To ensure students with significant cognitive disabilities are provided with appropriate state assessments, the Oklahoma Alternate Assessment Program (OAAP) mirrors the general assessment in regards to grades and subjects assessed.

The 2016-17 OAAP will utilize two different assessment systems. High School US History will be assessed through Portfolio/PearsonAccess. The subject areas of math, science and English/Language Arts will be assessed through the Dynamic Learning Maps (DLM) Alternate Assessment System. 2016-2017 OAAP District Test Coordinator Database

In an effort to create a smoother testing experience, we are requesting that school districts choose only one District Test Coordinator (DTC) for the Oklahoma Alternate Assessment Program (OAAP). This individual will receive all information regarding the Dynamic Learning Maps Alternate Assessment system and the Pearson Portfolio. The OAAP DTC does not have to be the same person as the DTC for the general assessments, but we do encourage school districts to combine these rolls if possible. All users with the role of DTC in the DLM system will be changed to the role of District User after August 31 unless identified through the OAAP DTC survey. The District User role allows the same level of access in the DLM system as the DTC role except for the inability to create new District Users. The DLM system will allow the District User to create all roles except for District User and DTC. We are asking that you fill out the OAAP DTC designation form **no later than August 31, 2016** by clicking the link below and providing the requested information.
