High school students become a marketing, social and digital media agency focused on addressing Invent2Prevent objectives in a class, club or independent study.

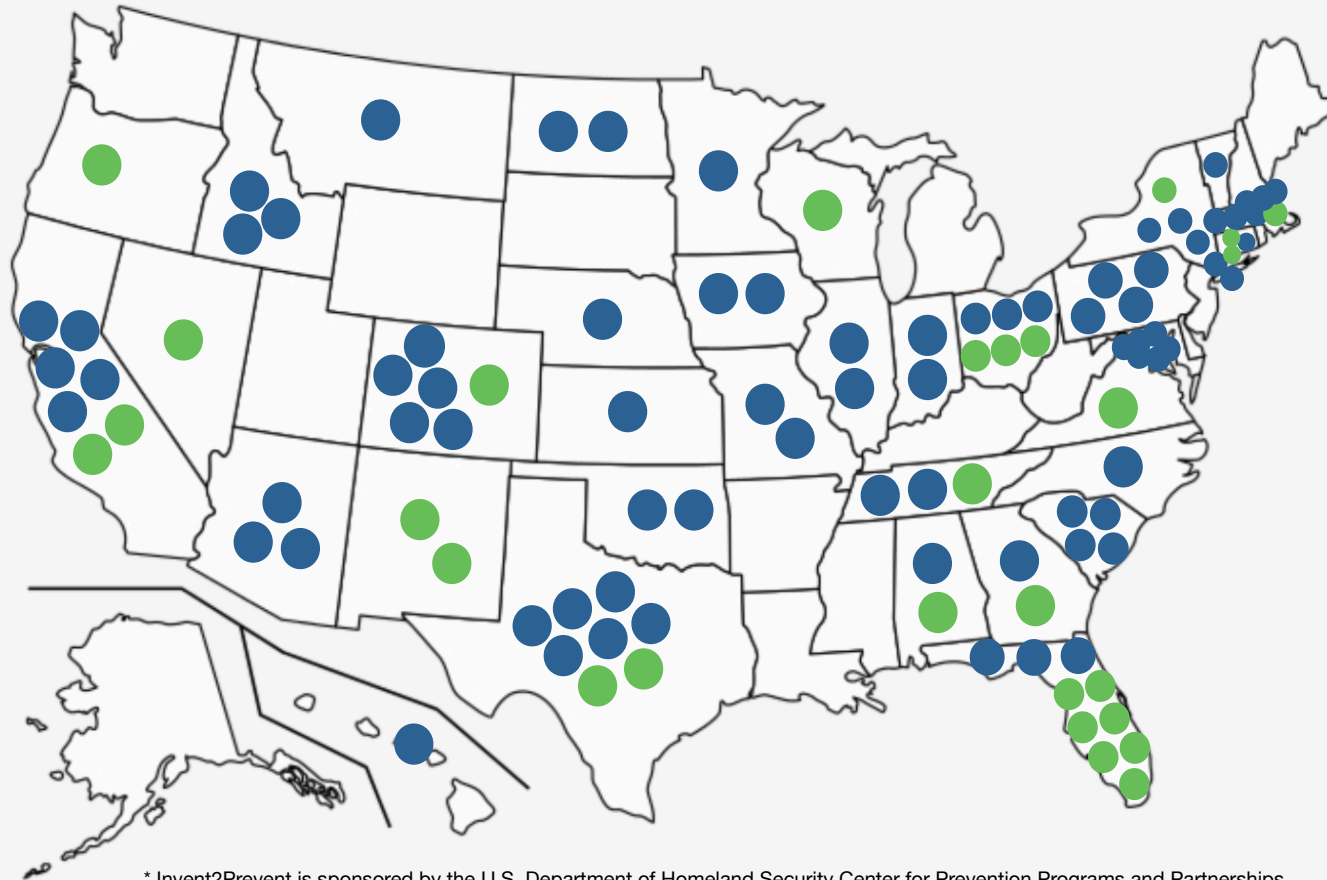

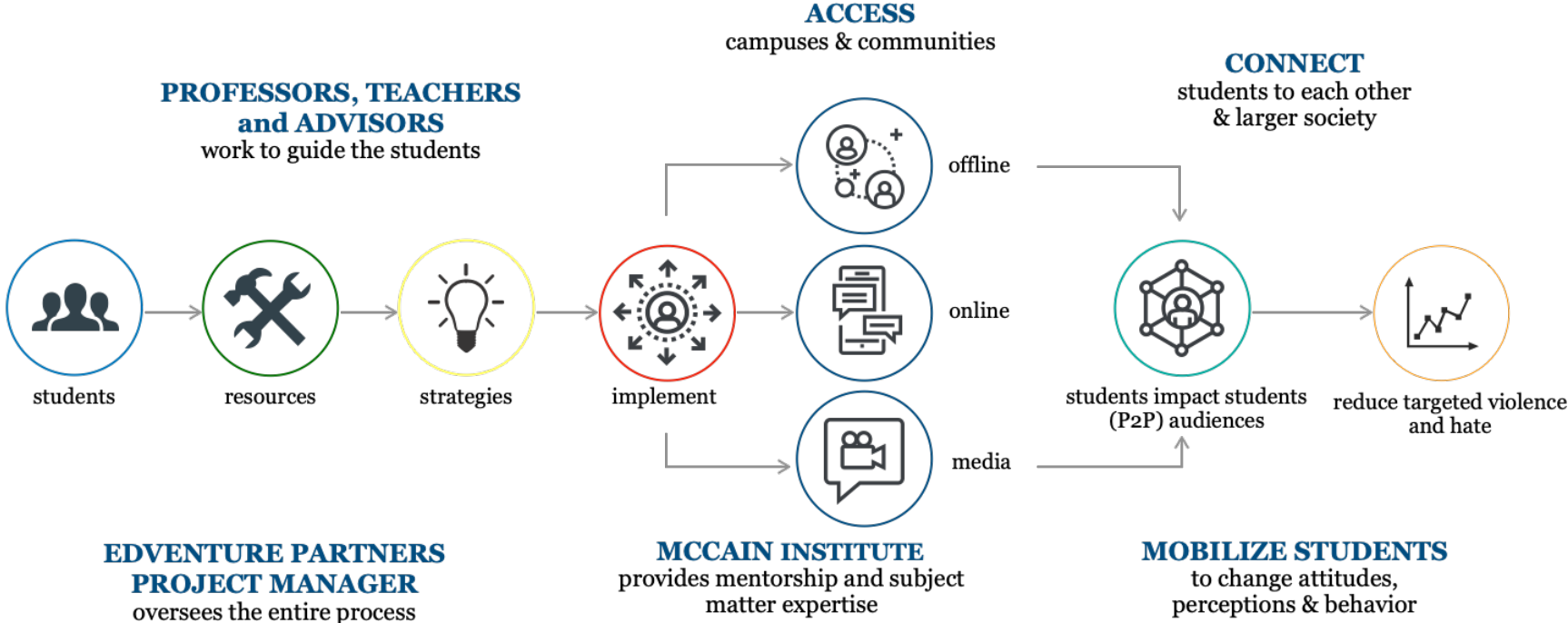

Social Impact Model



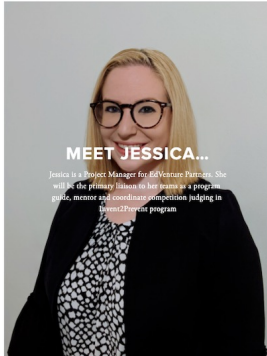

Jordan is the Project Manager for the Invent2Prevent high school program and will help facilitate the program, support your project development, and coordinate your portfolio submission.

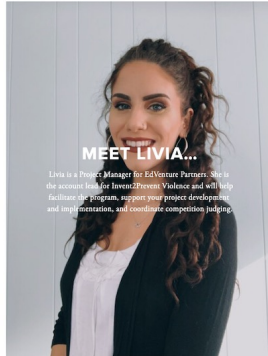

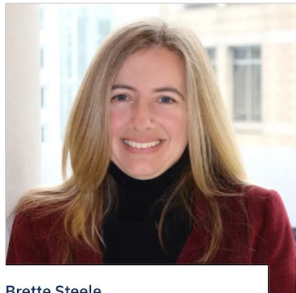

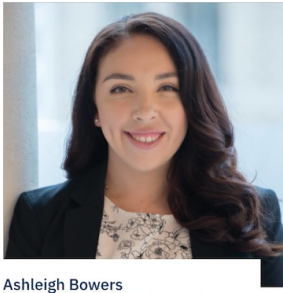
MEET LIVIA...

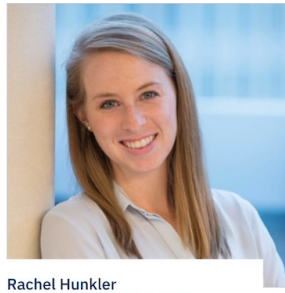

Project sponsored by the National Institute of Justice to evaluate impact of P2P

Three year longitudinal study

Social media is the main environment where youth are exposed to hate

Initiatives implemented in 8th and 9th grade *showed an impact* on the reduction of exposure of hate messages in the school environment

Initiatives implemented in 9th through 12th grade *showed an impact* on improving attitudes of tolerance towards other ethnocultural groups
