FINANCIAL ACCOUNTING

Proposed Qualified Zone Academy Bond (QZAB) Allocations Approved

Nancy Hughes, Executive Director, Financial Accounting presented a \$260,000 request for Asher Public Schools to renovate the physical education gymnasium lighting, fire sprinkler system, safety pads under goals, repair bleachers and flooring.

Board member Baxter moved to approve the QZAB allocation request for Asher Public Schools. Board member Franks seconded the motion. The motion carried with the following votes: General Baxter, yes; Ms. Franks, yes; Mr. Keating, yes; Mr. Price, yes; and Superintendent Hofmeister, yes.

Withholding further payment of State Aid for Alexis Rainbow Charter School for failure to comply with Oklahoma Public School Audit Law Approved

Nancy Hughes reported the State Board of Education (SBE) December 18, 2014, authorized two holds on the charter school state funding due to noncompliance of the school district audit law, noncompliance of the State Department of Education (SDE) rules and regulations, Oklahoma State Law and Federal Guidance. Alexis Rainbow Arts Academy failed to provide a 2014 fiscal audit by the April 30 deadline pursuant Oklahoma Administrative Code 210:25-5-5. Title 70 O.S. § 22-112 required state aid funding be withheld for noncompliance until a district complied; and Title 70 O.S. § 103 requires schools district to provide an annual audit at the end of the fiscal year.

Ms. Hughes presented a request in accordance to the SBEs first hold of state funding to grant authority to Superintendent Hofmeister to release state funding to Alexis Rainbow Arts Academy provided the school submits the annual audit and all previously requested compliance documentation on or before June 30, 2015 at 4:30 p.m. Failure to provide required documentation at the required time will result in forfeiture of all 2015 state funding.

Board members discussed and asked questions pertaining to funding, responsible authorities and state law compliance.

Board member Baxter moved to approve granting authority to State Superintendent to release funds provided the audit is received by June 30. Board member Keating seconded the motion. The motion carried with the following votes: Mr. Price, yes; Mr. Keating, yes; Ms. Franks, yes; General Baxter, yes; and Superintendent Hofmeister, yes.

Updated status of the Alexis Rainbow Charter School after withholding of state funds for failure to comply with State Board of Education reporting requirements Approved

Nancy Hughes updated the second hold of state funds authorized by the SBE December 18, 2014. Ms. Alexis Rainbow has submitted partial records and information, however at this time has not satisfied the SBE request for compliance documentation.

Ms. Hughes presented a request to grant authority to Superintendent Hofmeister to release state funding to Alexis Rainbow Arts Academy provided all required documentation needed on or before June 30 which must include the 2014 annual audit. Failure to provide required documentation at the required time will result in forfeiture of all 2015 state funding.

Board member Baxter moved to approve the provision of state funds upon compliance with requirements as reported. Board member Price seconded the motion. The motion carried with the following votes: General Baxter, yes; Ms. Franks, yes; Mr. Keating, yes; Mr. Price, yes; and Superintendent Hofmeister, yes.

EDUCATOR EFFECTIVENESS AND POLICY

Amend list of alternate tests for Oklahoma ACE End-of-Instruction Exams to meet ACE graduation requirements Approved

Board member Baxter moved to amend the list of alternate tests for ACE graduation requirements. Board member Franks seconded the motion. The motion carried with the following votes: Mr. Price, yes; Mr. Keating, yes; Ms. Franks, yes; General Baxter, yes; and Superintendent Hofmeister, yes.

Legislative Update

Carolyn Thompson, Director, Government Affairs presented an update on 2015 legislation and reviewed statistics on bills introduced including education bills; rule requirements; and House Interim Studies affecting Common Education.

FY16 Education Budget Approved

Carolyn Thompson presented the proposed Oklahoma State Department of Education \$2,484,873,132 budget for Fiscal Year 2016.

Board members discussed and asked questions regarding funding purposes, FY15 appropriations, FY16 appropriations; and increases, decreases and explanations.

Board member Baxter moved to approve the proposed budget for the 2016 fiscal year. Board member Price seconded the motion. The motion carried with the following votes: Mr. Price, yes; Mr. Keating, yes; Ms. Franks, yes; General Baxter, yes; and Superintendent Hofmeister, yes.

ACADEMIC AFFAIRS and PLANNING

School Competitive Grants Pool Program Approved

Dr. Cindy Koss, Deputy Superintendent, Academic Affairs and Planning, presented a recommendation request to award approximately \$16 million for school competitive grants to 25 recipients.

Board members asked questions and discussed grant program process and grant results.

Gifted and Talented Education Annual Report for the 2014-2015 Academic Year

Dr. Koss presented the Gifted and Talented annual report for the 2014-2015 academic year of self-reported school district information that included enrollment data, identified gifted/talented students, gender/ethnicity/population and funding.

Board members asked questions and discussed awareness of the gifted and talented education and the state programs.

Focused Field of Study for a Pre-Engineering Academy at Chisholm Trail Technology Center, Kingfisher, County Approved

Dr. Koss presented a request for a pre-engineering academy focus field of study at Chisholm Trail Technology Center, Omega, Oklahoma in Kingfisher County. The career technology center has met all requirements for an academy focus field of study.

Board member Baxter moved to approve the pre-engineering academy focus field of study for Chisholm Trail Technology Center. Board member Franks seconded the motion.

Vertical alignment between grade bands are currently being worked on and impressive progress has been made. EngageOK conference participants will have opportunities to respond to a survey and provide feedback regarding the draft; and sessions will be provided during the conference.
