In 2014-2015, the OSDE Teacher Certification Section:

- printed 27,479 certificates
- processed 22,909 fingerprints
- served 8,258 walk-in applicants

In 2014-2015, Regional Accreditation Officers:

- traveled 204,908 miles visiting schools


Between July and December 2015, the Office of School Support:

- traveled 34,520 miles visiting schools
- visited $\mathbf{4 9 3}$ public schools

In Fiscal Year 2015, Oklahoma public schoolchildren were served:

- $43,065,830$ free lunches
- 25,726,277 free breakfasts
- $68,792,107$ total free meals
- 6,387,492 reduced-price lunches
- 3,064,020 reduced-price breakfasts
- 9,451,512 total reducedprice meals
- 78,200,000 free and reduced-price meals


Since the 2010-2011 school year:

- 31.7 percent of student growth has been students who qualify as English Language Learners (ELL).
- There are more than 85,000 FTEs (full-time equivalents) in Oklahoma public schools, including 42,395 teachers. More than 13,000 of the certified FTEs have 20 or more years' experience. More than 7,000 have $\mathbf{2 5}$ or more years' experience.
