ALTERNATIVE EDUCATION ACADEMIES AND PROGRAMS

210:35-29-2. Definitions

The following words and terms, when used in this Subchapter, shall have the following meaning, unless the context clearly indicates otherwise.

"Alternative Education" means an educational process incorporating appropriate structure, curriculum, interaction, and reinforcement strategies to stimulate learning with students who have not utilized their capacity to do so within traditional educational settings.

"Abbreviated school day" means, for purposes of an alternative education program approved by the State Board of Education, a school day which consists of not less than four (4) hours and 12 minutes per day devoted to school activities for the locally approved 180-day school calendar.

STANDARD III

ADMINISTRATION AND ORGANIZATION

210:35-3-41. Statement of the standard

The school is organized to ensure the achievement of its goals. The working relationships among the local board, superintendent, principal, and staff are such as to facilitate the successful functioning of all phases of the school's program. The principal of the school has the autonomy and authority to provide the leadership needed to accomplish the goals of the school. The school is provided with sufficient professional and service personnel to ensure effective operation of all phases of the school's program. The school is organized in a manner that encourages new and innovative ideas designed to improve the program and to help the school adapt to changing conditions. (92)

210:35-3-46. Administrative and supervisory services

- (a) The school site shall be part of a system employing a full-time superintendent. No board of a school district having average daily membership (ADM) of fewer than 500 students shall be prohibited from allowing a superintendent with the appropriate certificate to serve simultaneously as a principal. [70 O.S. § 5-106] If a vacancy occurs in the superintendency during the course of the school year, a certified replacement must be employed within 45 school days.
- (b) It shall further be the responsibility of the local board, upon the recommendation of the superintendent, to employ an administrative head to be known as a principal for each of the schools within the district. Private schools shall employ a full-time principal/headmaster. An elementary district shall employ a full-time elementary superintendent. With the exception of requirements for certification, the term superintendent as used in these standards shall mean an elementary school superintendent, headmaster, or superintendent. Full-time is defined as employed full time, and therefore allows these administrators to teach.
- (c) Instructional leadership shall be the chief function of the school's principal. The principal shall be responsible for the improvement of instruction and be given the authority and resources needed to accomplish this goal. The principal shall help clarify the goals of the school, help obtain resources for it, coordinate its various activities, and promote its continuous evaluation to determine improvements needed.
- (d) Lines of administrative and supervisory authority between the central office staff and the principal shall be defined clearly and shall give the principal responsibility for initiating appropriate changes to meet the needs of the students.
- (e) The principal shall be involved in the selection, assessment, evaluation, retention, and promotion of all personnel assigned to the school.
 - (1) All certified administrative personnel designated by a local board to conduct evaluations shall be required to participate in training conducted by the State Department of Education prior to evaluating. [70 O.S. § 6-101,10]
 - (2) No teacher shall be dismissed during the term of a contract or refused reemployment except at an official meeting of the board of education. The reemployment or

dismissal of teachers shall be in accordance with the school laws of Oklahoma. [70 0.5. § 6-101.20 through 101.30]

- (f) While working with faculty, staff, or students in the school, central office and other supplementary personnel shall coordinate their activities through the principal.
- (g) The principal shall have the responsibility and the authority for the administration of the non-instructional programs in the school.
- (h) The local board shall adopt a school calendar and school day consistent with statutory requirements in Oklahoma.

(1) The standard school year shall consist of not less than 180 days; or,

- (2) For not less than one thousand eighty (1080) hours each school year, if a district board of education adopts a school-hours policy and notifies the State Board of Education prior to September 15 of the applicable school year.
- (3) Not more than thirty (30) hours each school year may be used for attendance of professional meetings and teachers may be paid for a length of term in excess thereof, under conditions hereinafter outlined. Subject to district board of education policy or collective bargaining agreement, additional professional leave days may be granted for individual teachers to attend or participate in professional meetings, staff development training, or National Board certification portfolio development as provided for in Section 6-204,2 of this title, [70 0,\$.\$ 1-109]

(4) The standard school day shall consist of not less than 6 hours devoted to school activities, exclusive of lunch, with the exception of nursery, early childhood education kindergarten, and alternative education. [70 0.8, § 1-111]

(5) The early childhood school day shall consist of not less than two and one-half hours per session.

- (6)The kindergarten school day shall consist of not less than two and one-half hours per day. The requirement to attend kindergarten may be satisfied by attendance in either a half-day or full-day program. Membership in a kindergarten for either two and one-half (2 1/2) hours or six (6) hours per school day shall be counted as one (1) day for average daily membership purposes. Beginning with the 2011-2012 school year, it shall be the duty of every school district in this state to provide and offer a full six-hour day of kindergarten free of tuition for every child residing in the district who attains the age of five (5) years on or before the first day of September during the school year kindergarten is affered, provided that this duty may be satisfied by intra-district transfer to a school offering full-day kindergarten, by transferring kindergarten children to other school districts which will accept them and can provide kindergarten for such children, or by contracting for classroom space with a licensed public or licensed private child care provider based on the selection criteria established by the district. [70 0.5; § 18-108]
- (7). A school district board of education may adopt and implement an extended day schedule for grades nine through twelve. All of the following conditions must be met:
 - (A) The annual number of hours of instruction must equal or exceed 1,080 hours which is equivalent to 180 days of instruction.
 - (B) Only one day per week shall consist of not less than five hours of academic instruction in a regular classroom setting.

- (C) The district must hold a public hearing prior to the adoption of an extended day schedule.
- (D) The district must document the impact on student achievement as determined by the academic performance index score and any other relevant factors that are a result of the implementation of an extended day schedule.
- (E) The district must provide an annual report to the State Board of Education on the result of the extended day schedule and the impact on student achievement. [70 O.S. § 1-109]
- (i) If, because of emergency situations, school has been missed more than fifteen (15) days, the State Board of Education will consider forgiving a portion of those days or in rare instances all days missed, on a case-by-case basis. Exceptions to the fifteen (15) day minimum will be made at the recommendation of the State Superintendent and forgiveness will be considered by the State Board of Education on a case-by-case basis.
- (j) If a school district determines that it is necessary to deviate from the required 6-hour school day because of severe weather conditions or fire, the superintendent should report this, in writing, to the State Department of Education, Accreditation Section, within 72 hours. Any loss of school time shall require the superintendent to report the amount of time lost and the procedures to be used to make up the lost time.
- (k) Schools shall obtain permission from the State Board of Education before conducting Saturday classes to complete a standard school term including professional days. [70 0.5, § 1-112]

210:10-1-4. Length of term

(a) The minimum length of term will be ten (10) months (180 days actually taught). Provided not to exceed five (5) days of 180 days required may be used for attendance of professional meetings. Where professional days are taken, they shall be so recorded in the register of attendance in a like manner as holidays are recorded. The legal aggregate days attendance will be divided by days actually taught to obtain the legal average daily attendance. Any school district holding less than a full term will have its state aid reduced proportionately. No district may have less than a full term of school unless conditions over which it has no control exist that would prevent the district holding a full term. In cases where sites within a district have different length terms the average daily membership (ADM) and average daily attendance (ADA) shall be calculated for each site separately.

210:35-3-47. School reports and records

Well delineated policies and procedures for records and reports shall be developed and kept current.

 - (A) Administrative operations
 - (B) Cürriculum
 - (C) Guidance
 - (D) Health services

The reason for the deregulation of the next three school years is that alternative education is condensed to no less that 4 hours and 20 minutes. Students will also have 19 virtual Fridays throughout the year for virtual instruction at home for 4 hours and 20 minutes.

B. List alternate strategies/plans which the district/site proposes, and how this plan will best serve the students of your alternative education program, i.e., a description of the educational benefits to the students, graduation rate if a waiver has been awarded prior to this year, and the result of the previous years alternative education audit.

All potential candidates must through the review process committee to determine the need for alternative education placement. The committee consists of the principal, counselor, and alternative education teacher. This program is in place to assist the educational needs and success of students that are academically deprived, a teen parent, a student lacking social skills adequate to participate in the regular classroom, physically handicapped or any other reason deemed legitimate by the committee. The students attend during the evenings and are able to go to a job or stay home to take care of his/her child during the day. The class sizes are small and conducive to at-risk students, flexible scheduling, goal-setting, service learning opportunities, and assistance with higher education or work. The counselor and special education teacher are both available to students during alt ed hours.

C. Educational impact to the district: Results of the Statutory Waiver, i.e., effect on student performance levels, and predicted graduation rate.

The alternative education program assists those students who are at high risk in successfully graduating high school on time by accommodating needs that may be present and cannot be met during the regular school day program.

A. Reason for the waiver/deregulation request (be specific).

70 O.S. § 1210.568 OAC 210:35-29-2

B. List alternate strategies/plans which the district/site proposes, and how this plan will best serve the students of your district, i.e., a description of the educational benefits to the students and learning achievement.

The Prague District proposes to have an alternative school that will run from 8:00am to 12:15pm Monday-Thursday. The strategies include offering the alternative students in grades 6-12 as well as to dropouts up to the age of twenty-one. The school will have a maximum of fiteen students. This Structure will best serve the students by providing a shortened day. The shortened day benefits students in many ways, but especially helps those students who need to work to help their families meet financial obligations. It also helps parenting students who need to be with their young children and cannot handle the burden of financing or finding child care. The shortened day format proves to have educational benefits of helping students stay in school because they can handle 4 hours and 15 minutes of a school day much easier than a longer day.

C. Educational impact to the district: Results of the Statutory Waiver/Deregulation, i.e., effect on student performance levels, impact of plan on other sites in the district.

Education impact to the district: The alternative structure accomplishes strong student performances with a group which normally does not have strong performance in traditional school. It provides individualized education because of the smaller class size of fifteen which gives each student a chance to work on deficiencies with a teacher who can help them more ofter than the teacher might in a larger classroom. Thus, they can master their deficiencies and move on to the next lesson without getting left behind due to not understanding the content. Students mastering deficiencies means they better equipped to pass classroom test and state test that may be mandated. Having a smaller class size also helps with student-teacher communication. This tends to help with the student's self esteem and academic achievement.

The impact the plan has on other sites is that the regular classrooms have less discipline and academic problems because some of the students have a variety of problems are moved to the alternative school which improves the atmosphere and discipline in the traditional school.

A waiver/deregulation can be granted for up to 3 years. (Please see instructions for additional requirements)

The alternative school operates from 8:00am to 12:15pm Monday-Thursday. The school will follow the same calender as the LEA which is Prague Schools. It will have the same beginning and ending day, as well as all of the same breaks and holidays. Students are able to earn units of credits at a slightly higher rate than day school students. Some students graduate in three and one half years, or even quicker, depending on how hard the student work and if they choose to be on performance based contracts. The alternative school teachers also participate in parent-teacher conferences on the same schedule as Prague Schools.

E. Any financial impact to the District (positive or negative) for the proposed waiver/deregulation.

Without the deregluation, Prague Schools would not be able to offer the alternative school to those students that are not able to attend traditional school. Those students would choose to dropout or continue their education elsewhere. This would cause the school to lose thousands of dollars in funding. By providing this program during the times we have chosen, we are able to use highly qualified teachers that are already employed by the school.

F. Describe method of assessment or evaluation of effectiveness of the plan.

Individual teachers evaluate students at least weekly and document at least two grades per week. Students may repeat assignments and tests until they prove competency and then they can move on to the next level or academic area. Students are tested at the end of each 9 week period and grades are evaluated with interventions as necessary. At the end of each semester, the transcript is used to see if individual performance has improved by moving any "F" to a passing grade. The GPA is also recorded and compared to the beginning GPA to make sure improvements are made. Any state mandated tests are given and students are expected to perform at an acceptable level just like traditional students. All tests given are a good assessment of effectiveness of the program. If a student doesn't show academic improvement and competency, the teachers, principal, and counselor meet with the parents and student to see what changes need to be made with everyday strategies and the graduation plan.

To Whom It May Concern:

The purpose of this letter is to explain our request for deregulation of the Prague Schools Alternative School Program.

Deregulation of the school is necessary because hiring certified teachers to teach students after school hours will be a financial burden on the school.

Using facilities after school hours costs the school more money in utilities. Physical education facilities are also not available after school due to practices and games.

Funding also makes it a necessity to teach the school on a shortened day and week as the school operates on a budget under \$40,000 and it would not be possible to meet all financial needs if the school were not deregulated.

Students of the school benefit because many must work afternoons and evenings to help support their children or help their parents with support. Students being able to attend school on a shortened schedule will make it easier to find babysitting options for those with children.

For all the above reasons, I ask for deregulation of the alternative school.

A. Reason for the Deregulation request. Please include how your students would benefit from this deregulation, what alternative means will have to be employed, and negative effects on your alternative education population if your waiver was to be denied.

My students will benefit from this deregulation to they can work more hours to contribute to family finances. Only attending in the afternoon allows students with small children to attend school more easily. For students attending morning vo-tech, it allows them time to more easily complete their credits. Students in the juvenile justice system have the morning hours to schedule appointments with probation officers or other court-ordered services.

If the waiver is denied, none of these students would be able to go to the traditional high school and would not graduate.

B. List alternate strategies/plans which the district/site proposes, and how this plan will best serve the students of your alternative education program, i.e., a description of the educational benefits to the students, graduation rate if a waiver has been awarded prior to this year, and the result of the previous years alternative education audit.

The Okemah Alternative Academy meets five days per week for four hours per day. Each student is enrolled in six classes per semester, but he/she can accelerate. The curriculum is competency-based, and students have to pass with 80% mastery. Students are also required to be gainfully employed for a minimum of ten hours per week or attend vo-tech for three hours per day. Students may combine work, vo-tech, volunteering, and community service to attain this. Students work on core and elective courses as needed to complete 23 credits for graduation. Our program helps to recover students who have dropped out. A shortened day of four hours, five days per week will better meet the needs of our students and help them serve our community more efficiently.

We received a rating of "Effective" from last year's audit.

C. Educational impact to the district: Results of the Statutory Waiver, i.e., effect on student performance levels, and predicted graduation rate.

All of this year's students are at-risk for not graduating in the traditional manner. Since students have choices of subjects to work on, either through the Acellus computerized format or by using text books, they see academic achievement. Students who choose to accelerate can graduate early. In this way, graduation rates are improved.

Currently, state allocated money is not sufficient for staff salaries for alternative education teachers. Occasionally there may be a need for additional textbooks, supplies, field trips, and extra funding may be needed.

These students increase our Average Daily Attendance monies, which, in part, may be used to round out salaries and other expenses.

F. Describe method of assessment or evaluation of effectiveness of the plan both for staff and students, I.E., TLE, ACT scores, graduation rates, RSA, School Report Card, etc.



We have been very successful with this system for well over twenty years. It provides students with special circumstances an opportunity to complete their high school education and future goals. Our system works with students as the focal point. Having a system such as this allows our students the flexibility to work around any negative situations they are experiencing. The alternative means employed, will consist of a shortened school day and four days a week. If this waiver was denied it would place many students in the position of having to choose between completing their education and meeting the demands of their unique situations.

List alternate strategies/plans which the district/site proposes, and how this plan will best serve the students of your alternative education program, i.e., a description of the educational benefits to the students, graduation rate if a waiver has been awarded prior to this year, and the result of the previous years alternative education audit. A, Students of the Choctaw Alternative Transitional School attend core classes

Monday-Thursday from 3:40-8:05.

B. All students must have a day component as well. This can consist of attending the Eastern Oklahoma County Technology Center, Concurrent Enrollment, Community Service Learning or Worksite Learning. Student completing the Worksite Learning option must meet the following. 1. Be employed at an approved work-site location. 2. Work at least 10 hours per week.

3. The employer must agree to a monthly evaluation of the student and agree for the Director to visit on the job site or communicate by phone in regard to the students work performance.

Implementing these strategies has proven very successful since the implementation of the program resulting in increase student success.

C. Educational impact to the district: Results of the Statutory Waiver, i.e., effect on student performance levels, and predicted graduation rate. Approval of this waiver will mean that we will be able to continue this proven method of delivery. This will benefit the district as it has year after year by improving graduation rates and most importantly student success.

 - 1. Evaluation of student performance is completed continuously. Students are encouraged to complete at least four credits per block, however, most exceed this minimum.
 - 2. State testing and ACT results are analyzed and used for improvment and evaluation of the plan.
 - 3. All instructional staff are evaluated using the TLE method.
 - 4. The Director is evaluated by the superintendent yearly.
 - 5. The entire program is evaluated by the state department every two years. The main factor in evaluation of effectiveness is the number of students that graduate yearly. This number has remained strong under this current plan.

Transportion too and from a distant school is not ideal or within our students best interest which could cause increase of student drop-out and distance of connection with community and their peers.

 - 1. Increase attendance for students by reducing the number of hours required.

 - 3. Allows students who are in service learning or careers more hours in which to complete credit requirements.
 - 4. Allows students to work within their communities through service learning projects. This increases visibility of the program.
 - 5. Students enrolled in program are best served by our student-teacher ratios due to their "at-risk" status. These students are at greater risk of not completing high school if placed in traditional school setting or placed in a COOP program that is not located within their own town.

We have not participated in an alternative education COOP in many years. We have been awarded this waiver for seveal years and the educational imapact to our district has resulted in student achievement, student graduation, student career guidance, positive social interactions, counseling servies for students, student enrichement and connection with community. We expect our students to complete the desired number of credits in a timely fashion while enrolled in the alternative education program. Students will receive individual and group counseling, life-skills guidance and trainings, participate in the arts and other extra-curricular activies.

Our district will be negatively impacted if these students drop out of school or if they are forced to attend the traditional school setting or a COOP that is not located in or near our town. Funds would be reallocated to pay our Alternative Eduacation teachers and director and to supplement the cost of our curriculum. We will also use the funds to pay everyday costs to run the program.

F. Describe method of assessment or evaluation of effectiveness of the plan both for staff and students, I.E., TLE, ACT scores, graduation rates, RSA, School Report Card, etc.

Students will be constantly monitored to ensure adequate progression in their classes in order to meet all graduation requirements. We will also monitor attendance, participation in counseling groups and in life skills training. Students and parents will complete surveys througout the school year in order to ensure they are staying on track and to offer feedback to improve the program.

- A. Reason for the Deregulation request. Please include how your students would benefit from this deregulation, what alternative means will have to be employed, and negative effects on your alternative education population if your waiver was to be denied.
 Perry Alternative Education (Maroon Academy) is applying for OAC 20: 35-29-2. School will be held Monday through Thursday from 8:15am 1:30pm. We are offering this flexible schedule, so our students may obtain employment during the afternoon and evening hours or care for their children. An abbreviated school day is a day which consists of fewer than four hours per day devoted to school and activities and follows the Perry Public Schools locally approved 180 calendar. The classes will be supervised by a teacher certified in English and public school administration. Students will have access to the Child Nutrition Program, Meridian Technology Center, and all school activities (band, pep assemblies, athletics, etc.
- B. List alternate strategies/plans which the district/site proposes, and how this plan will best serve the students of your alternative education program, i.e., a description of the educational benefits to the students, graduation rate if a waiver has been awarded prior to this year, and the result of the previous years alternative education audit.
 Perry Maroon Academy will use several types of instruction and materials (Edgenuity- computer based delivery, programs (yoga, martial arts, life skills, art, etc.), counseling, guest speakers, Meridian Technology Center, and career exploration opportunities. Our plans are to provide a quality education that allows opportunities to accomplish the goal of high school completion for "at risk" students. We want to help "at risk" students who may not thrive in a traditional setting. The benefit is for all students to graduate high school on time with their class and pass any standardized testing.

C. Educational impact to the district: Results of the Statutory Waiver, i.e., effect on student performance levels, and predicted graduation rate.

The educational impact has been very successful in that we have a good percentage of our students pass standardized tests and eventually graduate.

Deregulation allows "at risk" students the potential of being successful who might not otherwise be successful.

 Perry Maroon Academy students will follow the Perry Public Schools calendar.
 Perry Maroon Academy instructors will observe the professional days set aside by the district. Perry Maroon Academy will begin on August 12, 2021 and end on May 12, 2022. School will begin at 8:15am and end at 1:30pm. Breakfast and lunch will be offered. School will be in session Monday through Thursday. The instructional day will be 4 hours and 25 minutes.
- E. Any financial impact to the District (positive or negative) for the proposed waiver/deregulation? If positive please describe where the available would be reallocated. The financial impact to the school is the number of students we reach and graduate. Prior to Covid-19, Perry Maroon Academy had very good attendance. These are students who might not have been counted on our ADM. This program has been very successful in the number of students who have graduated who otherwise would not be in school. Perry Public Schools exeeds the amount of money sent from the state for alternative education. The bulk of the money goes toward staff and supplies.
- F. Describe method of assessment or evaluation of effectiveness of the plan both for staff and students, I.E., TLE, ACT scores, graduation rates, RSA, School Report Card, etc.

 The teacher will monitor student progress by assessments of participation, attendance, projects, etc. Progress reports are emailed or mailed home. Phone calls are also made to parents / guardians for more effective communication.

 State Department of Education guidelines are followed, the old OTAC handbook is still referenced, and standardized testing is another component of assessment/ evaluation.





A. Reason for the Deregulation request. Please include how your students would benefit from this deregulation, what alternative means will have to be employed, and negative effects on your alternative education population if your waiver was to be denied.
Our Alternative Education Academy serves 8-15 students each year. These students, for various reasons, have struggled to perform in the regular academic setting. We have used a four day week since we established our Alternative Academy. This schedule has allowed our students to attend and take care of their academic needs while also being able to take care of other needs in their lives.

Hominy Public School's regular schedule is also on a 4 day week schedule.

B. List alternate strategies/plans which the district/site proposes, and how this plan will best serve the students of your alternative education program, i.e., a description of the educational benefits to the students, graduation rate if a waiver has been awarded prior to this year, and the result of the previous years alternative education audit.

Hominy Alternative Academy will provide an educational process to incorporate strategies to stimulate the learning process to those students who have not utilized their potential within the traditional educational setting. The strategies include: (1) individualized instructional programs in grades 6-12, that will help them meet the academic standards required, both at the local and state levels to complete graduation requirements; (2) to provide both individual and group counseling sessions to help them deal with everyday and personal stresses, rather than dropping out of school.; (3) to provide an environment with more flexibility in program scheduling to better meet the student's needs.

C. Educational impact to the district: Results of the Statutory Waiver, i.e., effect on student performance levels, and predicted graduation rate.

The Hominy alternative Academy allows our students who have problems succeeding in the regular educational environment to attain their high school diploma. It benefits our regular education classrooms because those students who have trouble succeeding have a place to go rather than distracting other students or taking time away from the regualr classroom routine.

Our Alternative Education Academy will run from 2:00 pm to 6:15 pm Tuesday thru Friday. Our classes will begin on August 19, 2021, thru May 20, 2022.

If our proposed waiver/deregualtion is not approved it will have a negative financial impact on our school. Without the approval of this waiver I do not believe some of these students will finish school. The reduction in our enrollment would have a significant financial impact on our district.

Continued evaluation of the program shall be made by the Hominy board of Education, Superintendent of Schools, the High School Principal and the Alternative Educational Instructor. Evaluation will be an on-going process thoughout the school year, with the primary focus being the positive effect it has on our students academically. As required, a self evaluation of the program will be submitted at the close of each school year.
