



The Oklahoma 21st CCLC program utilizes the Youth Program Quality Improvement process to assess the quality of funded programs in the state. Using the Program Quality Assessment (PQA) tool, this three-step process, Assess-Plan-Improve, was developed by the David P. Weikart Center for Youth Program Quality. The PQA tool is used for both self- and external assessments.

## Surveys

Surveys are conducted with parents, students, staff and program directors to include their perspective of the 21st CCLC program in the overall evaluation.

## PPICS

The Profile and Performance Information Collection System (PPICS) was created by the US Department of Education (USDE) for the purpose of collecting basic information about 21st CCLC programs across the United States. All 21st CCLC grantees are required to furnish this information.

## Monitoring

Monitoring of the 21st CCLC grants is required by the USDE. The state director will visit each of the first year grantees. The state monitor will conduct one site visit per year with grantees in the second and third years, and the fourth and fifth years if time permits.
