Grade Level: 7th

7.5.7 Describe how political, economic, and cultural forces challenge contemporary political arrangements leading to the devolution of states (civil wars, terrorism, genocide, and ethnic separatism).

Getting Started

These resources will aid in the teaching of issues related to the Holocaust. In the case of 7th Grade World Geography, they address the issue of genocide in not only Europe but around the world.

As you make plans to teach about genocide with a focus on the Holocaust, please note these points:

1. Oklahoma teachers are asked to do the following three things as they address these issues with their students:
 - a) Generate an understanding of the causes, course, and effects of the Holocaust;
 - b) Develop dialogue with students on the ramifications of bullying, bigotry, stereotyping, and discrimination; and
 - c) Encourage tolerance of diversity and reverence for human dignity for all citizens in a pluralistic society.
2. These resources all address Standard 7.5.7 of 7th Grade World Geography.
3. Before you plan your lessons on the topics of genocide and the Holocaust, read “Guidelines for Teaching About the Holocaust”, published by the US Holocaust Museum.
4. Especially noting the 7th Grade World Geography curriculum, you are encouraged to begin with “What is Genocide? Overview” which will help prepare students to learn about not only the Holocaust but also other modern examples of genocide.
5. As you look through these resources and consider the amount of time you will have to teach about genocide, note the terms that are used that help indicate the length of time that can be expected for each resource.
 - a) **“Unit”** = A unit can last for a week to 2 weeks and can include multiple textual and video documents that work in tandem or can be separated out to be used individually as stand-alone resources.
 - b) **“Lesson”** = A lesson is generally designed for 2-3 class periods with multiple activities, resources and teaching strategies, including additional reflection activities.
 - c) **“Mini-lesson”** = A mini-lesson is generally designed for 1-2 class periods with 2-3 activities and optional extension activities.
 - d) **“Case study”** = A case study digs deeply into a particular topic/region for 1-2 class periods based on 2-3 documents/activities and optional extension activities.

- e) **Others**—These print and video documents do not necessarily need a set amount of time, but, instead, may be inserted into whatever lesson you might already have in place or used in tandem with one of the other resources in the list. The Holocaust Museum usually offers supporting documents for these free-standing resources which you can combine to build a full lesson if you so desire.
