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CALL TO ORDER AND ROLL CALL

State Superintendent Joy Hofmeister called the State Board of Education regular meeting to order at 1:00 p.m. and welcomed everyone to the meeting. Ms. Cheadle called the roll and ascertained there was a quorum.

Information from the State Superintendent

Leadership Team addition

Superintendent Hofmeister introduced the newest member of the leadership team, Chief of Staff, Lt. Col. (Ret) Lance Nelson.

ESEA Reauthorization and Waiver

Superintendent Hofmeister said the Elementary and Secondary Education Act (ESEA) Flexibility Waiver renewal request will be submitted to the United States Department of Education (USDE) March 31, 2015. Dr. Cindy Koss, Deputy Superintendent, Academic Affairs and Planning, will present the updated ESEA renewal requirements and optional waivers.

Education Rally

FINANCIAL SERVICES

FY2015 General Fund Balance Penalties Approved

Renée McWaters, Executive Director, State Aid, presented waiver requests for seven (7) school districts for the second consecutive year which exceeded their general fund balance allowable amount for the 2013-14 school year ending June 30, 2014. Ms. McWaters said an exception to the waiver requirement would require a statutory change.

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Board member Ford moved to approve the seven (7) penalty waiver requests. Board member Shdeed seconded the motion.

Superintendent Hofmeister said in January the State Department of Education (SDE) requested the Legislature pass this part of the budget in order for the funds to be freed. At this time, we are waiting for an action by the Legislature. Superintendent Hofmeister concurred with Mr. Price's suggestion that the SDE advocate for a legislative change when a school district has a legitimate reason in the future.

Permit Tulsa Technology Center to offer AP Studio Art2-D Course for Fine Art Credit Approved

Dr. Koss provided the waiver requirements, process and the three principle designs to extend the flexibility for ESEA for an additional three (3) years for review.
