Superintendent Hofmeister highlighted activity during the 2015 academic year that included ESEA Reauthorization on December 10 and new ESSA; Notice of state revenue failure issued and \$900 million budget shortfall; math and English language standards; TLE quantitative measures; Teacher Shortage and Red Tape Task Forces; and deaths of SDE employee-Shelby Satterfield and Michael Barlow, Teacher Hall of Fame. She thanked everyone and SDE staff for the work and partnership in this important work.

ACADEMIC AFFAIRS and PLANNING

Oklahoma Advisory Council on Indian Education Annual Report

Dwight Pickering, Director, SDE-Indian Education, introduced Lucyann Harjo, Chairman, Oklahoma Advisory on Indian Education. Greeting the SBE in her native Navajo Language Ms. Harjo said she was from the Red Shriek Running into the Water Clan and born of the Towering House People. Her Father and his Father were from the Coyote Pass people and her Mother and Mother's Father were of the Salt Clan people.

The 2015 Oklahoma Advisory Council on Indian Education (OACIE) annual report presented by Ms. Harjo included five (5) recommendations to the State Board of Education, and the OACIEs responsibilities and duties.

Board members asked questions and discussed student enrollment and academic achievement data in the annual report.

Recognition of Ms. Yvonne Hensley, Edmond Public Schools, 2015 National Indian Education Association Classroom Teacher of the Year

Superintendent Hofmeister introduced Ms. Yvonne Hensley the 2015 National Indian Education Association Classroom Teacher of the Year. Ms. Hensley, an English and Native Expression teacher at Edmond Memorial High School was selected at the national conference on October 14 in Portland, Oregon. Superintendent Hofmeister presented a Certificate of Recognition to Ms. Hensley in honor of being a Great Leader in the classroom.

School Accountability System Report due by December 31, 2015 Approved

Dr. Koss said on June 15, 2015 legislation was passed and instructed the State Board of Education (SBE) regarding the calculation metrics components of the school report cards to ensure the evaluation system is clear, transparent, credible, trustworthy; aligned with state assessment system; and issue a report by December 31 and submit to the Office of the Governor, Speaker of the House of Representatives, President Pro Tem of the Senate, Minority Leader of the House and the Senate.

The school accountability system report presentation included current accountability system, U.S.D.E. Waiver, ESSA, state plan requirements and considerations.

Dr. Deborah Gist, Superintendent, Tulsa Public Schools addressed the results of the A-F report and accountability system.

Board members asked questions and discussed assessments and accountability system components.

Board Member Price motioned to approve the school accountability system report. Board member Franks seconded the motion. The motion carried with the following votes: General Baxter, yes; Ms. Franks, yes; Mr. Flanagan, yes; Mr. Ross, yes; Mr. Keating, yes; and Mr. Price, yes.

Report on the Every Student Succeeds Act (ESSA)

Dr. Koss and Matt Holder, Chief Operations Officer presented a report on the new Every Student Succeeds Act (ESSA); and highlighted legislative changes, guidance and eliminations to No Child Left Behind (NCLB), Adequate Yearly Progress (AYP), School Improvement Grants (SIG) and Prescriptive school interventions. The 2017-2020 standards, assessments, accountability requirements and goals were reviewed.

Superintendent Hofmeister recessed the meeting at 11:15 a.m. and reconvened at 11:30 a.m.

EDUCATOR EFFECTIVENESS AND POLICY RESEARCH

Teacher Shortage Taskforce

Dr. Robyn Miller, Deputy Superintendent, Educator Effectiveness and Policy Research, presented the preliminary teacher shortage taskforce report and educator supply and demand study. Dr. Miller updated the taskforce committee, working groups, and recommendations.

Board members asked questions and discussed the task force report and legislative timelines/action

Resolution relating to the work of the Teacher Shortage Task Force Approved

Superintendent Hofmeister presented a Resolution on the work of the Teacher Shortage Task Force.

Dr. Miller presented the recommendation from the Teacher and Leader Effectiveness Commission to include three quantitative measures tool. This will round out the evaluation framework which already has a qualitative component. The measurements tools will appear on a list of options to school districts were reviewed.
