SUBJECT: Statutory Waiver Concerning Cooperative Agreements for Alternative Education

The following schools are requesting a statutory waiver of 70 O.S. 1210.568, which requires them to enter into a cooperative agreement with another school district if enrollment in their alternative education program is less than ten (10) students. Approval is recommended.

#### Section 915. Alternative Education Programs - Statewide System.

- A. Beginning with the first semester of the 1996-1997 school year, the State Board of Education shall implement a statewide system of alternative education programs which shall be phased-in within seven (7) years. The statewide system shall include but not be limited to Alternative Approaches grant programs, funded pursuant to Section 1210.561 of this title, and alternative academies or alternative programs implemented pursuant to this section.
- B. Beginning with the first semester of the 2002-2003 school year, all school districts of this state shall provide alternative education programs that conform to the requirements of statutes and rules applicable to alternative education. A program shall:
  - 1. Allow class sizes and student/teacher ratios which are conducive to effective learning for at-risk students;
  - 2. Incorporate appropriate structure, curriculum, and interaction and reinforcement strategies designed to provide effective instruction;
  - 3. Include an intake and screening process to determine eligibility of students;
  - 4. Demonstrate that teaching faculty are appropriately licensed or certified teachers;
  - 5. Demonstrate that teaching faculty have been selected on the basis of a record of successful work with atrisk students or personal and educational factors that qualify them for work with at-risk students;
  - 6. Reflect appropriate collaborative efforts with state agencies and local agencies serving youth;
  - 7. Provide courses that meet the academic curricula standards adopted by the State Board of Education and additional remedial courses;
  - 8. Offer individualized instruction;
  - 9. State clear and measurable program goals and objectives;
  - 10. Include counseling and social services components with the provision that providers of services are not required to be certified as school counselors;
  - 11. Require a plan leading to graduation be developed for each student in the program which will allow the student to participate in graduation exercises for the school district after meeting the requirements of the school district as specified in the individual graduation plan for that student; provided, for students who enter the ninth grade in or prior to the 2007-08 school year, the plan shall specifically address whether the student is required to meet the graduation requirements established in Section 11-103.6 of this title;
  - 12. Offer life skills instruction;
  - 13. Provide opportunities for arts education to students, including Artists in Residence programs coordinated with the Oklahoma Arts Council;
  - 14. Provide a proposed annual budget;
  - 15. Include an evaluation component including an annual written self-evaluation;
  - 16. Be appropriately designed to serve middle school, junior high school and secondary school students in grades six through twelve who are most at risk of not completing a high school education for a reason other than that identified in Section 13-101 of this title; and
  - 17. Allow students in the alternative education program, who otherwise meet all of the participation requirements, to participate in vocational programs and extracurricular activities, including but not limited to athletics, band, and clubs.
- C. The alternative education program of a school district shall be operational and serving students by September 15 of each school year.
- D. Each alternative education program of a school district shall receive funding based on the combined number of dropouts and students within the district who have been referred to a county juvenile service unit, a county juvenile bureau or who have been committed to the custody of the Office of Juvenile Affairs. Each alternative education program shall receive incentive funding as follows:
  - 1. For the first year of operation, One Thousand Dollars (\$1,000.00) per student;

- 2. For the second year of operation, Seven Hundred Fifty Dollars (\$750.00) per student; and
- 3. For the third year of operation and each year thereafter, Seven Hundred Dollars (\$700.00) per student.

Statewide alternative education funding shall not be used to supplant existing school district resources or to support programs that do not meet all the criteria for the statewide alternative education system. No alternative education program shall receive less than a total of Ten Thousand Dollars (\$10,000.00) per school year.

- E. By September 15 of each school year, all statewide alternative education funds received and expended for students participating in an alternative education program shall be reported to the State Department of Education by major object codes and by program classifications pursuant to the Oklahoma Cost Accounting System as adopted by the State Board of Education pursuant to Section 5-135 of this title.
- F. Elementary school districts, as defined in Section 5-103 of this title, may request a waiver from the State Board of Education from the requirements of this section to implement and provide an alternative education program. Any elementary school district that has not received funding pursuant to the provisions of subsection D of this section shall be automatically granted a waiver. If a school district is granted a waiver, no statewide alternative education funding shall be allocated to the district.
- G. 1. The State Board of Education shall contract for technical assistance for operation of an Alternative Education Technical Assistance Center. The technical assistance provider shall be an entity located in Oklahoma that has been officially recognized by the United States Department of Education to assess and facilitate dissemination of validated educational programs in Oklahoma. The technical assistance provider shall have priority, if its operations are deemed satisfactory by the State Board of Education and if funds are available, for annual renewal of the contract.
  - 2. The duties of the technical assistance provider shall include, but shall not be limited to:
    - a. providing initial and ongoing training of personnel who will educate at-risk populations through alternative education programs,
    - b. providing technical assistance to school districts to enhance the probability of success of their alternative education programs,
    - c. evaluating state-funded alternative education programs,
    - d. reporting to the State Board of Education the evaluation results of state-funded alternative education programs, and
    - e. providing in-depth program analysis and evaluation of state-funded alternative education programs.
  - 3. The State Board of Education shall not provide funding to an alternative education program that does not receive a recommendation for continued funding in the evaluation provided for in this subsection. Provided, any school district not receiving such a recommendation for continued funding may request a hearing before the Board with a review of the evaluation prior to the Board's final determination.
- H. All alternative education programs shall be subject to statutes and rules applicable to alternative education, including any exemptions from statutory or regulatory requirements authorized by statutes or rule.
- I. An alternative education program may be offered by an individual school district or may be offered jointly by school districts that have formed interlocal cooperative agreements pursuant to Section 5-117b of this title. Any school district submitting a plan for an alternative education program serving fewer than ten students shall enter into a cooperative agreement with another school district to jointly provide the program unless the program has been granted a waiver from this requirement by the State Board of Education.

- J. Any materials or equipment purchased by a school district with revenue received for students participating in an alternative education program shall be used only in or directly for the alternative education program offered by the district or any subsequent alternative education program offered to students enrolled in that district. Such materials and equipment shall be made available exclusively to alternative education students during the hours that the alternative education program is operating; provided, the material or equipment may be used for other purposes when the alternative education program is not operating.
- K. Upon implementation of this subsection as provided for in subsection M of this section and contingent upon the provision of appropriated funds designated for such purpose, all school districts in the state providing alternative education programs as required in subsection B of this section shall expand the programs to include middle-school-grade students. The program shall conform to the requirements of subsection B of this section.
- L. Upon implementation of this subsection as provided for in subsection M of this section and contingent upon the provision of appropriated funds designated for such purpose, each urban school district identified by the State Department of Education as having a high population of elementary grade students who are at-risk and in need of alternative education shall provide elementary level alternative education programs. The State Department of Education shall establish requirements for the programs. For purposes of this section, "urban school district" means a school district with an average daily membership of thirty thousand (30,000) or more.
- M. Implementation of subsections K and L of this section shall be delayed until the current expenditure per pupil in average daily attendance in public elementary and secondary schools in unadjusted dollars for the 1998-99 school year or any school year thereafter for Oklahoma, as reported by the National Center for Education Statistics annually in the Digest of Education Statistics, reaches at least ninety percent (90%) of the regional average expenditure for that same year, and funds are provided. For purposes of this subsection, the regional average expenditure shall consist of the current expenditure per pupil in average daily attendance in public elementary and secondary schools in unadjusted dollars for each of the following states: Arkansas, Colorado, Kansas, Missouri, New Mexico, Oklahoma, and Texas, averaged together. By January 1 of each year, the State Board of Education shall report whether or not the ninety-percent expenditure level has been reached based on information reported annually in the Digest of Education Statistics by the National Center for Education Statistics. Subsections K and L of this section shall be implemented on July 1 after the first January 1 report verifies that the ninety-percent expenditure level has been reached and funds have been provided for the specific purposes of this section. - A. Reason for the Waiver request.   - The closest site with an alternative education program is Alva and that is approximately 20 miles from our district. We are requesting this waiver so that we may serve our students with local resources. Less than 10% of our students are needing alternative ed pathways currently and we wish to keep them on site to allow for a blended program.

B. List alternate strategies/plans which the district/site proposes, and how this plan will best serve the students of your district, i.e., a description of the educational benefits to the students, graduation rate if a waiver has been awarded prior to this year, and learning achievement. We believe we can best serve our students through smaller class sizes and provide support with teachers and staff that are familiar with our students individual needs. We also have available LPC's for social emotional supports on site twice a week for our program along with offering extracurricular activities for all studnets. It is our goal to graduate 100% of our students and establishing this program within our district will allow us to acheive this.

C. Have you participated in an alternative education coop previously? Have you been awarded this waiver before and what was the educational impact to the district: Results of the Statutory Waiver, i.e., effect on student performance levels, impact of plan on other sites in the district. We have not recently paricipated in a coop. We have been given this waiver in previous years and it allowed us to serve our students localy and better serve the individual needs of those students. We have been success with this program serving the number of students we serve.

A. Reason for the Waiver request. Please include distance from your alternative education site to the closest possible district to coop with, what alternative means will have to be employed if your waiver was to be denied, and what percentage of your student population will benefit from the waiver if approved.

Beaver schools was part of the Alternative Education COOP in Hooker that dissolved. In lieu of Hooker serving as the LEA of this COOP, we have elected to start the Duster Learning Academy at our local school district. We are a high school of approximately 80 students, so having 5 students enrolled in the academy will service approximately 6% of our students.

B. List alternate strategies/plans which the district/site proposes, and how this plan will best serve the students of your district, i.e., a description of the educational benefits to the students, graduation rate if a waiver has been awarded prior to this year, and learning achievement.

The district plan includes:

- 1. Shortened/more flexible hours in the school building
- 2. More individualized instruction through smaller class size
- 3. Online/Individualized curriculum facilitating distance learning when needed
- 4. Individualized instruction based on student progress
- Life skills instruction to help students transition to the "adult" world after high school
- 6. Continued opportunities to participate in extra-curricular activities such as band, choir, CareerTech courses (FFA, BPA, FCCLA), and athletics
- C. Have you participated in an alternative education coop previously? Have you been awarded this waiver before and what was the educational impact to the district: Results of the Statutory Waiver, i.e., effect on student performance levels, impact of plan on other sites in the district. Previously, Beaver Public Schools participated in an alternative education program that was off-site. The LEA for the coop was Hooker Public Schools. Beaver has brought the alternative education services back on campus to better serve the needs of the students qualified to participate in the Duster Learning Academy.

  - 1. Duster Learning Academy is in session for the same days as Beaver Public Schools. Please see attached school calendar.
  - 2. Students in Duster Learning Academy attend from 8:00-12:20 every day. If needed, the schedule may be adjusted to best serve the needs of the individual student.
  - 3. Please find the application to attend Duster Learning Academy attached
  - 4. Academic assessments will be completed through the same means as Beaver High School (state assessments, ACT, benchmark exams)
- E. Any financial impact to the District (positive or negative) for the proposed waiver/deregulation? If positive please describe where the available would be reallocated.

For the 2021-2022, Beaver Public Schools does not qualify for any additional revenue for alternative education services. Any positive impact from the Duster Learning Academy would be in the form of student retention.

- F. Describe method of assessment or evaluation of effectiveness of the plan both for staff and students, I.E., TLE, ACT scores, graduation rates, RSA, School Report Card, etc.
  - 1. Teachers will be evaluated through the TLE model using the OkTLE website.
  - 2. Graduation and retention rates will be used to assess the effectiveness of the program as a whole.
  - 3. Student progress will be assessed through benchmark tests when available, ACT scores, state mandated tests, and assessments given through the online curriculum provided through Edgenuity.

The options for the existing state graduation requirements and new college preparatory curriculum requirements are attached. Successful completion of either curriculum will result in accomplishment of a standard diploma.

Choosing the courses a student takes in high school is an important decision for you and your child. With your input, courses chosen for a student's career pathway can give him or her a head start on career and education success. A college preparatory curriculum is challenging and may help determine a student's future success in higher education and the world of work. Students who take a college preparatory curriculum designed to prepare them for both college and career have more opportunities. In addition, high school students who enroll in a career pathway at a technology center and meet eligibility requirements have the opportunity to earn college credit while in high school. This opportunity has been made possible through a new Cooperative Alliance between the State Regents for Higher Education and the Oklahoma Department of *Career*Tech.

By signing this contract, I agree to abide by all the rules and regulations of Beaver Schools and understand that I may lose MY PRIVILEGE to attend for violation of these rules. I understand my enrollment at BDLA may be immediately terminated for violation(s) of any of the following rules:

- 1) Disruption: a student shall not by use of violence, force, threatening, or any other means cause disruption to any students, faculty, or school property.
- 2) Insubordination and Disrespect: a student shall not disregard or refuse to comply with reasonable requests of school employees or directions given by the teacher or school official. REFUSAL TO WORK will result in dismissal from the program. Examples of refusal to work include but are not limited to: sleeping in class, texting, being on websites other than Odysseyware, being on a different subject area than that assigned by the instructor, or refusal to login and work on the computer. The THIRD time an instructor reports a student for refusal to work, he/she will be dismissed from the program. Students are to remain ONLY on the Odysseyware website unless doing research or course work assigned by the instructor. This includes staying off other websites and the games on the computer.
- 3) Damage to School Property: a student shall not cause or attempt to damage any part of school property. In addition, restitution may be required and/or charges may be filed with the proper authorities.
- 4) Attendance: a student shall attend school in compliance with the compulsory attendance laws of Oklahoma. Students are allowed up to 2 absences per class per semester. Absences exceeding these limits may result in dismissal from the program. Three tardies count as one absence. Excused absences are not allowed unless deemed necessary by the director. Leaving class early for a work obligation may be excused if PREARRANGED with Coach Hawkins. Documentation must be provided from the employer to make these arrangements. Unless approved by Coach Hawkins, any other instances of leaving class early will result in an absence for that day of class.

In addition to meeting the attendance requirements, students must complete Odysseyware course requirements to receive credit for the given class. If the curriculum is not completed at the end of the semester, the student will receive an Incomplete ("I") grade until the coursework is finished, regardless of attendance.

- 5) Assault and/or Battery: physical violence (or the threat of) will not be tolerated.
- 6) Weapons: a student shall not possess, use, or conceal any type of weapon.
- 7) Drugs or Alcohol: No student shall be under the influence or possess any type of drugs or alcohol while at school. This includes cigarettes and vapes.

- 8) Criminal Behavior: this behavior is defined by law to include, but not limited to, assault, battery, larceny, robbery, malicious mischief, vandalism, unlawful assembly, fighting, false alarms and reports, arson, forgery, and gambling.
- 9) Motor Vehicles: a student shall not operate a motor vehicle in a reckless manner on school property.
- 10) Profanity, Obscene Language and Gestures: a student shall not use profanity, obscene language or gestures at school.
- 11) Cult/Gang Behavior: cult or gang behavior through dress, actions, grooming, Jewelry, color, trademark, or any other actions is prohibited.
- 12) Cell Phones: cell phones are not allowed out during class time and are only allowed to be on and used during break times. If a phone is seen or heard by the instructor, it must remain on the teacher's desk or not brought to class at all. The FIRST time a student is caught texting during work time, the student will no longer be allowed to bring a cell phone into the building.
- 13) Excessive Display of Affection: excessive displays of affection will not be tolerated in the classroom, halls or anywhere on school property.
- 14) Visitors: students will have NO VISITORS during class. Parents/Guardians should check in with the teacher upon arrival.
- 15) Closed Campus: upon arriving at BDLA, students are not allowed to leave without permission from the teacher. Students must stay in designated areas at all times while attending school unless accompanied by the instructor. Designated areas are the library, computer lab and the hallway between the Learning Academy classroom and the restrooms located in the JH hallway. Students will only be allowed in the restrooms during the appropriate break times.
- 16) Clothing/Piercings: students will abide by the school dress code. Students shall have ear jewelry only.
- 17) Food/Drink: students are allowed to bring food from home for lunch if students are planning to eat in the cafeteria. Water bottles must be brought in a closed container and opened in front of the teacher upon arrival. NO ENERGY DRINKS ARE ALLOWED. No food/drink are allowed in the computer lab.

However, we wish to offer this to those students who truly need an alternative path to education. Currently, we have 2 students enrolled in the academy and have 3 more potential students that may be enrolled in the second semester.

  - I am requesting a waiver of (70 O.S. 1210.568) for the purpose of meeting the criteria for our Alternative Education program. We are a small rural school district with its own Alternative Education program. Turpin was in an Alternative Education Coop last year with Hooker but that Coop no longer exists. If this waiver is denied Turpin schools would have to try and find several schools to form a Coop to try and reach 10 students. The logistics and distance make that difficult in the panhandle. These are reasons that last year's Coop no longer exists. At this time there are no students in Alternative Education. Turpin has two students that are in credit recovery but we feel that these students can get caught up in house.
- B. List alternate strategies/plans which the district/site proposes, and how this plan will best serve the students of your district, i.e., a description of the educational benefits to the students, graduation rate if a waiver has been awarded prior to this year, and learning achievement. We have Edgenuity that is offered five class periods throughout the day. A student could also be given a device to take these classes if it was deemed more effective for that student to work from home. A student would be set up in the classes that they need. Teachers would monitor their progress. A weekly appointment with our Counselor would be scheduled to help these students stay on track. It has been several years since Turpin has had a student that was in alternative education.

Have you been awarded this waiver before and what was the educational impact to the district: Results of the Statutory Waiver, i.e., effect on student performance levels, impact of plan on other sites in the district. Turpin was in an alternative education coop last year with several schools and Hooker was the LEA. This Coop no longer exists.

NAME OF WAIVER

A. Reason for the Deregulation request. Please include how your students would benefit from this deregulation, what alternative means will have to be employed, and negative effects on your alternative education population if your waiver was to be denied.

Okeene High School is requesting a deregulation of the Alternative Education program based on the needs of our students. After evaluating the alternative education program, we feel that we can best serve our students with a credit recovery program offered throughout our school day. We have a specific room and teacher designated to offer credit recovery to our at-risk students. Students who are participating in this program are given targeted attention in a small group setting. If our students are unable to attend these recovery classes, they may become frustrated trying to catch up in the traditional classroom. Also, these students need an adult frequently checking on their progress and this program allows for the credit recovery teacher to check and mentor them on a daily basis.

B. List alternate strategies/plans which the district/site proposes, and how this plan will best serve the students of your alternative education program, i.e., a description of the educational benefits to the students, graduation rate if a waiver has been awarded prior to this year, and the result of the previous years alternative education audit.

Students who are at-risk of not graduating meet with the high school counselor and principal to discuss options for how to best catch them up. Then a course of instruction plan is made to ensure they are on track for graduation. Programs are assigned after all of this has been discussed and agreed upon. We feel as a school that we can better serve these students in our own building rather than co-oping with a nearby school. It is hard for our students to make accommodations to travel to a nearby school. They also miss out on opportunities to participate in some elective classes when in a full time credit recovery program. We have had little success with the traditional alternative education program. While the program itself has been successful and engaging for our students, they become quickly disconnected from our school community and many end up dropping out when they turn 18.

C. Educational impact to the district: Results of the Statutory Waiver, i.e., effect on student performance levels, and predicted graduation rate.

The past two years have been difficult for many students. Going virtual and getting quarantined has put several students behind and lacking needed credits for graduation. We strongly believe that credit recovery programs will help buffer the effects we have seen the past two years. We can provide a more personalized program that helps students catch up while allowing them to participate in electives and activities going on in the school. These students do not need to be pulled out as much as they need time and help to catch themselves up.

We feel as a school this money is worth investing in our struggling students.

We will be using course completion percentages, STAR Reading scores, ACT, and graduation rates to evaluate our program.

Bennington Public School is requesting a waiver to allow the Alternative Education Program to serve less than 10 students. We are a very small school district and our nearest Coop is 30 miles away. This program has been successful at Bennington and has allowed students to graduate high school when they may not have done so in a traditional setting. It has also allowed students to graduate and receive a diploma after dropping out of school and returning at a later date.

B. List alternate strategies/plans which the district/site proposes, and how this plan will best serve the students of your district, i.e., a description of the educational benefits to the students, graduation rate if a waiver has been awarded prior to this year, and learning achievement.

The alternative program serves at-risk students who may not graduate without this program. We are a small rural school with a high percentage of free and reduced lunches. We serve students such as teen parents, students having to work full-time jobs to help their families, and students taking care of elderly parents or grandparents whom they live with. This program allows students to graduate from high school and pursue future education or join the workforce. At the beginning of the year, we usually only have a student or two. However during the year, we seem to accumulate a few more students that are struggling.

C. Have you participated in an alternative education coop previously? Have you been awarded this walver before and what was the educational impact to the district: Results of the Statutory Walver, i.e., effect on student performance levels, impact of plan on other sites in the district.

Yes, Bennington Public School has participated in an alternative Education coop before. The nearest coop is 30 miles from our school. It was just not a good fit for our students due to the distance they had to travel. Due to distance of the coop and travel time, students missed out on other activities they wanted to participate in. We have received this waiver in the past and we have been very successful with a very high graduation rate. Students scores improved due to the students' desire to remain close to home and be able to receive the help they need from people they love and trust. Our school is pk-12 in one building. The students know all of the teachers and will confide and seek help from the staff.

The class schedule will be 7:50 am -3:30 pm.

The alternative education program will follow the district calendar which is attached.

The alternative program will have direct instruction, tutoring, and software instruction through Study Island, Edmentum, and Courseware.

Life skills, counseling, and career guidance will be offered as well.

E. Any financial impact to the District (positive or negative) for the proposed waiver/deregulation? If positive please describe where the available would be reallocated.

The program is on-site and cost effective due to the savings from transportation cost. The nearest coop is over 30 miles away. The funds saved from the transportation cost will be used to purchase necessary materials for instruction.

F. Describe method of assessment or evaluation of effectiveness of the plan both for staff and students, I.E., TLE, ACT scores, graduation rates, RSA, School Report Card, etc.

We will analyze the graduation rate, the drop-out rate, class completion, attendance data, ACT scores, and the OCCT scores for students.

We will analyze the TLE and School Report Card to measure the effectiveness of the staff.

- A. Reason for the Waiver request. Please include distance from your alternative education site to the closest possible district to coop with, what alternative means will have to be employed if your waiver was to be denied, and what percentage of your student population will benefit from the waiver if approved.
  - Paden has been a member of the Prague Alt Ed Academy for the last 15 or so years. Prague has a new superintendent this year and did not realize that we have been a part of the co-op, so my application was rejected by the SDE to join that co-op since he had already filled out his application that he was not the LEA for any other schools. We discussed it last week after I was informed by the SDE, so we do plan on being part of the Prague Alt Ed Co-op again next year, but for the time being, we have assigned a teacher and have the necessary requirements, curriculum, life-skills, and counselor in place, in the event that we receive a student who is in need of alt ed. (Prague is 7 miles from Paden.)
- B. List alternate strategies/plans which the district/site proposes, and how this plan will best serve the students of your district, i.e., a description of the educational benefits to the students, graduation rate if a waiver has been awarded prior to this year, and learning achievement. Our plan is to house the alt ed students in a seperate classroom, which is located across from the high school. The classroom is a two-room building which would allow the alt ed students privacy and plenty of space for the varied activities required for an alt ed academy. This would best serve the students of our district by keeping them in the district, and allowing them to still see their classmates on a regular basis, if they wish. It would allow a small teacher to student ratio for more one on one time for those students who are already struggling to meet graduation requirements. And since the classroom is at our campus, it would keep students closer to their homes.
- C. Have you participated in an alternative education coop previously? Have you been awarded this waiver before and what was the educational impact to the district: Results of the Statutory Waiver, i.e., effect on student performance levels, impact of plan on other sites in the district. We have participated in the Prague Alt Ed Academy for many years. There was an oversight this year, so we were not able to participate with them, but we intend to go back to that co-op next year. (We have not had to ask for this waiver in the past.)

D. Timeline: Please submit class schedule, calendars, assessment forms and other attachments as necessary.

At this time, we have no students in our alt ed program. Since each alt ed student would need a different class schedule depending on what he/she is lacking in order to graduate, we will individualize each schedule to fit the student. They will follow the same school calendar as our main site, but with abreviated days. (Same holidays and breaks.)



Forgan Public Schools is experiencing a decline in revenue. Our Temporary Appropriations estimate that we will receive about 1.6 million dollars. Our revenue has typically been around the 1.9 to 2 million dollar range. We also get very little formula money, therefore, any of the employee raises over the last several years are an unfunded mandate for us. This situation has caused us to look for ways to save money.

Our school has always belonged to the Hooker School's Alternative Education Program due to the 10 student requirement. Hooker is about 45 miles to the West of Forgan. Forgan has never sent a student to Hooker for any services. Even if we would have had a need, the distance was prohibitive. Hooker received our money and we did not send any students.

Hooker will not have an Alternative Academy for the 2021-2022 school year. We have not had any student or parent request the alternative program nor have any of our students met the qualifications. Our entire student body consists of 112 students from prek-12th grade. The entire staff is a highly qualified staff and more than willing to help any student at any time. In a small community, everyone is aware of everyone's stresses and hardships and the staff will be rescheduled to accommodate the students in an effort for them to be successful and graduate.

We are prepared for the rescheduling and also have Edgenuity (a software for curriculum), Virtual, and online classes.

Marble City Public School is a PreK-8th grade school district that has never had an Alternative Education program and has never received any Alternative Education funding. Previous legislation stated that any school with 7th-12th grade students must offer an Alternative Education program. Legislation also stated "For an elementary school district, which does not offer high school grades, the State Board of Education is authorized at 70 O.S. \$ 1210.586 (F) to grant a waiver from the statutory requirement to implement and provide an Alternative Education program." The legislation goes on to state that "An elementary school district that has not received any Alternative Education funding pursuant to 70 O.S. \$ 1210.568 shall be granted this waiver automatically and need not apply."

B. List alternate strategies/plans which the district/site proposes, and how this plan will best serve the students of your district, i.e., a description of the educational benefits to the students and learning achievement.

Marble City Public School usually has 20 or less 7th and 8th grade students combined on a yearly basis. Our small class size creates student-teacher ratios that are conducive to effective learning for all students, not just at-risk students. Our student-teacher ratio provides the same type of environment that an Alternative Education program would. We also require our students to attend classes all day during a traditional school day which is longer than the 4 hours and 12 minutes required from an Alternative Education program. Finally our classes are taught by certified teachers that are Highly Qualified in core subject areas. Alternative Education teachers are required to be certified teachers but are not restricted to grade-specific or subject-specific areas. We believe that we would be doing our students a disservice by having and Alternative Education program.

C. Any financial impact to the District (positive or negative) for the proposed waiver/deregulation.

Marble City Public School has had a declining student population for several years. The declining student population has resulted in less revenue available for our school. If we were required to add additional staff to implement an Alternative Education program it would severly impact the financial stability of our district.

  - Given our small size, our alternative education program will certainly serve fewer than 10 students. We believe that we are better able to meet the alternative education needs of our students on-site rather than transporting a great distance to a neighboring school system. The closest school system with an alternative education cooperative is more than 30 miles. If our waiver is denied, given the distance to the nearest alternative education cooperative, any alternative education students that we might have would more than likely have to remain in the regular education setting, which could have a negative impact on their academic success. If approved, 100% of participating students would benefit.
- B. List alternate strategies/plans which the district/site proposes, and how this plan will best serve the students of your district, i.e., a description of the educational benefits to the students, graduation rate if a waiver has been awarded prior to this year, and learning achievement.
  We believe that we can better serve our students locally. We have been in a cooperative in the past and have never had any students participate in the program. The main reason for this is due to the distance (45 miles one-way). By serving our own students, we will be able to provide a positive and familiar educational setting. Our alternative education program will use an on-line curriculum along with classroom instruction. We will also provide integration with regular classes to ensure our students are involved in school activities.

A. Reason for the Waiver request. Please include distance from your alternative education site to the closest possible district to coop with, what alternative means will have to be employed if your waiver was to be denied, and what percentage of your student population will benefit from the waiver if approved.

Sperry Public Schools wishes to obtain a waiver for the number of students enrolled in the district alternative education program for the following reasons:

- 1. The district anticipates more students to enroll into the program during the school year, and expects a possible enrollment of 12 students;
- 2. The alternative education program at Sperry High School, taught by Sperry Public School certified staff, provides a minimally disruptive shift from the traditional classroom setting to the alternative education setting, and from the alternative education setting to the traditional setting when that occurs;
- 3. The cooperative alternative education program nearest Sperry Public Schools is that at Sand Springs, which is 18-22 miles from Sperry High School, and would require students to be transported an additional 30 minutes each direction which would like cause additional hardship on the students and increase likelihood of students dropping out; and
- 4. The district is already short-staffed in the transportation department, and an additional driver would be necessary to transport the students to and from the cooperative alternative education site due to the time and distance involved.

To participate in the cooperative alternative education program at Sand Springs, Sperry Schools would need to hire additional transportation staff (the district has had an advertisement posted on its website for transportation staff applications for the past two years and still struggles to staff the routes run daily as it is). The students would move from a familiar setting staffed by familiar teachers to a new, distant place staffed by teachers they do not know, and the shift from the traditional classroom curriculum to that of the alternative education program at Sand Springs would not be as smooth as if the transition were made to the alternative education program here at Sperry. Due to the fact that the district's current fleet of transportation vehicles are also used regularly, at least one additional fleet vehicle may also be required.

Hiring additional transportation staff and a transportation vehicle as well as adding stress to the already at-risk students in Sperry's alternative education program would currently affect 3% of the high school population, and 4% should the alternative education program enrollment increase to 12 students.

B. List alternate strategies/plans which the district/site proposes, and how this plan will best serve the students of your district, i.e., a description of the educational benefits to the students, graduation rate if a waiver has been awarded prior to this year, and learning achievement.

The alternative education program at Sperry High School is developed, maintained, and monitored by the Sperry High School counselor and principal. The program is designed to reduce the dropout rate at Sperry High School, and to that end, the time frame and organization of the program are designed to provide a convenient setting that provides the self-paced ease of an online instructional program with the support from certified teachers and counselor with whom each of the students involved are already familiar. Students enter the alternative education program for a number of reasons that have made the traditional setting of high school stressful or difficult to maintain and often have serious and stressful conditions outside of school; therefore, the district avoids adding to these conditions with the alternative education setting.

Because the curriculum is directed by certified district staff who work closely with the traditional classroom curriculum, the students in the alternative education program are able to receive a similar quality instruction that would be available in the traditional setting.

C. Have you participated in an alternative education coop previously? Have you been awarded this waiver before and what was the educational impact to the district: Results of the Statutory Waiver, i.e., effect on student performance levels, impact of plan on other sites in the district.

Sperry Public Schools has not participated in an alternative education coop previously and this is the first request for this waiver, as the predicted student enrollment in the district's alternative education program has been at 10 or higher. This year's lower enrollment expectation is most likely due to situations stemming from the COVID-19 pandemic and associated disruptions to instructional norms. The district expects alternative education enrollment numbers to return to the expected 10-12 per school year after public education in Oklahoma evolves into a state of normalcy.

D. Timeline: Please submit class schedule, calendars, assessment forms and other attachments as necessary.

The alternative education students in Sperry High School Alternative Academy attend Monday through Thursday from 4:00 PM to 7:15 PM. Alternative education students follow the district approved 2021-2022 school calendar (attached) for days to be in session, beginning and ending of grading periods, holidays and breaks, parent-teacher conference days, and beginning and ending of the school year. Each succeeding year of the deregulation will follow the district approved calendar for that year as well.

E. Any financial impact to the District (positive or negative) for the proposed walver/deregulation? If positive please describe where the available would be reallocated.

The financial impact to the district will be a total cost of about \$40,000.00 in salaries and benefits for the certified teachers and counselor.

F. Describe method of assessment or evaluation of effectiveness of the plan both for staff and students, I.E., TLE, ACT scores, graduation rates, RSA, School Report Card, etc.

Each student will take a pre-instruction and a post-instruction assessment each semester. The above plans are much more successful for our students than transporting 30 minute in the am and 30 minutes in the pm for students to just sit in a classroom alone working on a computer with little interaction. STudents need interaction to make change.
