









Statewide Enrollment by Race/Ethnicity 2017-2018



Students Eligible for Free and Reduced Lunch




Students with Individualized Education Plans (IEPs)



Students in Alternative Education




PreK-12 English Learners (EL)

Number of AP exams taken in 2017:


