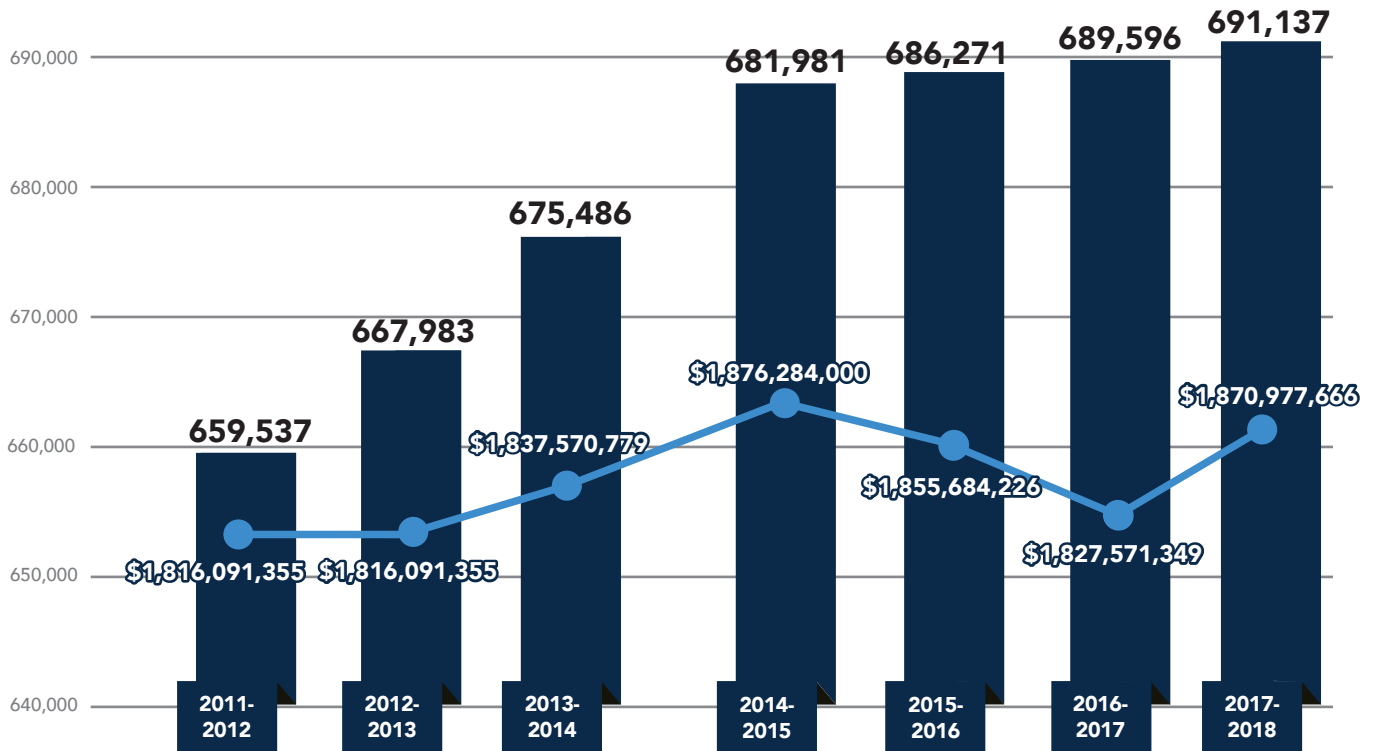

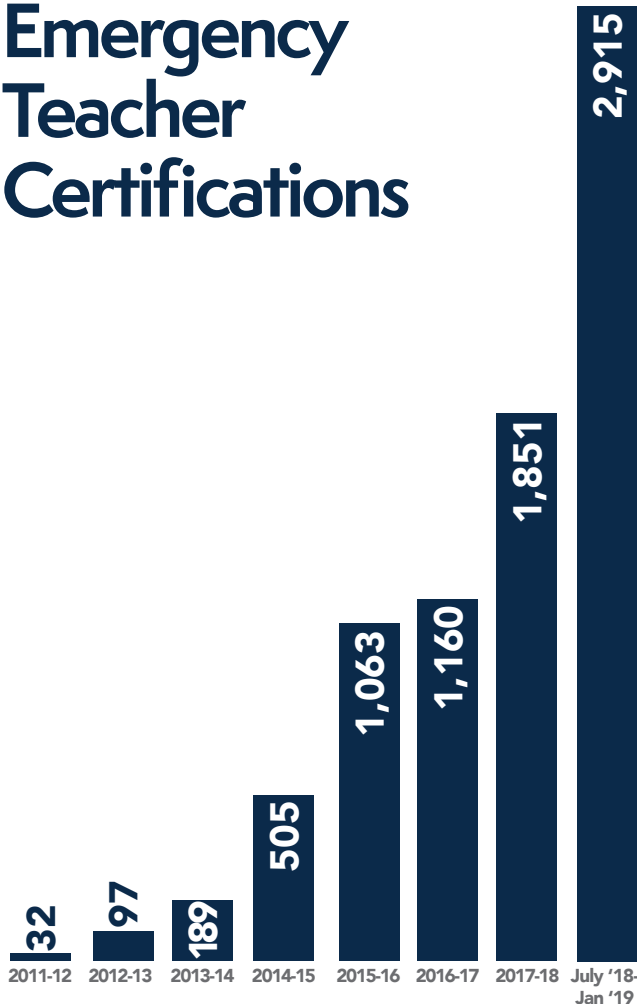

# Emergency Teacher Certifications



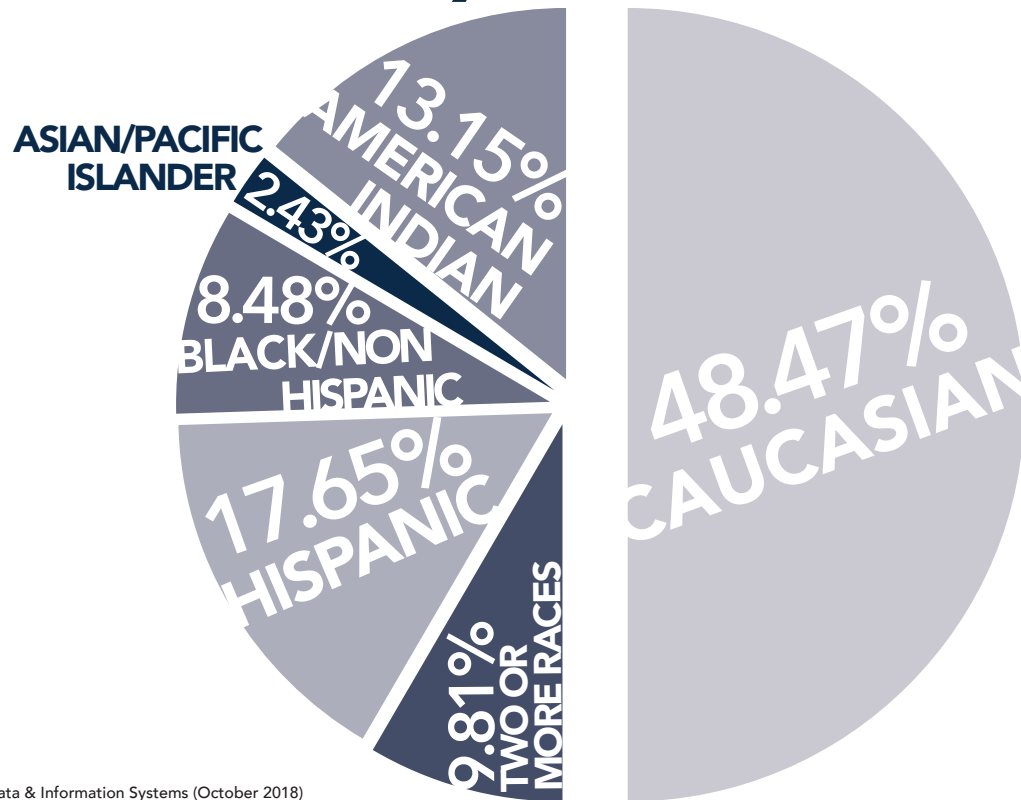

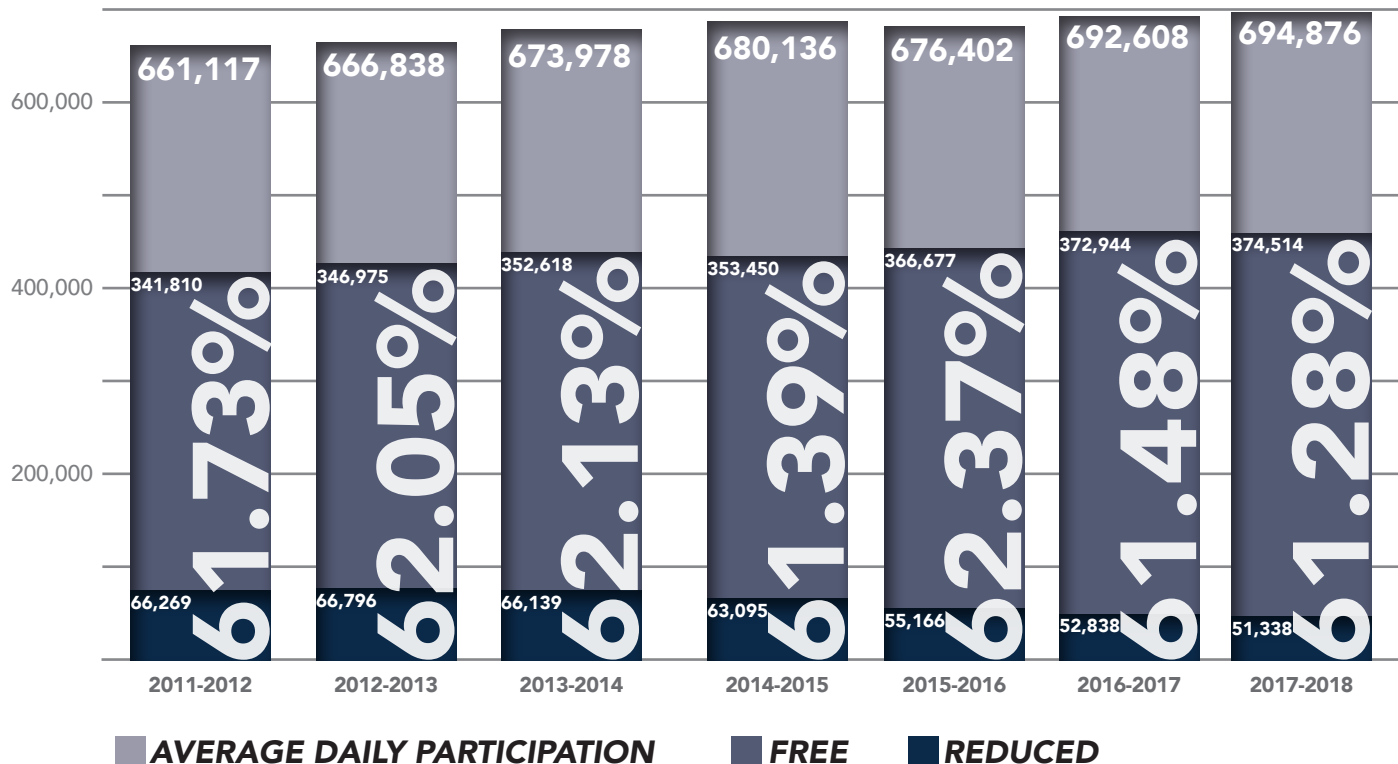

# Statewide Enrollment by Race/Ethnicity 2017-2018

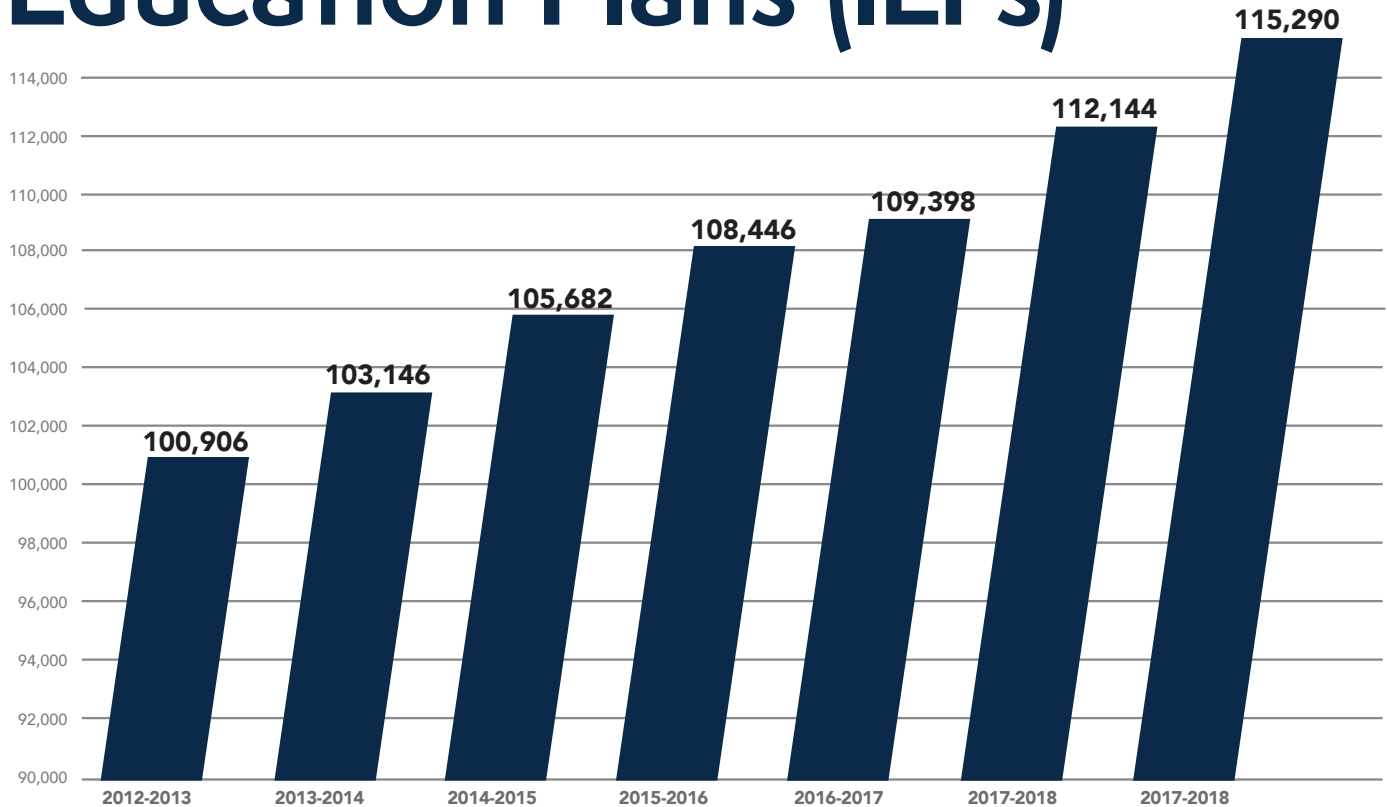

# Students Eligible for Free and Reduced Lunch



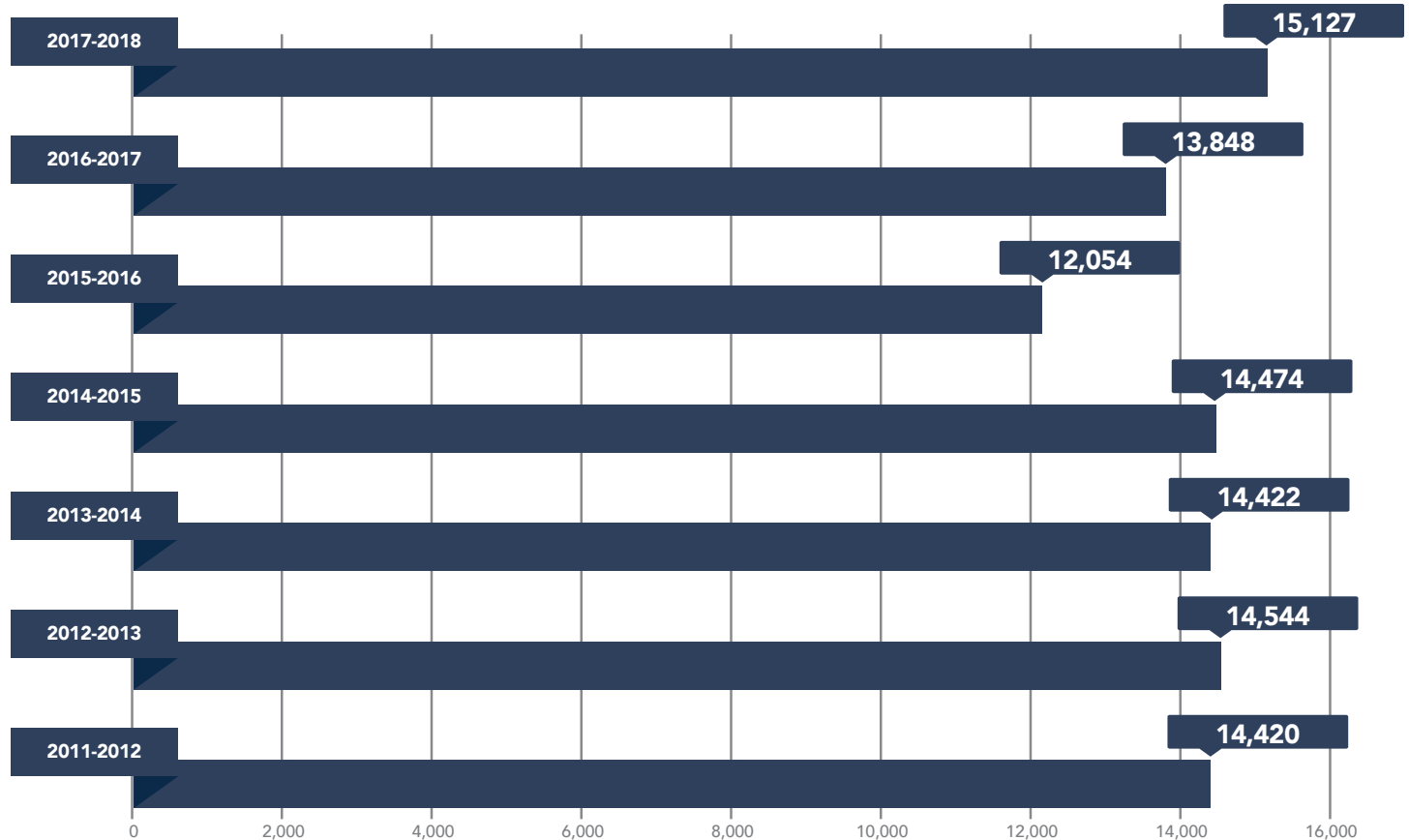
# Students with Individualized Education Plans (IEPs)

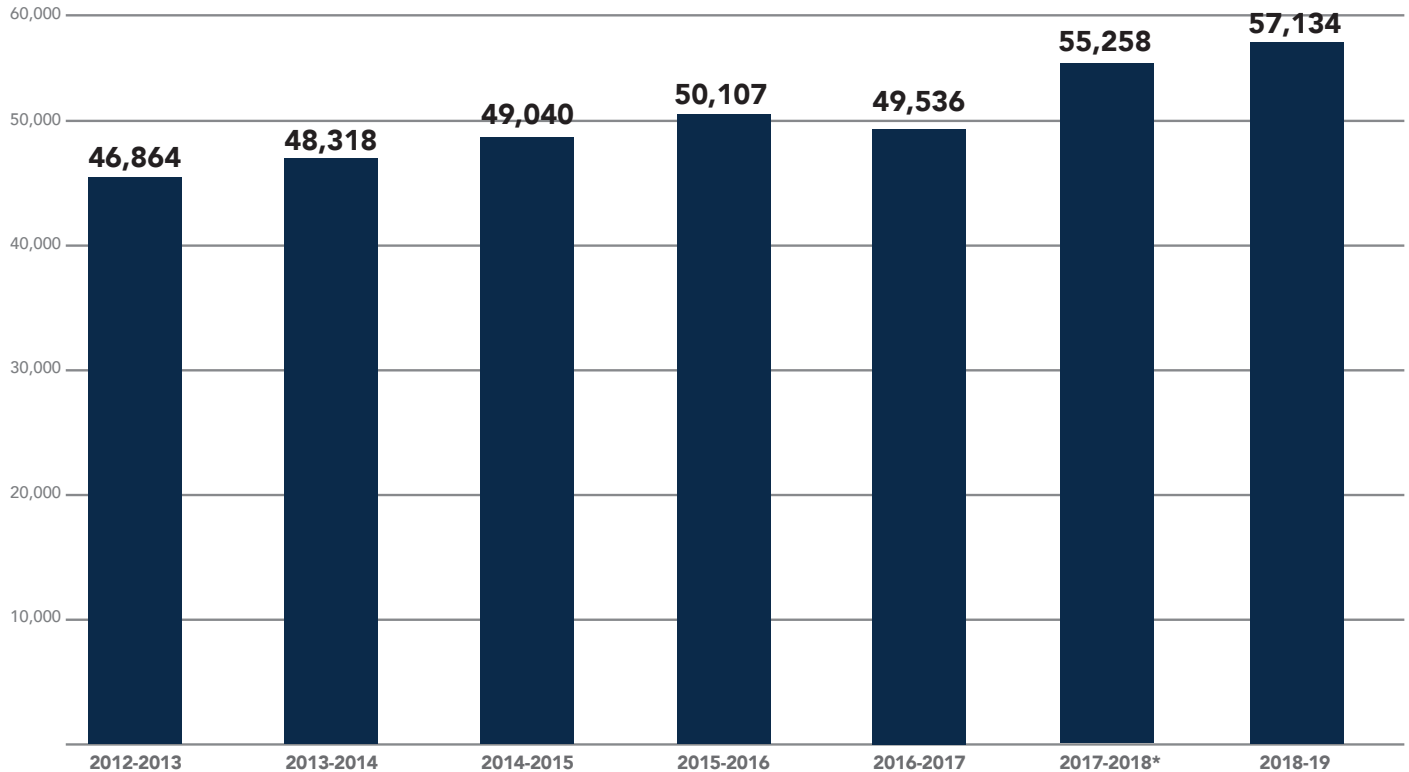


# Students in Alternative Education

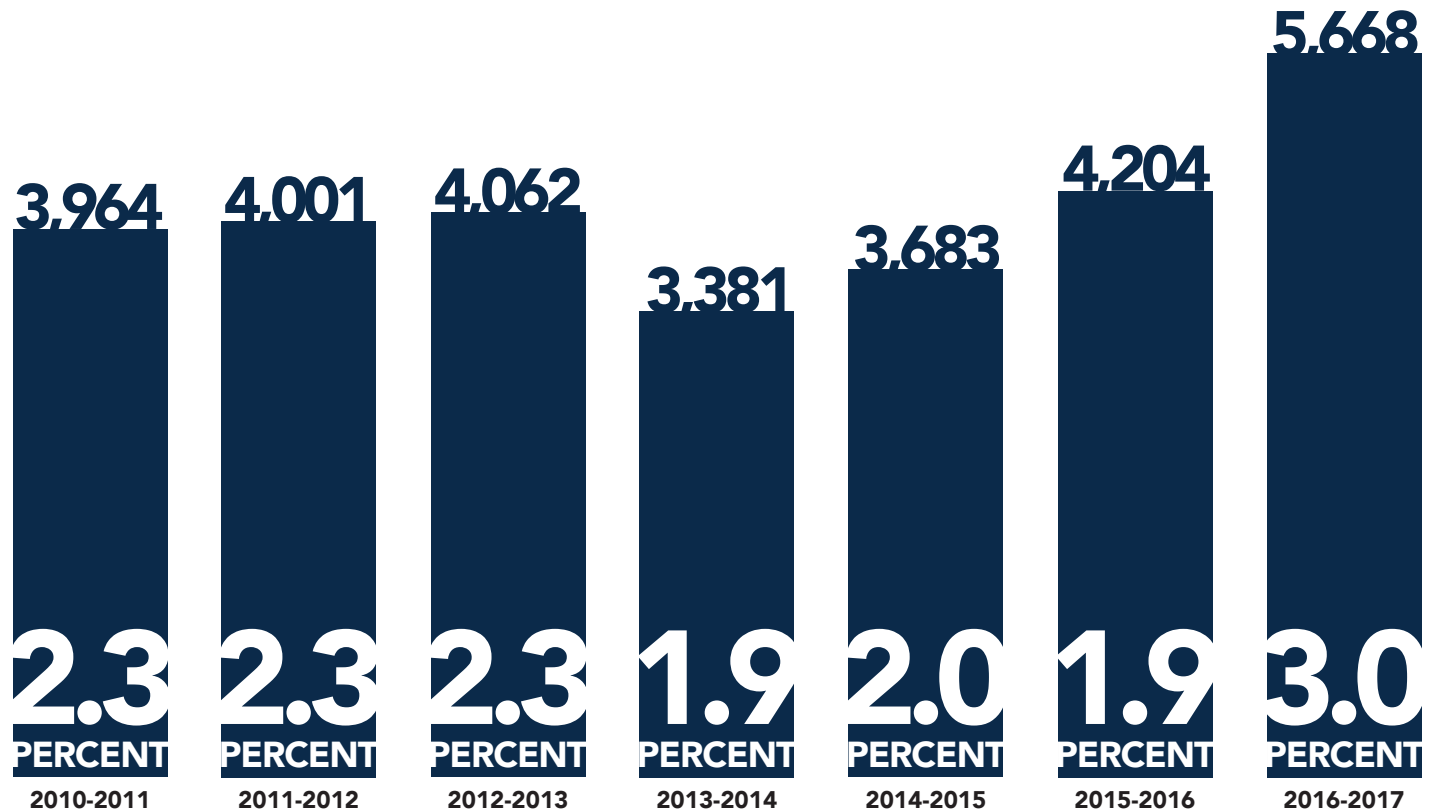
# PreK-12 English Learners (EL)

## In 2017:

- the Oklahoma Composite ACT score was **19.4** with **100%** of Oklahoma graduating seniors from the Class of 2016 tested 
- the National Average Composite ACT score was **21**

## For the 2016-2017 school year:

- There are more than **83,000** FTEs (full-time equivalents) in Oklahoma public schools, including **41,298** teachers. Over **13,000** of the certified FTEs have **20** or more years' experience. More than **7,700** have **25** or more years' experience.

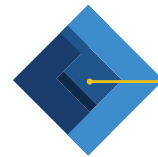
