of appropriated funds designated for such purpose, each urban school district identified by the State Department of Education as having a high population of elementary grade students who are at-risk and in need of alternative education shall provide elementary level alternative education programs. The State Department of Education shall establish requirements for the programs. For purposes of this section, "urban school district" means a school district with an average daily membership of thirty thousand (30,000) or more.
- M. Implementation of subsections K and L of this section shall be delayed until the current expenditure per pupil in average daily attendance in public elementary and secondary schools in unadjusted dollars for the 1998-99 school year or any school year thereafter for Oklahoma, as reported by the National Center for Education Statistics annually in the Digest of Education Statistics, reaches at least ninety percent (90%) of the regional average expenditure for that same year, and funds are provided. For purposes of this subsection, the regional average expenditure shall consist of the current expenditure per pupil in average daily attendance in public elementary and secondary schools in unadjusted dollars for each of the following states: Arkansas, Colorado, Kansas, Missouri, New Mexico, Oklahoma, and Texas, averaged together. By January 1 of each year, the State Board of Education shall report whether or not the ninety-percent expenditure level has been reached based on information reported annually in the Digest of Education Statistics by the National Center for Education Statistics. Subsections K and L of this section shall be implemented on July 1 after the first January 1 report verifies that the ninety-percent expenditure level has been reached and funds have been provided for the specific purposes of this section. Peavine School will serve fewer than 10 students. Also, staffing limits make it impossible to meet minimum time requirements for an Alternative Education program.
B. List alternate strategies/plans which the district/site proposes, and how this plan will best serve the students of your district, i.e., a description of the educational benefits to the students and learning achievement.
Students will be remediated in class when it is determined that the student is at risk and/or struggling with academics, (excused or unexcused), as means to assist the student to get caught up with their peers. Also, Peavine School will provide an after school tutor for all core subject areas throughout the school year.
C. Educational impact to the district: Results of the Statutory Waiver/Deregulation, i.e., effect on student performance levels, impact of plan on other sites in the district.
The educational impact to the district and the students should remain unchanged as this is the same manner of remediation and tutoring services that have been provided in the past with the exception of at risk students being served solely during regular school hours unless they chose to stay after school for tutoring.

Peavine School will forfeit Alt. Ed. funding as a result of the waiver. These funds have been used in the past fr salaries for Alt. Ed. personnel, as well as supplies and materials that served the students in the Alt. Ed. program.

Students in the program were monitored for grades and/or attendance improvements among other factors. The students were served in the program until the area of need showed significant improvements and the student was no longer deemed to be at risk of failing. At this time students were placed back in the regular education program.

A. Reason for the waiver/deregulation request (be specific).

Big Pasture Public Schools is requesting a 3 year Statutory Waiver of 70.0.S Section 1210.568 for the COOP Agreement to serve fewer than ten (10) students in the Alternative Education Program. Due to our small numbers of student enrollment, it is our belief students needing this service would be better served in their home district, Big Pasture Schools.

B. List alternate strategies/plans which the district/site proposes, and how this plan will best serve the students of your district, i.e., a description of the educational benefits to the students and learning achievement.

Big Pasture Public School District Shall serve our own students if needed by utilizing an online curriculum such as Edmentum in district. The curriculum will allow the district to provide individualized scheduling and a individualized educational plan tailored to meet the needs of each student. The online curriculum, such as Edmentum, provides for the student flexibility to work at their own pace, at an accelerated pace if able, and allows for customized classes for credit recovery.

C. Educational impact to the district: Results of the Statutory Waiver/Deregulation, i.e., effect on student performance levels, impact of plan on other sites in the district.

By serving students in their home district, Big Pasture Public Schools can offer a schedule more conducive to local student success and meeting local student needs. Tailoring curriculum needs to the individual child shall have a major impact on student success and program completion should the need arise.

By providing services locally, our school counselor is able to work with the child, parents, and family members to provide counseling services or assist in locating services to meet the emotional needs of the child. By addressing academic and emotional needs, a potential student dropout may be avoided.

D. Timeline: Please submit class schedule, calendars, assessment forms and other attachments as necessary, or described in instructions.

A waiver/deregulation can be granted for up to 3 years. (Please see instructions for additional requirements)

Our Alternative Education Program will be available during the regular school day. For individual students, adjustments in the hours of the regular school day will be made to meet their unique needs. In certain cases, students may be allowed to complete coursework on a homebound basis. Courses will be designed and implemented to be rigorous and meet all the state requirements as designed. Students will have support from a district employee in order to achieve success.

E. Any financial impact to the District (positive or negative) for the proposed waiver/deregulation.

The Statutory Waiver shall have a slight positive financial impact on the district. The district shall utilize the online program in other areas for advanced coursework and credit recovery. Also, the district shall not have the obligatin of transportation of student(s) to the outlying district for the Alternative Education Services and shall utilize Alternative Education funds to defray part of the cost of the online curriculum. The most significant gain to the district is the safety factor. A. Reason for the waiver/deregulation request (be specific).

The Kinta School Alternative Education program is requesting a statutory waiver in regards of the COOP agreement--when a public school wants to serve fewer than 10 students in the alt ed program instead of COOPing with other districts. Kinta schools has been providing the alternative education program to our students in district since 2011 and have had considerable success meeting the needs of our students. This is partly because of the fact that we have been able to serve our students indistrict. We have found that this provides a sense of ownership and community to our students that is not available in a coop situation. It also provides for more flexible programming that allows our students to be able to participate in extra-curricular and other school events such as assemblies, class meetings, and other special events because our students are able to spend more time on site doing instructional activities since they are not having to be transported to another site.

B. List alternate strategies/plans which the district/site proposes, and how this plan will best serve the students of your district, i.e., a description of the educational benefits to the students and learning achievement.

In the past our students lost as much as 1.5-2 hours of possible instructional time due to transportation time to participate in a coop alternative education placement. It was also very difficult for our students to get back in-district to participate in onsite activities and extra-curricular events and truancy and discipline were issues. By providing our program onsite, even when below 10 students we are able to provide individualized educational programs that meet each student's need while providing many opportunities for the students to be a part of the school community. Since we have been providing alternative education onsite we have experienced an increase in student participation and attendance. Our discipline referrals have reduced to almost none and our students have shown overall success in the program. Our students are graduating and going into the workforce or getting further education/training.

C. Educational impact to the district: Results of the Statutory Waiver/Deregulation, i.e., effect on student performance levels, impact of plan on other sites in the district.

Since we have started providing the alternative education program onsite rather than in a coop situation our students have been very successful. Our graduation rate is 100%, attendance has increased and truancy has decreased, discipline referrals are almost zero. Communication with students and parents have increased and are positive. Our students are graduating with a plan and following it. Most of our students have graduated with jobs or in the process of starting a job or have continued to work on certifications through career techs or college. Our students feel like they are part of the school community and participate in school activities such as assemblies, class trips, extra curricular activities and graduation. Several of our students have been able to catch up, follow the program and reenter the general education setting.

D. Timeline: Please submit class schedule, calendars, assessment forms and other attachments as necessary, or described in instructions.

Students will pre-enroll the last week of July through the first week of August yearly. Transcripts and testing will be reviewed and a program of learning will be created for each student to provided the individual learning plan they need. Students will begin the first day of school and follow the general calendar for the school district. Student progress will be monitored and updated as needed. Student, parent/guardians, and alternative education team will review and update plan at least twice yearly. All students will begin a checklist of graduation requirements upon enrollment and will use this template to monitor progress towards reaching graduation.

E. Any financial impact to the District (positive or negative) for the proposed waiver/deregulation.

The primary financial impact for the district would be the reduction in transportation costs. This would have a positive impact on the district. The district has been providing services on site and there would be no additional financial costs incurred by the district if this program continues.

F. Describe method of assessment or evaluation of effectiveness of the plan.

Intake and End of the Year data will provide an assessment of student attendance, discipline, and academic progress. Exit surveys and other documentation can provide data regarding student participation in school activities and other extra curricular activities. This data can be reviewed and progress can be measured from year to year.
