

- SDE Federal Programs Meeting October 10, 2015
- Streamlines and Consolidates 8 Existing OMB Circulars
 - Designed to Strengthen Oversight
 - Targets Waste, Fraud, and Abuse
 - Increased Flexibility for and Accountability by Grantees

Uniform Grant Guidance

- Impact to Local Education Agencies

 - Certification of Fiscal Reports
 - Time and Effort
 - Program Income



Invoices

- Signed by Program Director
- For services must include description of services, dates of service, number of students served, and fee (set fee or per student)



- Entertainment
 - activities without related academic content are not allowable
- Contracted Services
 - upload contract with claim



- Lesson Plans
 - Scientifically-based curriculum
 - Employs systematic methods that draw on observations or experiment
 - Accepted by a peer-reviewed journal
 - Involve rigorous data analyses that are adequate to test the stated hypotheses and justify the general conclusions.





- Field Trips
 - Must Fit with Theme of Study
 - Schedule Lessons
 - Lesson Plan with Academic Connection



- Food Purchases
 - Lesson Plan with Academic Outcome
 - Healthy Recipes


