SUBJECT: Statutory Waiver Concerning Cooperative Agreements for Alternative Education

The following schools are requesting a statutory waiver of 70 O.S. 1210.568, which requires them to enter into a cooperative agreement with another school district if enrollment in their alternative education program is less than ten (10) students for the 2022-2023 school year. Approval is recommended.

Section 915. Alternative Education Programs - Statewide System.

A. Beginning with the first semester of the 1996-1997 school year, the State Board of Education shall implement a statewide system of alternative education programs which shall be phased-in within seven (7) years. The statewide system shall include but not be limited to Alternative Approaches grant programs, funded pursuant to Section 1210.561 of this title, and alternative academies or alternative programs implemented pursuant to this section.

B. Beginning with the first semester of the 2002-2003 school year, all school districts of this state shall provide alternative education programs that conform to the requirements of statutes and rules applicable to alternative education. A program shall:

1. Allow class sizes and student/teacher ratios which are conducive to effective learning for at-risk students;
2. Incorporate appropriate structure, curriculum, and interaction and reinforcement strategies designed to provide effective instruction;
3. Include an intake and screening process to determine eligibility of students;
4. Demonstrate that teaching faculty are appropriately licensed or certified teachers;
5. Demonstrate that teaching faculty have been selected on the basis of a record of successful work with at-risk students or personal and educational factors that qualify them for work with at-risk students;
6. Reflect appropriate collaborative efforts with state agencies and local agencies serving youth;
7. Provide courses that meet the academic curricula standards adopted by the State Board of Education and additional remedial courses;
8. Offer individualized instruction;
9. State clear and measurable program goals and objectives;
10. Include counseling and social services components with the provision that providers of services are not required to be certified as school counselors;
11. Require a plan leading to graduation be developed for each student in the program which will allow the student to participate in graduation exercises for the school district after meeting the requirements of the school district as specified in the individual graduation plan for that student; provided, for students who enter the ninth grade in or prior to the 2007-08 school year, the plan shall specifically address whether the student is required to meet the graduation requirements established in Section 11-103.6 of this title;
12. Offer life skills instruction;
13. Provide opportunities for arts education to students, including Artists in Residence programs coordinated with the Oklahoma Arts Council;
14. Provide a proposed annual budget;
15. Include an evaluation component including an annual written self-evaluation;
16. Be appropriately designed to serve middle school, junior high school and secondary school students in grades six through twelve who are most at risk of not completing a high school education for a reason other than that identified in Section 13-101 of this title; and
17. Allow students in the alternative education program, who otherwise meet all of the participation requirements, to participate in vocational programs and extracurricular activities, including but not limited to athletics, band, and clubs.

C. The alternative education program of a school district shall be operational and serving students by September 15 of each school year.

D. Each alternative education program of a school district shall receive funding based on the combined number of dropouts and students within the district who have been referred to a county juvenile service unit, a county juvenile bureau or who have been committed to the custody of the Office of Juvenile Affairs. Each alternative education program shall receive incentive funding as follows:

1. For the first year of operation, One Thousand Dollars (\$1,000.00) per student;

2. For the second year of operation, Seven Hundred Fifty Dollars (\$750.00) per student; and
3. For the third year of operation and each year thereafter, Seven Hundred Dollars (\$700.00) per student.

Statewide alternative education funding shall not be used to supplant existing school district resources or to support programs that do not meet all the criteria for the statewide alternative education system. No alternative education program shall receive less than a total of Ten Thousand Dollars (\$10,000.00) per school year.

E. By September 15 of each school year, all statewide alternative education funds received and expended for students participating in an alternative education program shall be reported to the State Department of Education by major object codes and by program classifications pursuant to the Oklahoma Cost Accounting System as adopted by the State Board of Education pursuant to Section 5-135 of this title.

F. Elementary school districts, as defined in Section 5-103 of this title, may request a waiver from the State Board of Education from the requirements of this section to implement and provide an alternative education program. Any elementary school district that has not received funding pursuant to the provisions of subsection D of this section shall be automatically granted a waiver. If a school district is granted a waiver, no statewide alternative education funding shall be allocated to the district.

G. 1. The State Board of Education shall contract for technical assistance for operation of an Alternative Education Technical Assistance Center. The technical assistance provider shall be an entity located in Oklahoma that has been officially recognized by the United States Department of Education to assess and facilitate dissemination of validated educational programs in Oklahoma. The technical assistance provider shall have priority, if its operations are deemed satisfactory by the State Board of Education and if funds are available, for annual renewal of the contract.

2. The duties of the technical assistance provider shall include, but shall not be limited to:
 - a. providing initial and ongoing training of personnel who will educate at-risk populations through alternative education programs,
 - b. providing technical assistance to school districts to enhance the probability of success of their alternative education programs,
 - c. evaluating state-funded alternative education programs,
 - d. reporting to the State Board of Education the evaluation results of state-funded alternative education programs, and
 - e. providing in-depth program analysis and evaluation of state-funded alternative education programs.

3. The State Board of Education shall not provide funding to an alternative education program that does not receive a recommendation for continued funding in the evaluation provided for in this subsection. Provided, any school district not receiving such a recommendation for continued funding may request a hearing before the Board with a review of the evaluation prior to the Board's final determination.

H. All alternative education programs shall be subject to statutes and rules applicable to alternative education, including any exemptions from statutory or regulatory requirements authorized by statutes or rule.

I. An alternative education program may be offered by an individual school district or may be offered jointly by school districts that have formed interlocal cooperative agreements pursuant to Section 5-117b of this title. Any school district submitting a plan for an alternative education program serving fewer than ten students shall enter into a cooperative agreement with another school district to jointly provide the program unless the program has been granted a waiver from this requirement by the State Board of Education.

J. Any materials or equipment purchased by a school district with revenue received for students participating in an alternative education program shall be used only in or directly for the alternative education program offered by the district or any subsequent alternative education program offered to students enrolled in that district. Such materials and equipment shall be made available exclusively to alternative education students during the hours that the alternative education program is operating; provided, the material or equipment may be used for other purposes when the alternative education program is not operating.

K. Upon implementation of this subsection as provided for in subsection M of this section and contingent upon the provision of appropriated funds designated for such purpose, all school districts in the state providing alternative education programs as required in subsection B of this section shall expand the programs to include middle-school-grade students. The program shall conform to the requirements of subsection B of this section.

L. Upon implementation of this subsection as provided for in subsection M of this section and contingent upon the provision of appropriated funds designated for such purpose, each urban school district identified by the State Department of Education as having a high population of elementary grade students who are at-risk and in need of alternative education shall provide elementary level alternative education programs. The State Department of Education shall establish requirements for the programs. For purposes of this section, "urban school district" means a school district with an average daily membership of thirty thousand (30,000) or more.

M. Implementation of subsections K and L of this section shall be delayed until the current expenditure per pupil in average daily attendance in public elementary and secondary schools in unadjusted dollars for the 1998-99 school year or any school year thereafter for Oklahoma, as reported by the National Center for Education Statistics annually in the Digest of Education Statistics, reaches at least ninety percent (90%) of the regional average expenditure for that same year, and funds are provided. For purposes of this subsection, the regional average expenditure shall consist of the current expenditure per pupil in average daily attendance in public elementary and secondary schools in unadjusted dollars for each of the following states: Arkansas, Colorado, Kansas, Missouri, New Mexico, Oklahoma, and Texas, averaged together. By January 1 of each year, the State Board of Education shall report whether or not the ninety-percent expenditure level has been reached based on information reported annually in the Digest of Education Statistics by the National Center for Education Statistics. Subsections K and L of this section shall be implemented on July 1 after the first January 1 report verifies that the ninety-percent expenditure level has been reached and funds have been provided for the specific purposes of this section.

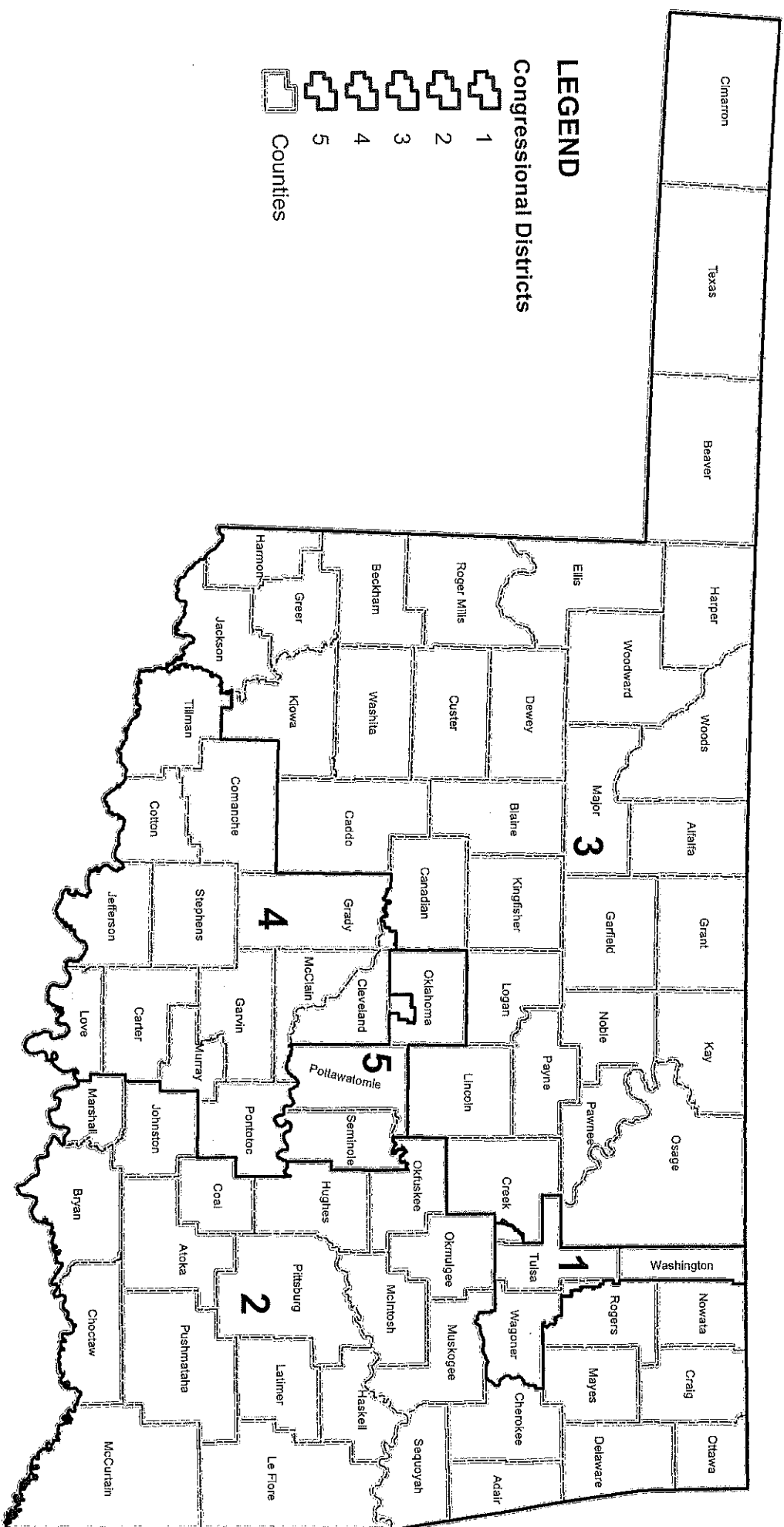
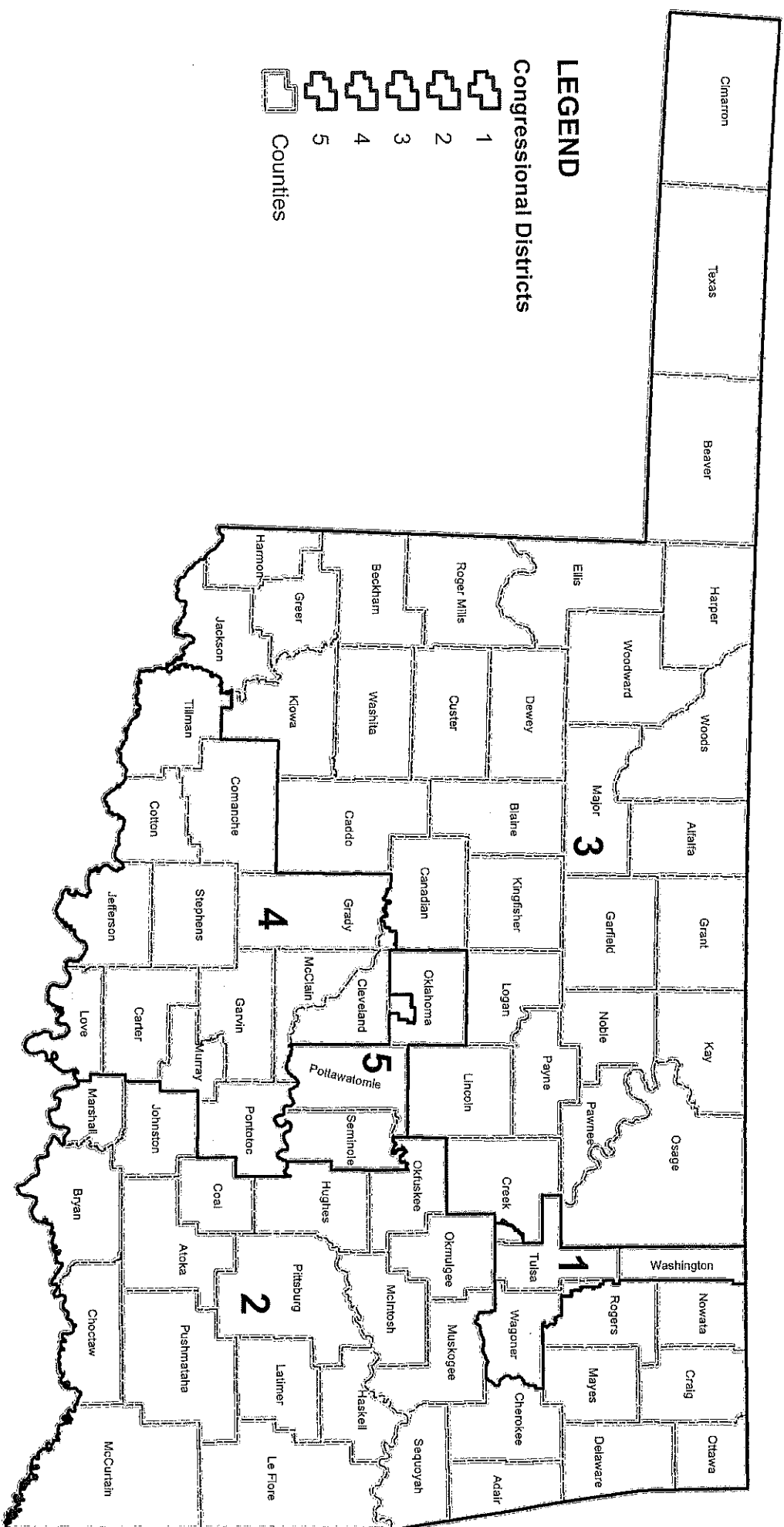



- A. Reason for the Waiver request. Please Include distance from your alternative education site to the closest possible district to coop with, what alternative means will have to be employed if your waiver was to be denied, and what percentage of your student population will benefit from the waiver if approved.

Beaver schools was part of the Alternative Education COOP in Hooker that dissolved. In lieu of Hooker serving as the LEA of this COOP, we created the Duster Learning Academy at our local school district last year. We are a high school of approximately 70 students, so having 3 students enrolled in the academy will service approximately 5% of our students.

- B. List alternate strategies/plans which the district/site proposes, and how this plan will best serve the students of your district, i.e., a description of the educational benefits to the students, graduation rate if a waiver has been awarded prior to this year, and learning achievement.

The district plan includes:

1. Shortened/more flexible hours in the school building
2. More individualized instruction through smaller class size
3. Online/individualized curriculum facilitating distance learning when needed
4. Individualized instruction based on student progress
5. Life skills instruction to help students transition to the "adult" world after high school
6. Continued opportunities to participate in extra-curricular activities such as band, choir, CareerTech courses (FFA, BPA, FCCLA), and athletics

- C. Have you participated in an alternative education coop previously? Have you been awarded this waiver before and what was the educational impact to the district: Results of the Statutory Waiver, i.e., effect on student performance levels, impact of plan on other sites in the district.

Beaver Schools was awarded this waiver for the 2022-2023 school year. Previously, Beaver Public Schools participated in an alternative education program that was off-site. The LEA for the coop was Hooker Public Schools. Bringing the alternative education services back on campus has allowed Beaver to better serve the needs of the students qualified to participate in the Duster Learning Academy.

1. Duster Learning Academy is in session for the same days as Beaver Public Schools. Please see attached school calendar.

2. Students in Duster Learning Academy attend from 8:00-12:15 every day. If needed, the schedule may be adjusted to best serve the needs of the individual student.

4. Academic assessments will be completed through the same means as Beaver High School (state assessments, ACT, benchmark exams)

E. Any financial impact to the District (positive or negative) for the proposed waiver/deregulation? If positive please describe where the available would be reallocated.

For the 2023-2024 school year, Beaver Public Schools qualified for a total of \$4,161.40 in alternative education funding. The majority of positive impact from the Duster Learning Academy would be in the form of educational quality, academic planning, and student retention.

F. Describe method of assessment or evaluation of effectiveness of the plan both for staff and students, I.E., TLE, ACT scores, graduation rates, RSA, School Report Card, etc.

1. Teachers will be evaluated through the TLE model using the OkTLE website.

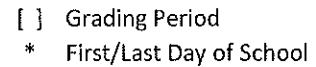
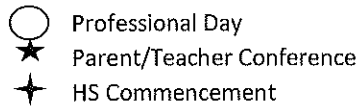
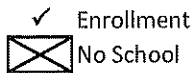
2. Graduation and retention rates will be used to assess the effectiveness of the program as a whole.

Dear Parent or Legal Guardian:

Senate Bill 982 was passed by the Oklahoma Legislature and signed into law by Governor Henry on June 7, 2005. The law requires eighth-grade students entering the ninth grade in the 2006-2007 school year to complete the college preparatory curriculum in SB 982, unless the student's parent or legal guardian approves the student to enroll in the existing state high school graduation requirements. The options for the existing state graduation requirements and new college preparatory curriculum requirements are attached. Successful completion of either curriculum will result in accomplishment of a standard diploma.

Choosing the courses a student takes in high school is an important decision for you and your child. With your input, courses chosen for a student's career pathway can give him or her a head start on career and education success. A college preparatory curriculum is challenging and may help determine a student's future success in higher education and the world of work. Students who take a college preparatory curriculum designed to prepare them for both college and career have more opportunities. In addition, high school students who enroll in a career pathway at a technology center and meet eligibility requirements have the opportunity to earn college credit while in high school. This opportunity has been made possible through a new Cooperative Alliance between the State Regents for Higher Education and the Oklahoma Department of *CareerTech*.

Please complete the information below and return it to the office of your child's principal or school counselor prior to enrollment. **According to the law, if you do not select the existing state high school graduation requirements, your child will automatically be enrolled in the new college preparatory curriculum.** Please contact the school principal or school counselor if you have questions or need information on local graduation requirements.

Behavior Contract

This contract is between BDLA and _____.

By signing this contract, I agree to abide by all the rules and regulations of Beaver Schools and understand that I may lose MY PRIVILEGE to attend for violation of these rules. **I understand my enrollment at BDLA may be immediately terminated for violation(s) of any of the following rules:**

- 1) **Disruption:** a student shall not by use of violence, force, threatening, or any other means cause disruption to any students, faculty, or school property.
- 2) **Insubordination and Disrespect:** a student shall not disregard or refuse to comply with reasonable requests of school employees or directions given by the teacher or school official. REFUSAL TO WORK will result in dismissal from the program. Examples of refusal to work include but are not limited to: sleeping in class, texting, being on websites other than Odysseyware, being on a different subject area than that assigned by the instructor, or refusal to login and work on the computer. The THIRD time an instructor reports a student for refusal to work, he/she will be dismissed from the program. Students are to remain ONLY on the Odysseyware website unless doing research or course work assigned by the instructor. This includes staying off other websites and the games on the computer.
- 3) **Damage to School Property:** a student shall not cause or attempt to damage any part of school property. In addition, restitution may be required and/or charges may be filed with the proper authorities.
- 4) **Attendance:** a student shall attend school in compliance with the compulsory attendance laws of Oklahoma. Students are allowed up to 2 absences per class per semester. Absences exceeding these limits may result in dismissal from the program. Three tardies count as one absence. Excused absences are not allowed unless deemed necessary by the director. Leaving class early for a work obligation may be excused if **PREARRANGED** with Coach Hawkins. Documentation must be provided from the employer to make these arrangements. Unless approved by Coach Hawkins, any other instances of leaving class early will result in an absence for that day of class.

In addition to meeting the attendance requirements, students must complete Odysseyware course requirements to receive credit for the given class. If the curriculum is not completed at the end of the semester, the student will receive an Incomplete ("I") grade until the coursework is finished, regardless of attendance.

- 5) **Assault and/or Battery:** physical violence (or the threat of) will not be tolerated.
- 6) **Weapons:** a student shall not possess, use, or conceal any type of weapon.
- 7) **Drugs or Alcohol:** No student shall be under the influence or possess any type of drugs or alcohol while at school. This includes cigarettes and vapes.

- 8) **Criminal Behavior:** this behavior is defined by law to include, but not limited to, assault, battery, larceny, robbery, malicious mischief, vandalism, unlawful assembly, fighting, false alarms and reports, arson, forgery, and gambling.
- 9) **Motor Vehicles:** a student shall not operate a motor vehicle in a reckless manner on school property.
- 10) **Profanity, Obscene Language and Gestures:** a student shall not use profanity, obscene language or gestures at school.
- 11) **Cult/Gang Behavior:** cult or gang behavior through dress, actions, grooming, jewelry, color, trademark, or any other actions is prohibited.
- 12) **Cell Phones:** cell phones are not allowed out during class time and are only allowed to be on and used during break times. If a phone is seen or heard by the instructor, it must remain on the teacher's desk or not brought to class at all. The **FIRST** time a student is caught texting during work time, the student will no longer be allowed to bring a cell phone into the building.
- 13) **Excessive Display of Affection:** excessive displays of affection will not be tolerated in the classroom, halls or anywhere on school property.
- 14) **Visitors:** students will have NO VISITORS during class. Parents/Guardians should check in with the teacher upon arrival.
- 15) **Closed Campus:** upon arriving at BDLA, students are not allowed to leave without permission from the teacher. Students must stay in designated areas at all times while attending school unless accompanied by the instructor. **Designated areas are the library, computer lab and the hallway between the Learning Academy classroom and the restrooms located in the JH hallway.** Students will only be allowed in the restrooms during the appropriate break times.
- 16) **Clothing/Piercings:** students will abide by the school dress code. Students shall have ear jewelry only.
- 17) **Food/Drink:** students are allowed to bring food from home for lunch if students are planning to eat in the cafeteria. Water bottles must be brought in a closed container and opened in front of the teacher upon arrival. **NO ENERGY DRINKS ARE ALLOWED.** No food/drink are allowed in the computer lab.
- 18) : Any and all rules in the school handbook will be followed. A copy of the school handbook may be found on the school district's website (beaver.k12.ok.us). Violations of Board of Education Policies, Rules and Regulations: a student shall not violate any school policies of Beaver Public Schools.

Previously, Beaver Public Schools was engaged in an alternative education coop being offered through Hooker Public Schools. The coop dissolved after the 2020-2021 school year. As a result, and to better serve our students, Beaver Public Schools started the Duster Learning Academy.

Currently, we have 70 students enrolled in the high school. Due to the size of our school, we are requesting a statutory waiver under title 70 O.S. § 1210.568, which would allow us to offer alternative education services through the Duster Learning Academy with fewer than 10 students. Our demographics do not support 10 or more students out of the 70 enrolled to be eligible for the Duster Learning Academy. However, we wish to offer this to those students who truly need an alternative path to education. Currently, we have 3 students enrolled in the academy and have 2 more potential students that may be enrolled in the second semester.

I am requesting a waiver of (70 O.S. 1210.568) for the purpose of meeting the criteria for our Alternative Education program. We are a small rural school district with its own Alternative Education program. Turpin was in an Alternative Education Coop during the FY 21 school year with Hooker but that Coop no longer exists. If this waiver is denied Turpin schools would have to try and find several schools to form a Coop to try and reach 10 students. The logistics and distance make that difficult in the panhandle. These are reasons that the previous Coop no longer exists. At this time there are no students in Alternative Education. Turpin has a few students that are in credit recovery but we feel that these students can get caught up in house.

- B. List alternate strategies/plans which the district/site proposes, and how this plan will best serve the students of your district, i.e., a description of the educational benefits to the students, graduation rate if a waiver has been awarded prior to this year, and learning achievement. We have CourseWare through Edmentum that is offered seven class periods throughout the day. A student could also be given a device to take these classes if it was deemed more effective for that student to work from home. A student would be set up in the classes that they need. Teachers would monitor their progress. A weekly appointment with our Counselor would be scheduled to help these students stay on track. It has been several years since Turpin has had a student that was in alternative education.

- C. Have you participated in an alternative education coop previously? Have you been awarded this waiver before and what was the educational impact to the district: Results of the Statutory Waiver, i.e., effect on student performance levels, impact of plan on other sites in the district. Turpin was in an alternative education coop during the FY21 school year with several schools and Hooker was the LEA. This Coop no longer exists. Turpin has been awarded this waiver since then. Turpin did not have any alternative education students last year.

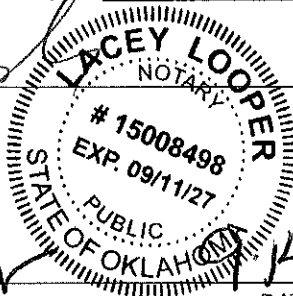

The number of students participating in the program represents seven percent of our total student population.

Alternative Education Program

The Shady Grove School District will provide a free and appropriate education for all enrolled students. School programs and activities will be developed for opportunities for student success, regardless of developmental stages or abilities.

The Alternative Education Program will serve up to five students from ages 13-15. The curriculum will be competency-based credit. The students will be administered the curriculum from the regular grade-level curriculum, and resource materials which meet the Oklahoma Academic Standards requirements mandated by the Oklahoma State Department of Education.

The curriculum will be self-paced and taught by a certified staff member. Students will be required to enroll in a counseling component, provided by the district or off-site, through CREOKS. Students will be enrolled in core classes, plus, counseling. Students in grades six and up will have the opportunity to continue core classwork during the scheduled physical education period, if they so choose. Students are welcome to participate in extra-curricular activities, providing the student is maintaining progress in academic achievement.

The district recognizes "At Risk" students to be the population in most need of alternative strategies for student achievement, including a change of atmosphere, time of day, and supplemental services.

AT-RISK IDENTIFICATION:

Definition of At-Risk Students are children and youth who's present or predictable status (economic, social-cultural, academic, and/or health) indicates that they might fail to successfully complete their secondary education and acquire basic life skills necessary for higher education, vocational education and/or employment.

More specifically children may be deemed at risk if:

1. They are a member of a household or family whose income is at or below poverty level.
2. The student is overage for grade placement. The students GPA is below 2.0.
3. The student has credit deficiencies for graduation or promotion with the entering class.

4. The student has a “lower than basic” test score on the Oklahoma Schools Testing Program.
5. The student has the following behavioral interventions: Full day in-school suspension (2-5 times) Full day in-school suspension (5 times or more) Home suspension (1-2 times) Home suspension (2 times or more)
6. The student has poor attendance during the semester or previous semester. Absent 8 days Absent more than 10 days (excluding transitory medical conditions)
7. The student has a personal crisis or trauma such as: Pregnancy Drug / alcohol abuse
8. Physical abuse Suicide attempt, a parent, teacher or counselor has referred the student.
9. Transience status of the student (3 years of possible) 2 or more schools 3 or more schools 4 or more schools
10. The student has been retained One or more years Two or more years
11. The student has been a school dropout the student has behavioral adaptation problems Externalizes Internalizes
12. The students may meet any of the above criteria in order to apply and /or be referred for the alternative education program.

“Alternative Education” means an educational process incorporating appropriate structure, curriculum, interaction, and reinforcement strategies to stimulate learning with students who have not utilized their capacity to do so within traditional educational settings. Alternative education programs must meet all requirements listed at 70 O.S. § 1210.568 and at section 210:35-29-7 of this title.

Requirements

- (a) General requirements. Alternative education is an educational process incorporating appropriate structure, curriculum, interaction, and reinforcement strategies to stimulate learning with students who are at risk of failing to complete their secondary education for reasons which may include academic deficiency, behavioral difficulties, excessive absences, pregnancy or parenting, family issues, substance abuse, financial issues, physical or mental health issues, state custody, juvenile justice involvement, and/or other such factors, not including disability status.
- (b) An alternative education program must provide the additional services and supports outlined in statute, and not merely an opportunity for credit recovery. To qualify as an approved alternative education program, a school district’s alternative school or alternative education program must meet all requirements listed at 70 O.S. § 1210.568, including:

- (1) Student-teacher ratios conducive to effective learning for at-risk students;

The district will enroll the most at-risk students into the program in order to provide a low student to teacher ratio.

- (2) Appropriate structure, curriculum, interaction, and reinforcement strategies for effective instruction;

Students in the program will receive instruction in approved curriculum, although some modification and accommodations may be necessary.

- (3) An intake and screening process to determine eligibility of students;

Enrollment processes will identify students in need of referral into the program. Staff will review the definitions "At-Risk" and make referrals accordingly.

- (4) Appropriately certified teaching faculty;

All teachers at Shady Grove School are qualified, credentialed, and have appropriate endorsements.

- (5) Teaching faculty with experiences or personal traits that qualify them for successful work with at-risk students;

The faculty at Shady Grove School are adept at relating to student needs and providing strategies to encourage positive student response.

- (6) Collaboration with state and local agencies;

Shady Grove School has made contact with the Department of Human Services, Cherokee Nation Child Welfare, Cherokee County Health Department, Cherokee Nation Health, and CREOKS Counseling for assistance when needed.

- (7) Courses that meet the curricular Standard adopted by the State Board of Education and additional remedial courses;

Coursework is adapted from curriculum and resources from the approved textbook list for core and supplemental education by the State Board of Education

- (8) Individualized instruction;

Each student enrolled in the Alternative Education Program will be assessed to current achievement levels and will have an individualized plan for instruction based on these assessments.

- (9) Clear and measurable program goals and objectives;

The school's counselor will be tasked with providing services and referrals for needed social services.

Enrolled students will complete a transition plan to allow them to be successful when they leave the Elementary District and begin secondary education.

(12) Life skills instruction;

Students will be provided opportunities and experiences to become self-sufficient in the world around them. A basic understanding of citizenship, finance, health, and nutrition for example, will be included in the general curricular activities.

(13) Opportunities for arts education;

Student personal interests and talents will be allowed in self-directed activities within core curriculum areas of study. Personal expression in writing, art, performing arts, woodworking, and other available elective classes will be available for enrolled students.

(14) A proposed annual budget;

The district has not applied for or received funding from the State Department of Education for an Alternative Education Program. Staffing, materials, and other resources will be provided through expense from the district's general fund.

(15) An evaluation component that includes an annual written self-evaluation;

A developmentally appropriate self-reflection activity will be completed by each enrolled student annually.

(16) Service to students in grades seven (7) through twelve (12) who are most at risk of not completing high school for reasons other than disability;

The Shady Grove School District is a rural elementary district serving students in grades Pre-Kindergarten through Eighth Grade. The community, not a town, has no businesses, no public services, save the school district. Thus, the school is the center of the community and is in the position to know the students, their immediate and extended families, their current needs, and the history of these families. Our experience has taught us to identify at-risk students upon enrollment, regardless of grade level. Supplemental strategies for student achievement begin with following the Oklahoma Early Learning Guidelines for Children – Ages Three through Five and continue forward through benchmarks and annual assessments at all grade levels. Our emphasis is to not allow a student needing assistance to be overlooked.

(17) Opportunities for student participation in vocational programs and extra-curricular activities such as athletics, band, and clubs.

The Shady Grove School District community - including students, faculty, staff, and administration - believes that inclusion is essential to the fulfillment of our school's mission. We value inclusiveness in learning, curricular and co-curricular programming, campus climate, hiring and retention.

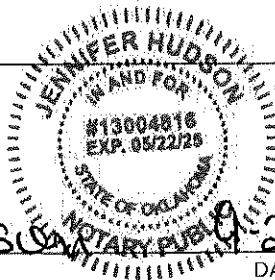

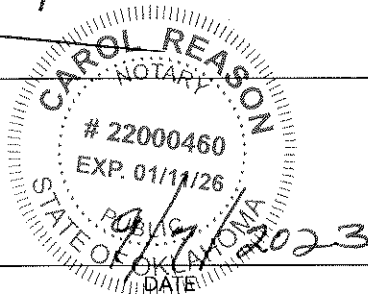

The school district is a total of 15 square miles with less than 100 in-district students. Our enrollment consists of almost 300 transfers from larger school districts such as Moore, Norman, Noble and Little Axe. All 4 surrounding K-12 districts offer alternative education programs. Over 3/4 of our students are transfers, alternative education is not needed. A benefit of being a small school district is that the administration and educators can accommodate almost all alternative educational needs.

We would like to continue providing a well-rounded education for our students.

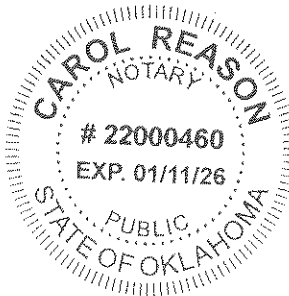

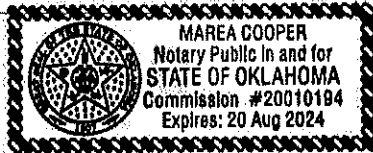

Gypsy Public School is requesting the waiver for the following reasons: 1. GPS does not have a high school. All students have the choice to attend any high school in the area, with the closest being 15 miles away. 2. GPS has never participated in a co-op program for Alternative Education due to the small size of the classes and the district (for example, there are 7 students total in the 7th and 8th grade classes this year and 60 students in the entire district.) 3. Small class size allows for much more teacher interaction and one-on-one instruction with all students, and 4. Historically, we have never had a student drop out of GPS and of our traceable students in the neighboring high schools, none have dropped out. If the waiver is denied, GPS will continue to employ our intervention plan. +

GPS proposes that we continue to use our current intervention plan which includes our extended school day, one-on-one intervention, individualized education plans for all students as needed, strong family communication, and daily collaboration of all members of the academic team. This plan has consistently worked for GPS and our students' academic progress and graduation rate reflect that success. This plan will continue to best serve the students in our district because it is grounded in the depth of knowledge that we have and the relationships we have built with our families and students.

We are a small rural school with limited recourses. We left the Wayne COOP (13 miles away) several years ago due to the district expense to be a member and the Wayne COOP is only offered in the evenings. We are able to offer an Alt. Ed. program during the school day where students will have access to the same resources that any other students would have access to yet also be able to be flexible enough to accomodate each Alt. Ed. Students individual needs (education, work, college, childcare, MATC classes, etc..). We are able to work very closely with our students and provide most any services and/or needs to accomodate them. We rarely ever have more than one or two students enrolled in Alt. Ed. and we can not justify the extra expense of the COOP and be limited

If provided a waiver our students will have full access to transportation, cafetera food, counselor, principal, interventionist, and any other resource that a normal student would have. We would be able provide services that best fits the students schedule wether it be work, child, court, etc. If students want to participate in field trips and extracurricular activites they would be able to do so just as the regular education students do. I know that when we were a member of the Wayne COOP our students were limited to what they had access to and we do not want to limit them when it comes to their education or school experiences.

Have you been awarded this waiver before and what was the educational impact to the district: Results of the Statutory Waiver, i.e., effect on student performance levels, impact of plan on other sites in the district. We have had this waiver before and look forward to continuing the waiver so that we can continue to provide all the services that we have. Since we have had our waiver we have been able to accomodate student needs that we could not in a COOP. We have been able to get students caught up and return to regular classroom, some even participate in blended programs (Alt. Ed. and Regular Ed.). We have found by being able to be flexible our student attendance, retention, and success rate has greatly increased.

Our program starts with breakfast from 7:30-8:00am. Class starts at 8:00am and ends at 1:00pm. Lunch is at 11:30-12:00. Snacks and bottled water are provided throughout the day. Students participating in extracurricular programs after 1:00pm remain on campus. Our Alt. Ed. calendar is the same as our Paoli School Calendar so that we can better accomodate all of our students. Calendar is attached.

The closest alternative education site is 12 miles away. Approximately 10-15% of our students would be involved if held on our own campus. We have partnered with a neighboring school district in the past and after completing the 2020-2021 school year we felt our students would be better served on their home campus. Being on their own campus will allow our students to be more involved in student activities and school events. We did receive a waiver in 2022-2023 in which we served less than 10 students and feel it was a success.

- B. List alternate strategies/plans which the district/site proposes, and how this plan will best serve the students of your district, i.e., a description of the educational benefits to the students, graduation rate if a waiver has been awarded prior to this year, and learning achievement.

We had very few of our co-op/alternative education students graduate in the past, coming in at less than 30%. In 2021-2022 we had a 75% graduation rate and in 2022-2023 67% graduation rate with students being on their own campus. Mustang Academy, our alternative education site, will be utilizing in-person instruction as well as an educational program - Edgenuity online program so that students will have flexibility to work online as well as in-person on a daily basis, at their own pace. Students will have a certified teacher in the classroom with them and will have access to an in-person teacher daily with area specific teachers on a scheduled basis. Students will be benchmarked and provided with online software to assist in specific areas of need.

- C. Have you participated in an alternative education coop previously? Have you been awarded this waiver before and what was the educational impact to the district: Results of the Statutory Waiver, i.e., effect on student performance levels, impact of plan on other sites in the district. We have co-oped in the past and served 2-3 students. We received a deregulation for each of the last two years 2021-2022 and 2022-2023. As mentioned above we have served more student since being on our own campus and better overall participation and graduation rates. We are looking to continue these numbers and build on them in the future. Our online program ties in with our benchmarking and this will better serve our students needs on their own campus, with access to teachers in their subject areas.

Mustang Academy will operate from 8:00 am- 1:20 pm daily and students will have full access to a full-time certified teacher in the classroom as well as scheduled time with other certified instructors, counselor, and guest speakers. Students will be able to attend life skills, counseling, arts, and other school activities on a daily basis as scheduled.

- E. Any financial impact to the District (positive or negative) for the proposed waiver/deregulation? If positive please describe where the available would be reallocated.

It would negatively affect the district if we were unable to have the funds to go towards the alternative education program. All allocations will be spent to support students through instructional needs.

- F. Describe method of assessment or evaluation of effectiveness of the plan both for staff and students, I.E., TLE, ACT scores, graduation rates, RSA, School Report Card, etc.

Mustang Academy and the Arkoma Public School District will use ACT scores, graduation rate, and NWEA benchmark scores to evaluate the effectiveness of Mustang Academy. Our graduation rate rose to 75% in 2021-2022 and was 67% in 2022-2023 classes as compared to less than 30% when on other campuses of other school districts. Teachers are evaluated using the TLE Model.

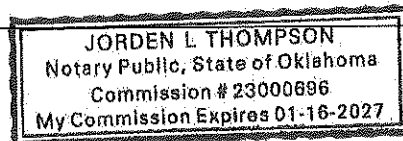



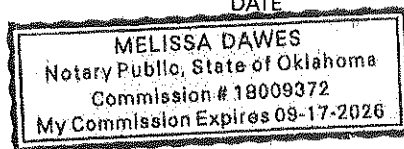

Monroe Public School is a Pre-K through 8th Grade Elementary School District. We have a 100% graduation rate and have never had a need for an alternative education program. If needed, we want to be proactive and have a program in place for the future.

An Alternative Ed Program at Monroe Public School would enable us to create a personalized educational experience for the student that is often not possible in another type of school setting. This type of program can offer smaller class sizes, which benefits the student in multiple ways. A smaller student-to-teacher ratio means more one-on-one interaction that helps a child build confidence. Therefore, the individual student is never forced to work to a set "class" pace.

- C. Educational impact to the district: Results of the Statutory Waiver, i.e., effect on student performance levels, and predicted graduation rate.

The Deregulation Waiver would benefit our school district for the next three years if approved. The reason for waiver is that many students travel 30-60 minutes, one way, to school on a bus or vehicle to school and would have to be bussed another 20-30 minutes to the nearest alternative educ. coop school. Parents and students understand the distance is too far to transport students who would lose important instruction time traveling and would not be able to participate in the local district's extra curricular, arts, organizations like FFA, FCCLA, career tech courses, etc., that students are able to take in an alternative education program in this district. Upon meeting with students, parents, and educators regarding a coop program, it is preferred that students participate in this district's program and activities to better serve at-risk students and prepare them for graduation.

- B. List alternate strategies/plans which the district/site proposes, and how this plan will best serve the students of your district, i.e., a description of the educational benefits to the students, graduation rate if a waiver has been awarded prior to this year, and learning achievement.

Our alt. educ. students can ride the bus to school without extended travel time and depending on schedules, are able to ride the bus home or with parents. Some who attend a technology center can ride the bus and return to our district for coursework and extracurricular programs like band, FFA, FACS, baseball, etc. This allows students to complete courses during regular school day schedule without extra transport time out-of-town and then return for other coursework and activities we offer to meet needs. Due to information shared by students and parents, this also allows students to graduate who may drop out as a result of having to transfer to another school for alternative education. Our alternative education program offers better educational benefit to students' graduation possibilities and familiar staff and programs that suit students' individual needs. We also have staff who collaborates well with our alt. ed. teacher, administration, counselors; this has great impact on student learning.

- C. Have you participated in an alternative education coop previously? Have you been awarded this waiver before and what was the educational impact to the district: Results of the Statutory Waiver, i.e., effect on student performance levels, impact of plan on other sites in the district. For several years, due to the reasons above, our district has continued to offer a stand alone program to a larger number of alternative education students, usually more than ten each year, and feel we greatly impact student learning. With this program, we also continue to experience low graduation dropout rates. This program strives to ensure that at-risk students are able to participate in extracurricular programs and graduate, who possibly would not graduate without our on-site alternative education program that helps meet their needs.

Haworth Academy allows students the options to not have to commute to another district or drop out. This waiver allows our students the best opportunity for success. As for financial - each student that remains in our school district allows the school to collect aid as part of allocation, having a positive impact on our school's finances and abilities to fund a program that is proven to be successful.

This causes a substantial amount of time during the AM & PM traveling and additional time added would be an extra strain on the students. Along with this, the nearest alternative education co-op is an additional 30 minutes away. Because of the distance that would be required to reach the needed destination, it would decrease the opportunity for education instruction and also remove the opportunity to participate in many extra-curricular activities that further allow the student to develop. With a local alternative education program, the extra-curricular options can still be a part of the overall structure of the students learning environment.

Perry Maroon Academy is applying for 70 O.S. 1210.568, because we were out of compliance for 3.5 days. To avoid being in that situation again, we are applying for the waiver. The nearest alternative education program is in Morrison, OK (13 miles). If the waiver were denied, and we had fewer than 10 students again, some students would begrudgingly go back to the high school, some would seek out Epic, online school, or homeschool alternatives, and some would drop out. One hundred percent of my students would benefit from the waiver being approved. I've worked very hard to make the program one of which the students can be proud and most like coming here and prefer coming to alternative education over attending the regular high school.

- B. List alternate strategies/plans which the district/site proposes, and how this plan will best serve the students of your district, i.e., a description of the educational benefits to the students, graduation rate if a waiver has been awarded prior to this year, and learning achievement.

Perry Maroon Academy usually has between 10-15 students. (I had one student move back to Nebraska on 11/1/22, one student withdraw on 11/29/22, and another student withdraw on 12/15/22. This left me with nine students for three and one half school days until winter break.)

Many of the students in Perry Maroon Academy have jobs. The additional time it takes to shuttle them would cut into time they could be working. Many students pick up and drop off younger siblings, cousins, and neices & nephews at daycare or school. Relocating the alternative education out of town would really effect some of these families.

The educational benefits to the students would be great. Many students have anxiety. They like the smaller class size and having one teacher all day. If the waiver were not approved, some of these students would attend an online school from home.

Have you been awarded this waiver before and what was the educational impact to the district: Results of the Statutory Waiver, i.e., effect on student performance levels, impact of plan on other sites in the district. Perry Maroon Academy has previously participated in a COOP with Frontier high school, but Perry was the host school.



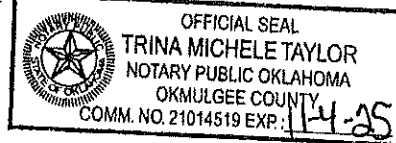

We lost our library media specialist last year. We have an employee that has her Masters degree in library media but has not obtained the certification through testing. Through this deregulation, we are able to have both this person with the degree in the library throughout the day. I see no other means will have to be employed unless this is denied. It should have no effects on the Alternative Ed due to us being in a Co-op already.

If denied, our district would have to find a certified librarian and that would cost us additional money.

Morris High School is requesting this waived due to the small number of at risk students we serve being far less than ten. The closest school offering a COOP is 28 miles away which places a hardship on traveling students. In the event that we are denied, we will run a local program but proficiency to standard will be greatly strain due to the small number of students being served.

- B. List alternate strategies/plans which the district/site proposes, and how this plan will best serve the students of your district, i.e., a description of the educational benefits to the students, graduation rate if a waiver has been awarded prior to this year, and learning achievement.

Our district partners with two external counseling agencies as well as maintaining three certified counselors on staff to ensure students have adequate emotional and behavioral supports. Additionally, Morris provides online and in person credit recovery opportunities. Allowing us to manage our students without the additional requirement placed on traditional alternative education program students will increase graduation rates for our at risk students.

- C. Have you participated in an alternative education coop previously? Have you been awarded this waiver before and what was the educational impact to the district: Results of the Statutory Waiver, i.e., effect on student performance levels, impact of plan on other sites in the district. Morris High School was in a COOP with Henryetta. This summer they decided they did not want to be in a coop any longer. We reached out to other nearby districts and found our closest neighboring districts also were not running COOPs. Additionally, we have been able to serve our students with other measures which has led to not sending enough students to our COOP in order to meet the minimum participation.

My take on Board Meeting

I am interested in what Mr. Walters is presenting in his Back to Basic Plan. Depending on what those detail, he did at least have some funding for teachers that attend Professional Development would be compensated if approved in the budget.

It is hard for me to believe that the numbers presented of Oklahoma Academic Outcomes of Proficient and Above are truly a reflection of what are happening in our schools. When I gave our ACT scores and College Remediation Rate to the board, those numbers don't correlate. It is hard to compare NAEP scores when every state does not test the same percentage of students which I have discovered in my research over the years. In my opinion, those numbers are skewed.

The budget portion is very interesting to me. Asking for \$47 million less when we have a healthy Rainy-Day Fund is puzzling to me. Personally, I would like to see more money appropriated for those teaching fields that are hard to fill, such as Special Education, Math, and Science instead of some of the initiatives Mr. Walters is pushing.

The public comments were a little shocking to me. From being in the trenches for 28 years, I don't believe the things Mr. Walters has accused public schools are happening. My assessment is that Mr. Walters uses his agenda to continue pushing School Choice, which will reduce resources for Public Schools.

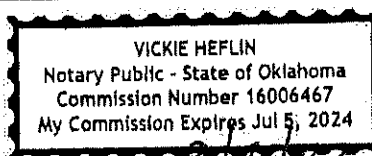

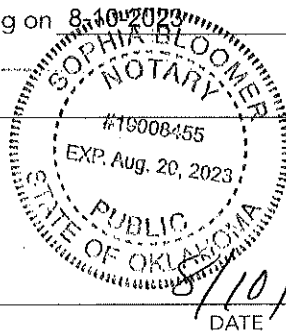

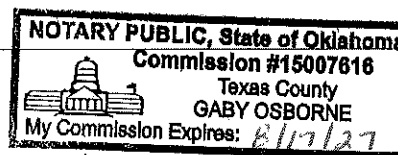

We currently have fewer than 10 students participating in our Alt. Ed. Program. These students are primarily credit recovery, but we do have a couple who are full-time participants.

Our Alt. Ed. Program is vital to our district, in order for our students to meet all their graduation requirements to achieve a Oklahoma High School Diploma. Our primary need is for credit recovery, we have a small population who need a full time program. We are the only school that services these full time students in a 20 mile radius. Being in a rural location, we feel strongly that being allowed to continue this program, regardless the few numbers, is what is best for our students and district.

- C. Have you participated in an alternative education coop previously? Have you been awarded this waiver before and what was the educational impact to the district: Results of the Statutory Waiver, i.e., effect on student performance levels, impact of plan on other sites in the district.

We have not participated in an Alt. Ed. coop previously. We have been awarded this waiver before. By allowing this waiver our district has the ability to provide our high school students the opportunity to complete their credit requirements on a timely basis and not to have to return as a 5th year senior, which we feel reduces the number of student drop-outs.

We have a certified teacher who monitors the students who attend our Alt Ed Program from 8:00am-12:22pm each day, Monday-Friday. We also have our other core teachers provide additional assistance for their subject areas if Mr. Husted is not able to assist with assignments.

If we are not able to have this program, we lose funding necessary to help pay the salary of our Alt Ed Teacher. 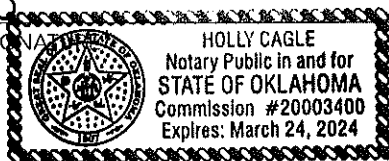


