SUBJECT: Statutory Waiver Concerning Cooperative Agreements for Alternative Education

The following schools are requesting a statutory waiver of 70 O.S. 1210.568, which requires them to enter into a cooperative agreement with another school district if enrollment in their alternative education program is less than ten (10) students for the 2023-2024 school year. Approval is recommended.

Section 915. Alternative Education Programs - Statewide System.

- A. Beginning with the first semester of the 1996-1997 school year, the State Board of Education shall implement a statewide system of alternative education programs which shall be phased-in within seven (7) years. The statewide system shall include but not be limited to Alternative Approaches grant programs, funded pursuant to Section 1210.561 of this title, and alternative academies or alternative programs implemented pursuant to this section.
- B. Beginning with the first semester of the 2002-2003 school year, all school districts of this state shall provide alternative education programs that conform to the requirements of statutes and rules applicable to alternative education. A program shall:
 - 1. Allow class sizes and student/teacher ratios which are conducive to effective learning for at-risk students;
 - 2. Incorporate appropriate structure, curriculum, and interaction and reinforcement strategies designed to provide effective instruction;
 - 3. Include an intake and screening process to determine eligibility of students;
 - 4. Demonstrate that teaching faculty are appropriately licensed or certified teachers;
 - 5. Demonstrate that teaching faculty have been selected on the basis of a record of successful work with atrisk students or personal and educational factors that qualify them for work with at-risk students;
 - 6. Reflect appropriate collaborative efforts with state agencies and local agencies serving youth;
 - 7. Provide courses that meet the academic curricula standards adopted by the State Board of Education and additional remedial courses;
 - 8. Offer individualized instruction;
 - 9. State clear and measurable program goals and objectives;
 - 10. Include counseling and social services components with the provision that providers of services are not required to be certified as school counselors;
 - 11. Require a plan leading to graduation be developed for each student in the program which will allow the student to participate in graduation exercises for the school district after meeting the requirements of the school district as specified in the individual graduation plan for that student; provided, for students who enter the ninth grade in or prior to the 2007-08 school year, the plan shall specifically address whether the student is required to meet the graduation requirements established in Section 11-103.6 of this title;
 - 12. Offer life skills instruction;
 - 13. Provide opportunities for arts education to students, including Artists in Residence programs coordinated with the Oklahoma Arts Council;
 - 14. Provide a proposed annual budget;
 - 15. Include an evaluation component including an annual written self-evaluation;
 - 16. Be appropriately designed to serve middle school, junior high school and secondary school students in grades six through twelve who are most at risk of not completing a high school education for a reason other than that identified in Section 13-101 of this title; and
 - 17. Allow students in the alternative education program, who otherwise meet all of the participation requirements, to participate in vocational programs and extracurricular activities, including but not limited to athletics, band, and clubs.
- C. The alternative education program of a school district shall be operational and serving students by September 15 of each school year.
- D. Each alternative education program of a school district shall receive funding based on the combined number of dropouts and students within the district who have been referred to a county juvenile service unit, a county juvenile bureau or who have been committed to the custody of the Office of Juvenile Affairs. Each alternative education program shall receive incentive funding as follows:
 - 1. For the first year of operation, One Thousand Dollars (\$1,000.00) per student;


- 2. For the second year of operation, Seven Hundred Fifty Dollars (\$750.00) per student; and
- 3. For the third year of operation and each year thereafter, Seven Hundred Dollars (\$700.00) per student.

Statewide alternative education funding shall not be used to supplant existing school district resources or to support programs that do not meet all the criteria for the statewide alternative education system. No alternative education program shall receive less than a total of Ten Thousand Dollars (\$10,000.00) per school year.

- E. By September 15 of each school year, all statewide alternative education funds received and expended for students participating in an alternative education program shall be reported to the State Department of Education by major object codes and by program classifications pursuant to the Oklahoma Cost Accounting System as adopted by the State Board of Education pursuant to Section 5-135 of this title.
- F. Elementary school districts, as defined in Section 5-103 of this title, may request a waiver from the State Board of Education from the requirements of this section to implement and provide an alternative education program. Any elementary school district that has not received funding pursuant to the provisions of subsection D of this section shall be automatically granted a waiver. If a school district is granted a waiver, no statewide alternative education funding shall be allocated to the district.
- G. 1. The State Board of Education shall contract for technical assistance for operation of an Alternative Education Technical Assistance Center. The technical assistance provider shall be an entity located in Oklahoma that has been officially recognized by the United States Department of Education to assess and facilitate dissemination of validated educational programs in Oklahoma. The technical assistance provider shall have priority, if its operations are deemed satisfactory by the State Board of Education and if funds are available, for annual renewal of the contract.
 - 2. The duties of the technical assistance provider shall include, but shall not be limited to:
 - a. providing initial and ongoing training of personnel who will educate at-risk populations through alternative education programs,
 - b. providing technical assistance to school districts to enhance the probability of success of their alternative education programs,
 - c. evaluating state-funded alternative education programs,
 - d. reporting to the State Board of Education the evaluation results of state-funded alternative education programs, and
 - e. providing in-depth program analysis and evaluation of state-funded alternative education programs.
 - 3. The State Board of Education shall not provide funding to an alternative education program that does not receive a recommendation for continued funding in the evaluation provided for in this subsection. Provided, any school district not receiving such a recommendation for continued funding may request a hearing before the Board with a review of the evaluation prior to the Board's final determination.
- H. All alternative education programs shall be subject to statutes and rules applicable to alternative education, including any exemptions from statutory or regulatory requirements authorized by statutes or rule.
- I. An alternative education program may be offered by an individual school district or may be offered jointly by school districts that have formed interlocal cooperative agreements pursuant to Section 5-117b of this title. Any school district submitting a plan for an alternative education program serving fewer than ten students shall enter into a cooperative agreement with another school district to jointly provide the program unless the program has been granted a waiver from this requirement by the State Board of Education.

- J. Any materials or equipment purchased by a school district with revenue received for students participating in an alternative education program shall be used only in or directly for the alternative education program offered by the district or any subsequent alternative education program offered to students enrolled in that district. Such materials and equipment shall be made available exclusively to alternative education students during the hours that the alternative education program is operating; provided, the material or equipment may be used for other purposes when the alternative education program is not operating.
- K. Upon implementation of this subsection as provided for in subsection M of this section and contingent upon the provision of appropriated funds designated for such purpose, all school districts in the state providing alternative education programs as required in subsection B of this section shall expand the programs to include middle-school-grade students. The program shall conform to the requirements of subsection B of this section.
- L. Upon implementation of this subsection as provided for in subsection M of this section and contingent upon the provision of appropriated funds designated for such purpose, each urban school district identified by the State Department of Education as having a high population of elementary grade students who are at-risk and in need of alternative education shall provide elementary level alternative education programs. The State Department of Education shall establish requirements for the programs. For purposes of this section, "urban school district" means a school district with an average daily membership of thirty thousand (30,000) or more.
- M. Implementation of subsections K and L of this section shall be delayed until the current expenditure per pupil in average daily attendance in public elementary and secondary schools in unadjusted dollars for the 1998-99 school year or any school year thereafter for Oklahoma, as reported by the National Center for Education Statistics annually in the Digest of Education Statistics, reaches at least ninety percent (90%) of the regional average expenditure for that same year, and funds are provided. For purposes of this subsection, the regional average expenditure shall consist of the current expenditure per pupil in average daily attendance in public elementary and secondary schools in unadjusted dollars for each of the following states: Arkansas, Colorado, Kansas, Missouri, New Mexico, Oklahoma, and Texas, averaged together. By January 1 of each year, the State Board of Education shall report whether or not the ninety-percent expenditure level has been reached based on information reported annually in the Digest of Education Statistics by the National Center for Education Statistics. Subsections K and L of this section shall be implemented on July 1 after the first January 1 report verifies that the ninety-percent expenditure level has been reached and funds have been provided for the specific purposes of this section.  - We currently have no alternative education students in our district. We have a plan in place that could serve 10 or fewer students should they enroll or meet criteria. Should our waiver be denied, and we have students move in to our district that would meet the alternative education requirements we would obtain a COOP agreement with Ft. Cobb-Broxton. Ft. Cpbb-Broxton is approximately miles from our location.

This walver would allow us to continue our own program should we need to serve future students.

Before having our own alternative education program, we utilized a coop with Ft. Cobb-Broxton. We had issues sending our students to the coop to receive their services. We were told they didn't meet their requirements, this caused several students to become further delayed or behind on their track for graduation. We have not previously applied for a waiver.

Hinton Public School is requesting a Dereg/Waiver to serve 10 or fewer students in the Alternative Education Program. We currently have no alternative education students in our district. We have a plan in place that could serve 10 or fewer students should they enroll or meet criteria. We have submitted our plan to and waiver to our school board which they approved. Should our request be denied, and we have students move into our district that would meet the alternative education requirements we would have to obtain a COOP agreement with Ft. Cobb-Broxton, which is approximately 27 miles from our location.

In previous years we have utilized a COOP with Ft. Cobb-Broxton and then transitioned into having our own alternative education academy. We have been successful in supporting our previous students academically to where they have graduated or have been transitioned back into the general education setting and are on track for graduation. This waiver would allow us to continue our own program should we need to serve future students. When we had a COOP with Ft. A. Reason for the Waiver request. Please include distance from your alternative education site to the closest possible district to coop with, what alternative means will have to be employed if your waiver was to be denied, and what percentage of your student population will benefit from the waiver if approved.

Geronimo High School is requesting this waiver due to a) the unique needs of the student(s) that enter (or may enter) our district who wish to accelerate through courses to enter the workforce and graduate early, b)students requesting alternative education programs over traditional school due to social anxiety, or c) as a personal choice to deter future possible disciplinary issues.

Great Plains Technology Center is approximately 11.5 miles from Geronimo. Geronimo Public Schools provides transportation to S.C.O.R.E. Students are encouraged to enroll in trade classes in the afternoon after S.C.O.R.E. is over.

B. List alternate strategies/plans which the district/site proposes, and how this plan will best serve the students of your district, i.e., a description of the educational benefits to the students, graduation rate if a waiver has been awarded prior to this year, and learning achievement. Our graduation rate from the alternative education program is around 95%. The educational benefits of students attending an alternative education program are that the students can work at their own pace to finish their credits OR can finish early if they are motivated to do so. The learning achievement of students directly correlates with the graduation rate - it is positive and successful.

C. Have you participated in an alternative education coop previously? Have you been awarded this waiver before and what was the educational impact to the district: Results of the Statutory Waiver, i.e., effect on student performance levels, impact of plan on other sites in the district. Geronimo High School has participated in an alternative education coop before this year. We have been awarded this waiver for several years, including the 2022-2023 school year. Students have successfully completed their graduation requirements and have graduated from S.C.O.R.E. and Geronimo High School. They have had the opportunity to learn trades to be prepared to enter the workforce upon graduation through S.C.O.R.E. and Great Plains Technology Center. There are no impacts on other sites in our district.

D. Timeline: Please submit class schedule, calendars, assessment forms and other attachments as necessary.
 Calendars for both districts are available as well as the class schedule for the one student we have attending to date.

E. Any financial impact to the District (positive or negative) for the proposed waiver/deregulation? If positive please describe where the available would be reallocated. The financial impact would be positive because it would cost our district less money to pay Great Plains Technology Center for the 1 student attending S.C.O.R.E. vs. hiring a full-time teacher to teach all subjects to that 1 student at our building. The S.C.O.R.E. program is designed to better meet the student's individual needs, whether that be more support, accelerated progress through courses, and access to highly qualified teachers. The money that would be saved would be reallocated to hiring class size assistants at either the secondary or elementary sites, purchasing classroom resources for teachers, and progress toward updating technology at both sites.

F. Describe method of assessment or evaluation of effectiveness of the plan both for staff and students, i.E., TLE, ACT scores, graduation rates, RSA, School Report Card, etc.

The method of assessments we will use to base our evaluation of effectiveness are graduation rates, drop out rates, and ACT scores. Using these methods will help us compare the progress of students attending S.C.O.R.E vs. traditional school.

GREAT PLAINS TECHNOLOGY CENTER S.C.O.R.E. PROGRAM MEMORANDUM OF UNDERSTANDING

This Agreement by and between Geronimo Public School System, Geronimo, OK, and Great Plains Technology Center, Lawton, OK, concerns the enrollment and funding of alternative education students in the S.C.O.R.E. Program, (School of Career Opportunities and Real Education).

Geronimo Public School System agrees to pay to Great Plains Technology Center 90% of the funding received from the State Department of Education in the form of A.D.M. for each student that is enrolled from that district in the S.C.O.R.E. program. In turn the S.C.O.R.E. program staff agrees to furnish all necessary enrollment information, attendance information, grades, and credits earned on each student for which funding is received.

Billings will be made on a yearly basis with computations made at the end of each year based on students that are enrolled and are in attendance or have been in attendance for a portion of the year for which billing is made. Great Plains Technology Center further agrees to provide academic and vocational training and counseling as needed for the students. The S.C.O.R.E. program further agrees to provide tuition for students in night time classes or AT&D classes at Great Plains Technology Center as described in our state program proposal.

Geronimo Public School System agrees to accept the credits of students and work with the S.C.O.R.E. program staff to confirm credits and documentation necessary to establish requirements for graduation for the enrolled students.

It is understood that the S.C.O.R.E. program is currently funded by a O.D.C.T.E. state grant and if funding should become non-existent or the basis for funding should change materially, this agreement can be cancelled or re-negotiated by both parties. It is agreed that this memorandum shall remain in force until such a time that it is cancelled or changed by both parties. It is anticipated that the S.C.O.R.E. program will continue on an annual basis as long as adequate funding is obtained from various sources.



We currently have fewer than 10 students participating in our Alt. Ed. Program. These students are primarily credit recovery.

B. List alternate strategies/plans which the district/site proposes, and how this plan will best serve the students of your district, i.e., a description of the educational benefits to the students, graduation rate if a waiver has been awarded prior to this year, and learning achievement. Our Alt. Ed. Program is vital to our district, in order for our students to meet all their graduation requirements to achieve a Oklahoma High School Diploma. Our primary need is for credit recovery. We are the only school that services these full-time students in a 20 mile radius. Being in a rural location, we feel strongly that being allowed to continue this program, regardless of the few numbers, is what is best for our students and district.

- c. Have you participated in an alternative education coop previously? Have you been awarded this waiver before and what was the educational impact to the district: Results of the Statutory Waiver, i.e., effect on student performance levels, impact of plan on other sites in the district. We have not participated in an Alt. Ed. coop previously. We have been awarded this waiver before. By allowing this waiver our district has the ability to provide our high school students the opportunity to complete their credit requirements on a timely basis and not to have to return as a 5th year senior, which we feel reduces the number of student dropouts.

We have a certified teacher who monitors the students who attend our Alt Ed Program from 12:0 pm to 3:00 pm each day, Monday-Friday. We also have our other core teachers provide additional assistance for their subject areas if Ms. Harland is not able to assist with assignments.

E. Any financial impact to the District (positive or negative) for the proposed waiver/deregulation?

If positive, please describe where the available would be reallocated.

This program allows students to work on credit recovery at their own pace and they can access lessons from anywhere they have internet connection. Allowing them the opportunity to recover missing credits required for graduation. This greatly reduces the cost of having to transport students to other locations.

F. Describe method of assessment or evaluation of effectiveness of the plan both for staff and students, I.E., TLE, ACT scores, graduation rates, RSA, School Report Card, etc. We review a weekly report from on-line curriculum for each student who participates, and we review assessments to evaluate the effectiveness of our Alt Ed Program and make necessary changes to ensure the success of our students. Our teacher is evaluated with the TLE.

 - Only 1-2 students are served every 3-4 years and the district can serve those needs through our personalized learning capabilities. Woodward High School has terminated their co-op which is 21 miles away from our district site.

The personalized learning capabilities within our district allow us to tailor all curriculum to their needs. The personalized learning approach has been utilized extensively and has resulted in academic success for students allowing them to graduate on time.

Have you been awarded this waiver before and what was the educational impact to the district: Results of the Statutory Waiver, i.e., effect on student performance levels, impact of plan on other sites in the district. Yes, the district participated with the Woodward alt ed co-op, however, they have informed this district their co-op program is being terminated for the 2023-2024 school year. No waiver has been sought by our district previously. If awarded the statutory waiver, there will be no impact to other sites in the district and student performance levels will not be affected.

The graduation rate is high receiving an A on the Oklahoma School Report Card. The site received a B in chronic absenteeism on the Oklahoma School Report Card with no reportable data in the other areas of the report card. An academic achievement classroom is available throughout the day to accomodate the needs of all students and reinforce academic skills.
