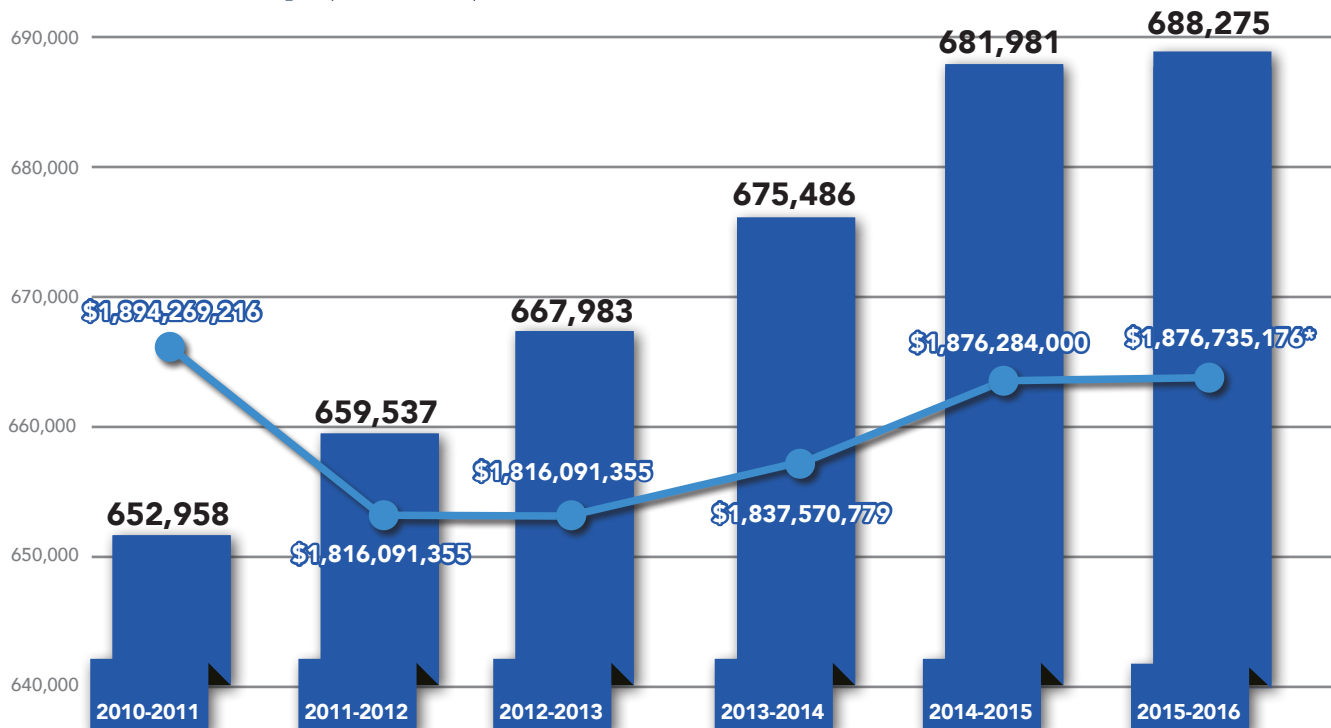

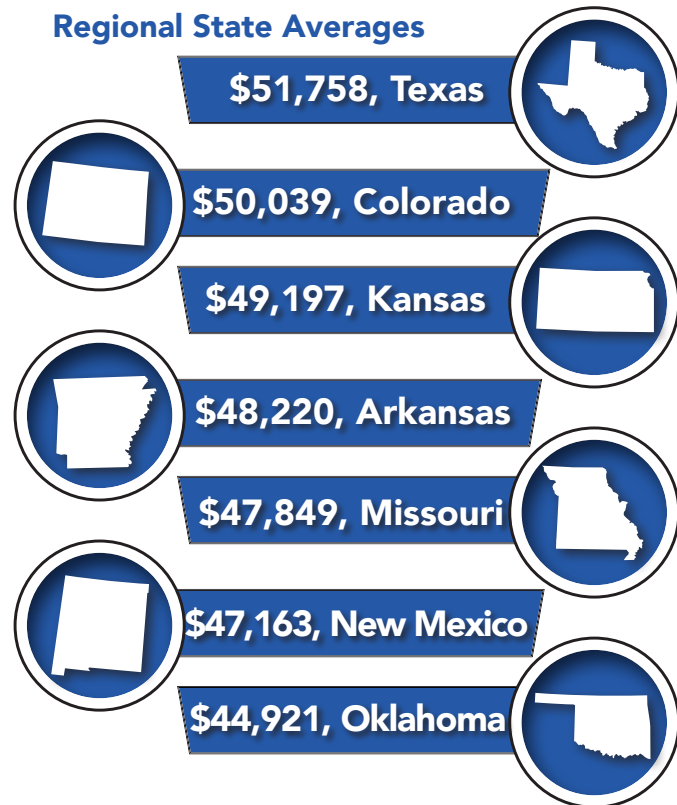

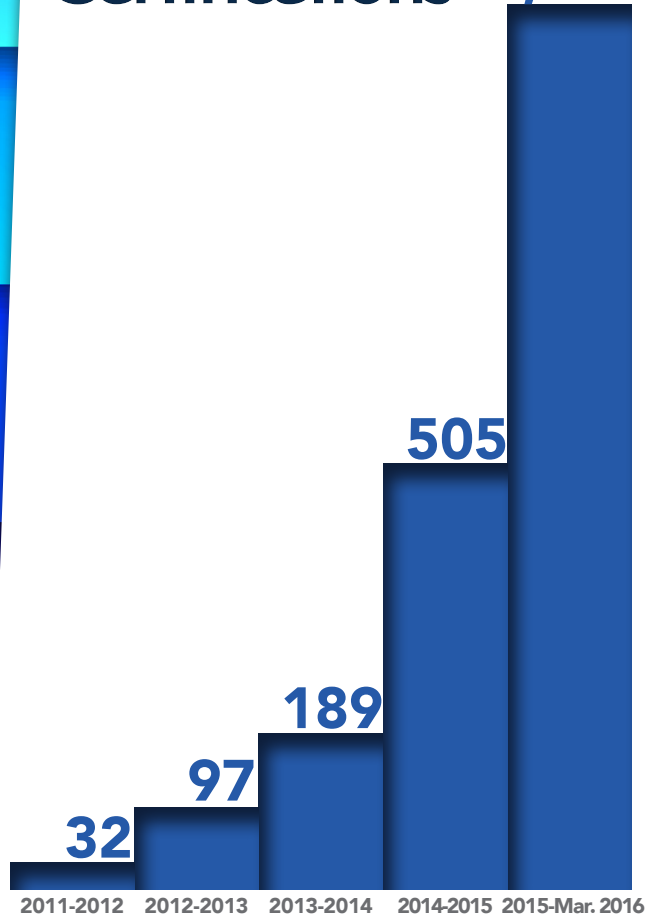

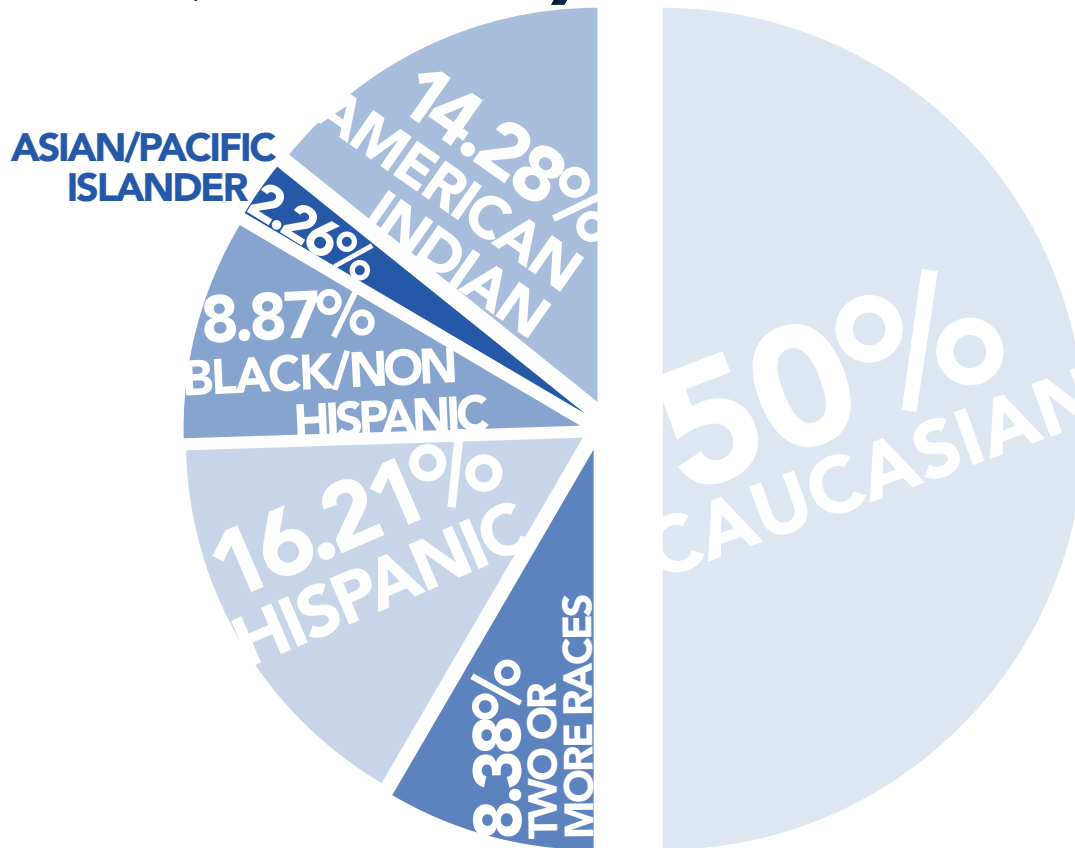

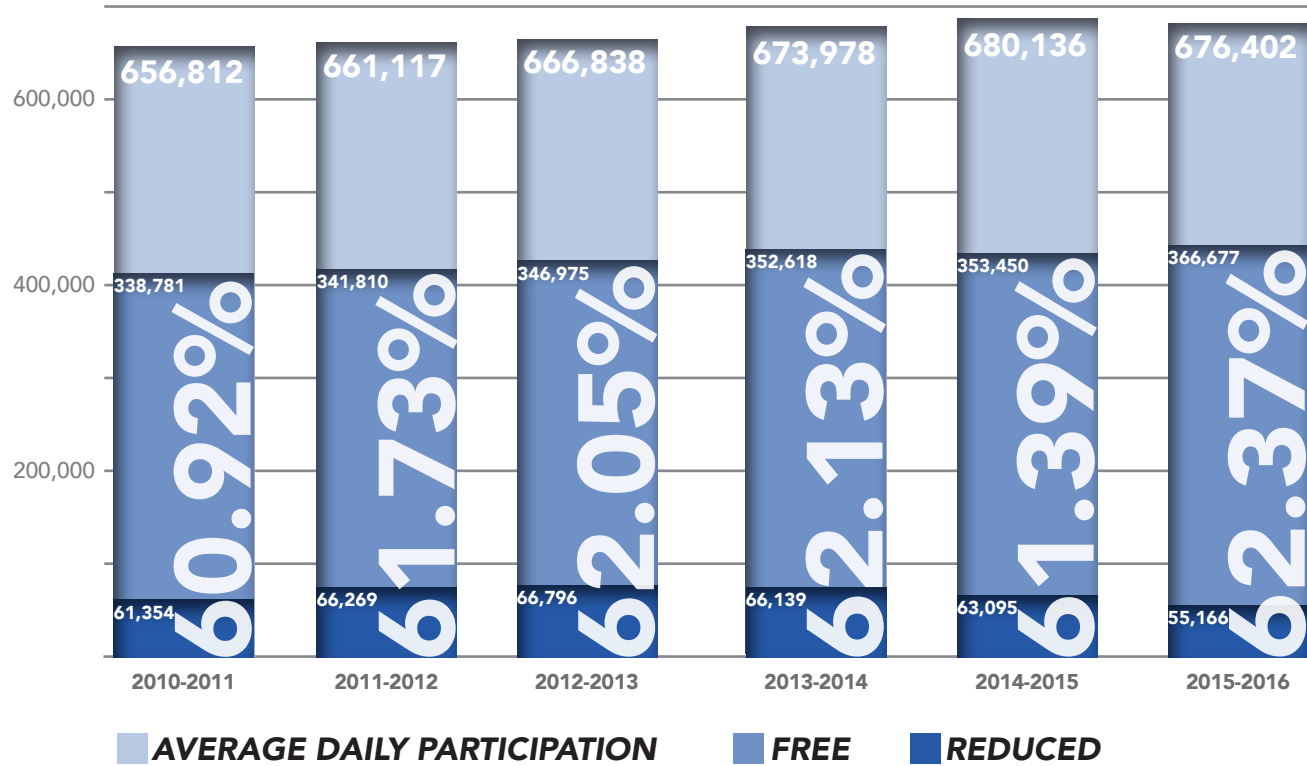

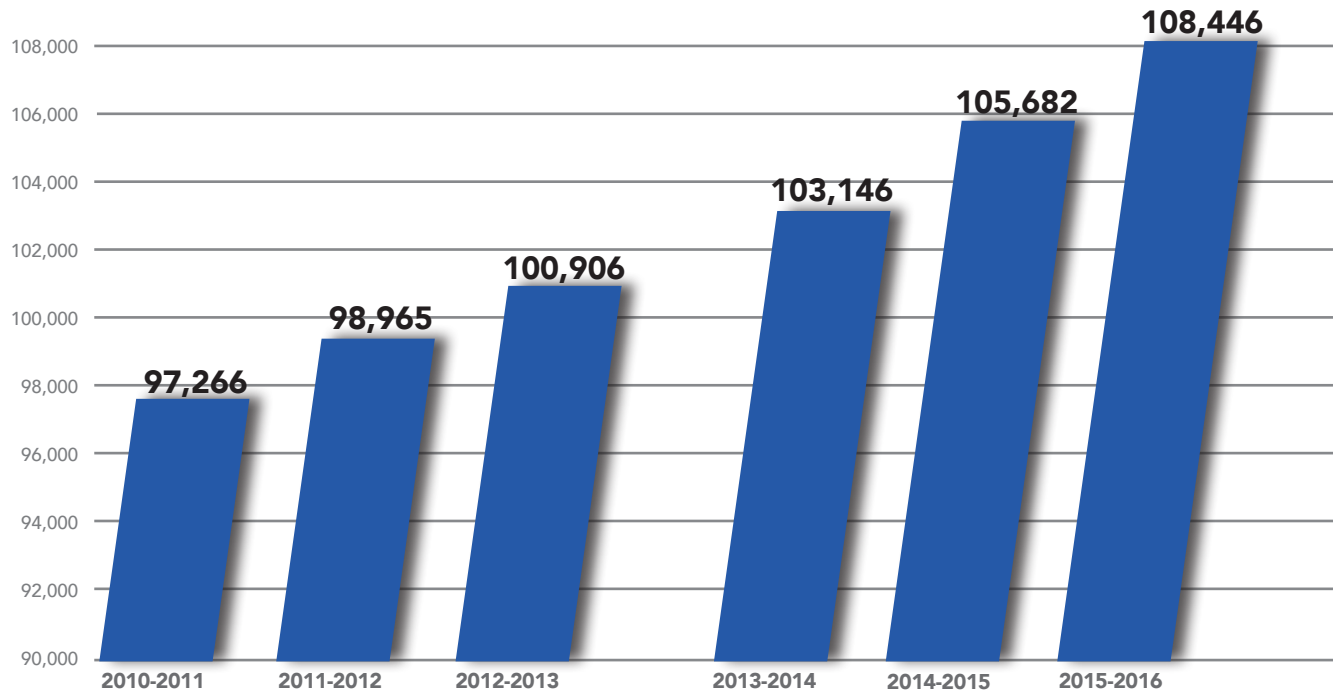
Statewide Enrollment by Race/Ethnicity 2015-2016



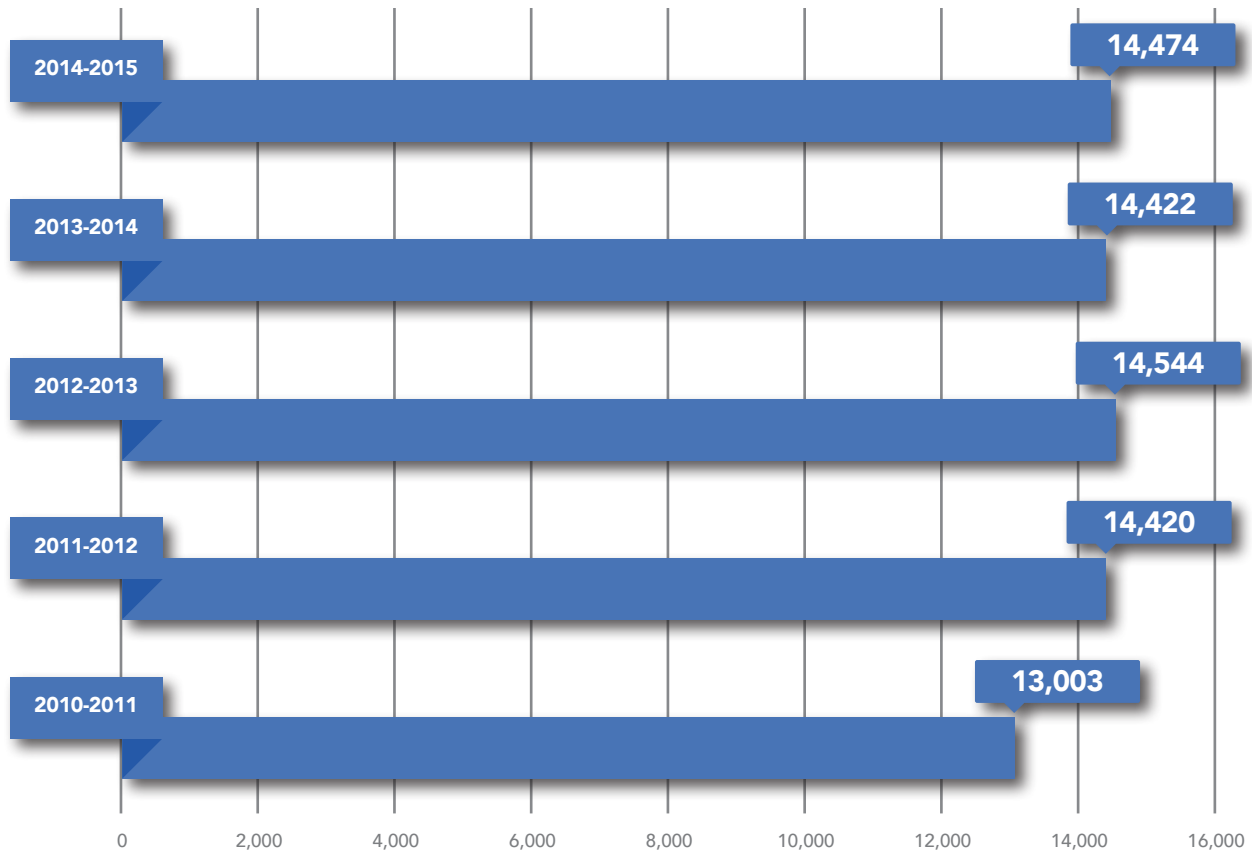
Students Eligible for Free and Reduced Lunch



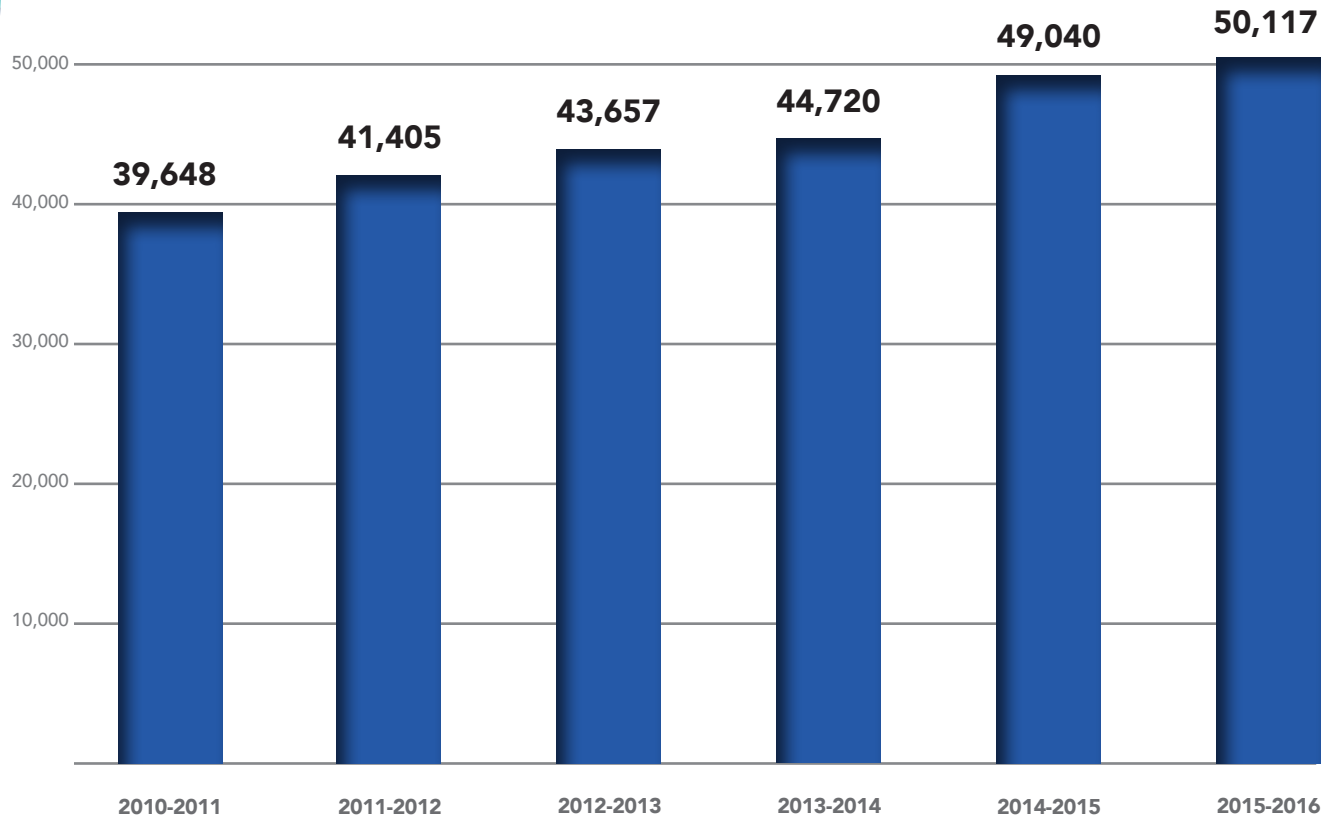
Students with Individualized Education Plans (IEPs)



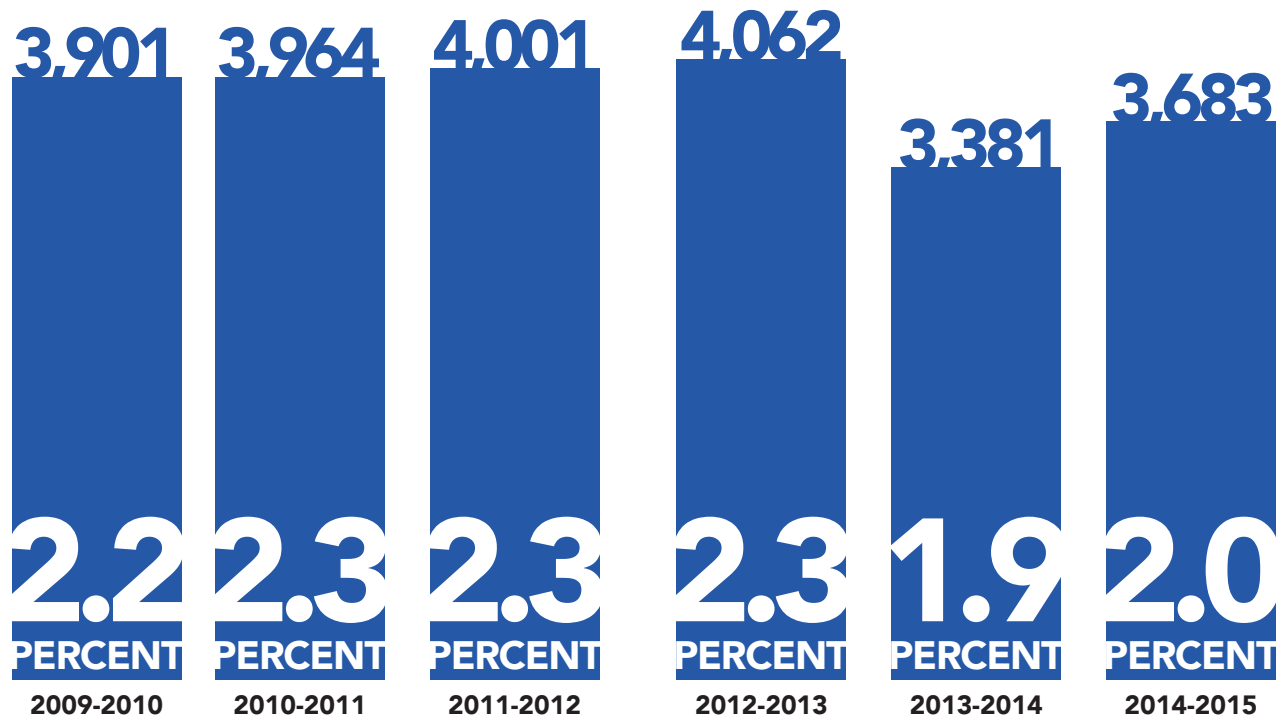
Students in Alternative Education

By the Numbers

In 2016:

- the Oklahoma Composite ACT score was **20.4** with **82%** of Oklahoma graduating seniors from the Class of 2016 tested 
- the National Average Composite ACT score was **20.8**

- printed **27,479** certificates 
- processed **22,909** fingerprints
- served **8,258** walk-in applicants

In 2014-2015, Regional Accreditation Officers:

- traveled **204,908** miles visiting schools 




Between July and December 2015, the Office of School Support:

- traveled **34,520** miles visiting schools 
- visited **493** public schools




Between July 2015 and January 2016, the Office of Curriculum & Instruction:

- gave **197** presentations
- conducted **48** professional development trainings 

In Fiscal Year 2015, Oklahoma public schoolchildren were served:

- **43,065,830** free lunches 
- **25,726,277** free breakfasts
- **68,792,107** total free meals
- **6,387,492** reduced-price lunches
- **3,064,020** reduced-price breakfasts 
- **9,451,512** total reduced-price meals
- **78,243,619** free and reduced-price meals 

Since the 2010-2011 school year:

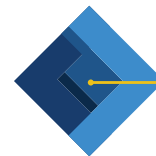
- **26.4** percent of student growth has been students who qualify as English Learners (EL). 
- There are more than **85,000** FTEs (full-time equivalents) in Oklahoma public schools, including **42,395** teachers. More than **13,000** of the certified FTEs have **20** or more years' experience. More than **7,000** have **25** or more years' experience.
