SUBJECT: Statutory Waiver Concerning Cooperative Agreements for Alternative Education

The following schools are requesting a statutory waiver of 70 O.S. 1210.568, which requires them to enter into a cooperative agreement with another school district if enrollment in their alternative education program is less than ten (10) students. Approval is recommended.

#### Section 915. Alternative Education Programs - Statewide System.

- A. Beginning with the first semester of the 1996-1997 school year, the State Board of Education shall implement a statewide system of alternative education programs which shall be phased-in within seven (7) years. The statewide system shall include but not be limited to Alternative Approaches grant programs, funded pursuant to Section 1210.561 of this title, and alternative academies or alternative programs implemented pursuant to this section.
- B. Beginning with the first semester of the 2002-2003 school year, all school districts of this state shall provide alternative education programs that conform to the requirements of statutes and rules applicable to alternative education. A program shall:
  - 1. Allow class sizes and student/teacher ratios which are conducive to effective learning for at-risk students;
  - 2. Incorporate appropriate structure, curriculum, and interaction and reinforcement strategies designed to provide effective instruction;
  - 3. Include an intake and screening process to determine eligibility of students;
  - 4. Demonstrate that teaching faculty are appropriately licensed or certified teachers;
  - 5. Demonstrate that teaching faculty have been selected on the basis of a record of successful work with atrisk students or personal and educational factors that qualify them for work with at-risk students;
  - 6. Reflect appropriate collaborative efforts with state agencies and local agencies serving youth;
  - 7. Provide courses that meet the academic curricula standards adopted by the State Board of Education and additional remedial courses;
  - 8. Offer individualized instruction;
  - 9. State clear and measurable program goals and objectives;
  - 10. Include counseling and social services components with the provision that providers of services are not required to be certified as school counselors;
  - 11. Require a plan leading to graduation be developed for each student in the program which will allow the student to participate in graduation exercises for the school district after meeting the requirements of the school district as specified in the individual graduation plan for that student; provided, for students who enter the ninth grade in or prior to the 2007-08 school year, the plan shall specifically address whether the student is required to meet the graduation requirements established in Section 11-103.6 of this title;
  - 12. Offer life skills instruction;
  - 13. Provide opportunities for arts education to students, including Artists in Residence programs coordinated with the Oklahoma Arts Council;
  - 14. Provide a proposed annual budget;
  - 15. Include an evaluation component including an annual written self-evaluation;
  - 16. Be appropriately designed to serve middle school, junior high school and secondary school students in grades six through twelve who are most at risk of not completing a high school education for a reason other than that identified in Section 13-101 of this title; and
  - 17. Allow students in the alternative education program, who otherwise meet all of the participation requirements, to participate in vocational programs and extracurricular activities, including but not limited to athletics, band, and clubs.
- C. The alternative education program of a school district shall be operational and serving students by September 15 of each school year.
- D. Each alternative education program of a school district shall receive funding based on the combined number of dropouts and students within the district who have been referred to a county juvenile service unit, a county juvenile bureau or who have been committed to the custody of the Office of Juvenile Affairs. Each alternative education program shall receive incentive funding as follows:
  - 1. For the first year of operation, One Thousand Dollars (\$1,000.00) per student;


- 2. For the second year of operation, Seven Hundred Fifty Dollars (\$750.00) per student; and
- 3. For the third year of operation and each year thereafter, Seven Hundred Dollars (\$700.00) per student.

Statewide alternative education funding shall not be used to supplant existing school district resources or to support programs that do not meet all the criteria for the statewide alternative education system. No alternative education program shall receive less than a total of Ten Thousand Dollars (\$10,000.00) per school year.

- E. By September 15 of each school year, all statewide alternative education funds received and expended for students participating in an alternative education program shall be reported to the State Department of Education by major object codes and by program classifications pursuant to the Oklahoma Cost Accounting System as adopted by the State Board of Education pursuant to Section 5-135 of this title.
- F. Elementary school districts, as defined in Section 5-103 of this title, may request a waiver from the State Board of Education from the requirements of this section to implement and provide an alternative education program. Any elementary school district that has not received funding pursuant to the provisions of subsection D of this section shall be automatically granted a waiver. If a school district is granted a waiver, no statewide alternative education funding shall be allocated to the district.
- G. 1. The State Board of Education shall contract for technical assistance for operation of an Alternative Education Technical Assistance Center. The technical assistance provider shall be an entity located in Oklahoma that has been officially recognized by the United States Department of Education to assess and facilitate dissemination of validated educational programs in Oklahoma. The technical assistance provider shall have priority, if its operations are deemed satisfactory by the State Board of Education and if funds are available, for annual renewal of the contract.
  - 2. The duties of the technical assistance provider shall include, but shall not be limited to:
    - a. providing initial and ongoing training of personnel who will educate at-risk populations through alternative education programs,
    - b. providing technical assistance to school districts to enhance the probability of success of their alternative education programs,
    - c. evaluating state-funded alternative education programs,
    - d. reporting to the State Board of Education the evaluation results of state-funded alternative education programs, and
    - providing in-depth program analysis and evaluation of state-funded alternative education programs.
  - 3. The State Board of Education shall not provide funding to an alternative education program that does not receive a recommendation for continued funding in the evaluation provided for in this subsection. Provided, any school district not receiving such a recommendation for continued funding may request a hearing before the Board with a review of the evaluation prior to the Board's final determination.
- H. All alternative education programs shall be subject to statutes and rules applicable to alternative education, including any exemptions from statutory or regulatory requirements authorized by statutes or rule.
- I. An alternative education program may be offered by an individual school district or may be offered jointly by school districts that have formed interlocal cooperative agreements pursuant to Section 5-117b of this title. Any school district submitting a plan for an alternative education program serving fewer than ten students shall enter into a cooperative agreement with another school district to jointly provide the program unless the program has been granted a waiver from this requirement by the State Board of Education.

- J. Any materials or equipment purchased by a school district with revenue received for students participating in an alternative education program shall be used only in or directly for the alternative education program offered by the district or any subsequent alternative education program offered to students enrolled in that district. Such materials and equipment shall be made available exclusively to alternative education students during the hours that the alternative education program is operating; provided, the material or equipment may be used for other purposes when the alternative education program is not operating.
- K. Upon implementation of this subsection as provided for in subsection M of this section and contingent upon the provision of appropriated funds designated for such purpose, all school districts in the state providing alternative education programs as required in subsection B of this section shall expand the programs to include middle-school-grade students. The program shall conform to the requirements of subsection B of this section.
- L. Upon implementation of this subsection as provided for in subsection M of this section and contingent upon the provision of appropriated funds designated for such purpose, each urban school district identified by the State Department of Education as having a high population of elementary grade students who are at-risk and in need of alternative education shall provide elementary level alternative education programs. The State Department of Education shall establish requirements for the programs. For purposes of this section, "urban school district" means a school district with an average daily membership of thirty thousand (30,000) or more.
- M. Implementation of subsections K and L of this section shall be delayed until the current expenditure per pupil in average daily attendance in public elementary and secondary schools in unadjusted dollars for the 1998-99 school year or any school year thereafter for Oklahoma, as reported by the National Center for Education Statistics annually in the Digest of Education Statistics, reaches at least ninety percent (90%) of the regional average expenditure for that same year, and funds are provided. For purposes of this subsection, the regional average expenditure shall consist of the current expenditure per pupil in average daily attendance in public elementary and secondary schools in unadjusted dollars for each of the following states: Arkansas, Colorado, Kansas, Missouri, New Mexico, Oklahoma, and Texas, averaged together. By January 1 of each year, the State Board of Education shall report whether or not the ninety-percent expenditure level has been reached based on information reported annually in the Digest of Education Statistics by the National Center for Education Statistics. Subsections K and L of this section shall be implemented on July 1 after the first January 1 report verifies that the ninety-percent expenditure level has been reached and funds have been provided for the specific purposes of this section. - A. Reason for the Waiver request. Please include distance from your alternative education site to the closest possible district to coop with, what alternative means will have to be employed if your waiver was to be denied, and what percentage of your student population will benefit from the waiver if approved.
  - Gracemont is a small school district without any current students in a alternative education program. The district has participated in coops with other districts in the past, but those districts no longer want to coop. We are very capable of serving any student who may need the alternative education setting according to our submitted plan through distance learning and scheduled activities within the school such as counseling and library access.
- B. List alternate strategies/plans which the district/site proposes, and how this plan will best serve the students of your district, i.e., a description of the educational benefits to the students, graduation rate if a waiver has been awarded prior to this year, and learning achievement. Gracemont Public Schools will serve any student in need of alternative school placement through distance learning that will include all required core content and art instruction, counseling services with daily access when necessary, and access to library media sources as needed. We are asking for a waiver to serve less than 10 students because historically we have not had many students in need of alternative placement.

C. Have you participated in an alternative education coop previously? Have you been awarded this waiver before and what was the educational impact to the district: Results of the Statutory Waiver, i.e., effect on student performance levels, impact of plan on other sites in the district. We have participated in a coop in the past, but the district is no longer capable of doing the coop with us. We are capable of serving any student who may need the alternative setting. Because we know our students much better than teachers at a cooperating district, we will serve that student who may need alternative placement more effectively and work to get him/her to be successful and return to the regular education setting.

Chisholm Public Schools previously attended the Garfield County alternative school co-op, but was not invited with the Enid Public Schools alternative school plan. Therefore we have been left on an island by ourselves. Additionally, there is an option to co-op with Pond Creek Hunter, but that is a significant distance to travel. Also, Chisholm Public Schools has historically had a low student population involved in the Alternative School program. Records indicate that last year we only had one student who attended Alternative for less than 50 days.

B. List alternate strategies/plans which the district/site proposes, and how this plan will best serve the students of your district, i.e., a description of the educational benefits to the students, graduation rate if a waiver has been awarded prior to this year, and learning achievement.

Chisholm Public Schools is currently changing secondary leadership with a new high school principal, high school counselor, high school assistant principal, and district superintendent. With all of these changes, we feel that we have implemented several academic strategies that will quickly identify and provide intervention for at-risk students. Changes include: a new bell schedule that works more efficiently with our local career tech and local junior college, several staff changes in secondary math, english and history, a credit recovery system for students to quickly recover previously failed classes, 1 - 1 chromebooks for all students, and several other academic strategies. Also, Chisholm Public Schools has placed a significant emphasis on student attendance for this coming school year by rewarding students with 90-100% attendance.

C. Have you participated in an alternative education coop previously? Have you been awarded this waiver before and what was the educational impact to the district: Results of the Statutory Waiver, i.e., effect on student performance levels, impact of plan on other sites in the district.

Yes. Chisholm Public Schools previously co-oped with other Garfiled County schools for many years. Unfortunately, we were not invited to the new Garfield County alternative school co-op, and are too far away to co-op with Pond Creek - Hunter Public Schools.

I am writing this letter on behalf of the Chisholm Public School District requesting a formal deregulation waiver from alternative education for the upcoming 2022-2023 school year. This decision was made official at our recent CPS board meeting on Wednesday, August 3<sup>rd</sup>, 2022.

There are multiple reasons as to why we are requesting this waiver, and these reasons are highlighted below.

- CPS and CHS administration have recently spoken to Mrs. Corn and Mrs. Fraizer from the OKSDE about our current status. Mrs. Corn and Mrs. Fraizer both feel that a deregulation waiver for CPS is the appropriate move for this 22-23 school year.
- CPS was previously a partner in the Garfield County Alternative School co-op for many years. Unfortunately, the Garfield County co-op has since dissolved and that option is not currently available.
  - o There is not a viable co-op option for CPS. Pond Creek-Hunter has offered to house us, but that is a significant distance to travel for our students.
- After researching recent student data, we believe that there would be a very low number of students (less than 10) that would actually benefit from starting up our own Alternative School at CPS. Continuing, the past two school years we have only had one student attend the Alternative School and that particular student only attended less than 50 days.
  - O Again, after researching our current reality, we believe that we can serve the needs of our students with our existing programs.

In conclusion, please know that Chisholm Public Schools does believe in the Oklahoma Alternative School program and will seek to have a stronger presence is future years. Although, and unfortunately, we need to pursue this de-regulation waiver for the 2022-2023 school year.

- A. Reason for the Waiver request. Please include distance from your alternative education site to the closest possible district to coop with, what alternative means will have to be employed if your waiver was to be denied, and what percentage of your student population will benefit from the waiver if approved.
  - The Alternative School for Wilburton has been very beneficial for our students. Wilburton is requesting a one year waiver to continue the alternative school setting to the benefit of our school. The closest coop would be 35 miles away at McAlester and transportation would not be feasible. If the waiver is denied our at-risk students would be enrolled into the traditional school setting which has proven to be ineffective for their needs. We expect nearly 5% of our students could utilize the alternative school at some point duiring the year.
- B. List alternate strategies/plans which the district/site proposes, and how this plan will best serve the students of your district, i.e., a description of the educational benefits to the students, graduation rate if a waiver has been awarded prior to this year, and learning achievement. The students being served in the alternative education program will have the opportunity to come to school with a modified schedule. Students may arrive on or after 8:00 a.m. to complete their lessons. The online plaform will grant additional flexibility to our students if they choose to work outside of school hours. Students may choose to enroll in elective classes of fulfill graduation requirements. Students will be able to participate in all extra-curricular activities adn electives to make for a more traditional school setting. Students will be able to continue involvement in class sponsored activities while also having additional access to a counselor that would be more than the normal enrollment plan.
- C. Have you participated in an alternative education coop previously? Have you been awarded this walver before and what was the educational impact to the district: Results of the Statutory Walver, i.e., effect on student performance levels, impact of plan on other sites in the district. In years past we have hosted a coop. Wilburton has not appplied for this waiver before due to a larger enrollment. When it was reloacted on campus the other schools in our county chose to retain their funds and operate on their own and not pursue a coop. The past results of the alternative school for Wilburton has been beneficial in helping students stay on track for graduation.

- E. Any financial impact to the District (positive or negative) for the proposed waiver/deregulation? If positive please describe where the available would be reallocated. By establishing an in-house alternative program we have created a financial strain on our school. Though our program has proven to be beneficial we do only serve a small percentage while paying a certified teacher. It is however necessary to offer the program for our school. An increasing effect has been the incorrect student coding which has kept our program from being funded for the past tow years. We are working to correct this matter for the 23-24 school year.
- F. Describe method of assessment or evaluation of effectiveness of the plan both for staff and students, I.E., TLE, ACT scores, graduation rates, RSA, School Report Card, etc.

  Our alternative education teacher will be evaluated using the TLE framework, rubrics and forms. We will provide the students the necessary tools of prepare for the ACT or other testing depending on their future plans for attending a trade school or college. We feel that assisting the at-risk students in as many ways as possible will increase graduation rates, decrease the number of dropouts and serve to build positive relations with alternative school program.

### Admissions

### Who is eligible for this program?

Students between the ages of 14 and 21 may apply to Wilburton Alternative School if they meet one or more of the following requirements:

- One or more years behind grade level
- Students who have dropped out of school
- Students who are married
- Students who are pregnant or parenting

Suspended or expelled students are not eligible during the term of the suspension or expulsion. Students who qualify for special education services are not usually eligible under special education mandates. Transfer students will not be accepted.

The two admission dates for Wilburton Alternative Academy are August and January. The only exceptions to this rule are those students that are referred by Wilburton High School and are still in compliance with Oklahoma Attendance laws for the current semester.

Students must fill out an application, go through an interview and then may be accepted to the program. If the student is currently enrolled in a school, they should NOT withdraw from school until they have been accepted to Wilburton Alternative School. Acceptance and enrollment at Wilburton Alternative School is based on the above criteria, the interview, and on availability of space. There is often a waiting period (after returning the application) before an interview is scheduled. There is no guarantee a student will be accepted to the program.

If enrolled in Wilburton Alternative School, the student will be expected to attend school promptly everyday and make progress in earning academic credits for graduation each semester.

With our rural setting our teachers will be here to help ensure student success and provide assistance with any areas in which they are stuggling. Our new online program will also allow the choice of 30 new elective areas to those students that they would otherwise miss the opportunity.

We are able to closely monitor attendance as well students meeting the class time requirements.





Okeene High School is requesting a deregulation of the Alternative Education program based on the needs of our students. We have a specific room and teacher designated to offer credit recovery to our at-risk students. Students who are participating in this program are given targeted attention in a small group setting. If our students are unable to attend these recovery classes, they may become frustrated trying to catch up in the traditional classroom. Also, these students need an adult frequently checking on their progress and this program allows for the credit recovery teacher to check and mentor them on a daily basis.

Okeene had previously had a co-op with Canton Public Schools. Canton is located 16 miles from Okeene. This was a wonderful program to work with, but the alternative education team didn't feel like it met the needs of all of our struggling students. The students who attended this program missed several electives offered at our school. These students are now able to attend these classes while making up credits in our credit recovery program. This also allows them to be included in school activities and events. We currently have 12 students using our Credit Recovery program. That is close to 11% of our high school students who are benefiting from this program.

2. List alternate strategies/plans which the district/site proposes, and how this plan will best serve the students of your district, i.e., a description of the educational benefits to the students, graduation rate if a waiver has been awarded prior to this year, and learning achievement.

Students who are at-risk of not graduating meet with the high school counselor and principal to discuss options for how to best catch them up. Then a course of instruction plan is made to ensure they are on track for graduation. Programs are assigned after all of this has been discussed and agreed upon. We feel as a school that we can better serve these students in our own building rather than co-oping with a nearby school. It is hard for our students to make accommodations to travel to a nearby school. They also miss out on opportunities to participate in some elective classes when in a full time credit recovery program. We have had little success with the traditional alternative education program. While the program itself has been successful and engaging for our students, they become quickly disconnected from our school community and many end up dropping out when they turn 18.

3. Have you participated in an alternative education coop previously? Have you been awarded this waiver before and what was the educational impact to the district: Results of the Statutory Waiver, i.e., effect on student performance levels, impact of plan on other sites in the district.

Yes, we have had a co-op with Canton Public Schools before. We were awarded a waiver last school year. The credit recovery program we implemented helped 5 of our seniors graduate last school year. This is 26% of our graduating class. Without this program I strongly feel that 2-3 of those students would not have graduated with their senior class. This plan does not affect other school sites. This plan helps our students recover needed credits while allowing them to experience a normal high school environment.

We Star test all students enrolled in Okeene JH/HS. We look and compare reading levels 3-4 times per year. We also look at the progression of students in our Edgenuity program. We are able to closely monitor this to make sure students are on track and keeping up with the pace of the class.

5.. Any financial impact to the District (positive or negative) for the proposed waiver/deregulation? If positive please describe where the available would be reallocated.

Our credit recovery teacher is being funded by ESSA funds. This has allowed us to hire additional teachers that will help students who are struggling. We will receive no funding for alternative education. This credit recovery program will negatively impact the school after the ESSA funds run out. We feel as a school this money is worth investing in our struggling students.

7. Describe method of assessment or evaluation of effectiveness of the plan both for staff and students, I.E., TLE, ACT scores, graduation rates, RSA, School Report Card, etc.

We will be using course completion percentages, STAR Reading scores, ACT, and graduation rates to evaluate our program.



The closest Alternative program (for a possible Coop agreement) to our school is 19 miles away. If we do not receive a waiver, we will probably be forced to serve kids that need Alternative Ed in far too traditional approaches that likely haven't been successful to begin with for these students. This could potentially benefit about 3% of our students.

B. List alternate strategies/plans which the district/site proposes, and how this plan will best serve the students of your district, i.e., a description of the educational benefits to the students, graduation rate if a waiver has been awarded prior to this year, and learning achievement.

We will be using the Edmentum Courseware curriculum and will be serving these students with only two teachers that will serve alternative students. We will also be using packaged curriculum from HMH and several other resources. Although I am new to this position, this district has had a previous waiver and it was apparently successful. I don't believe graduation rate has fallen below 100% in years in which an alternative program has been in place. Test data for alternative students is within 10 percentage points of regular ed students in previous alternative ed years.

We have previously participated in a Cooperative with Canadian Public Schools, but frankly, I'm not comfortable with the distance between our facilities (60.3 miles). Previous year alternative referred students had no viable option for another physical facility.



We have seven students at the present time that we know will be in the Alternative Education program but expect to have more than ten within a few weeks of the begin of school start date. We are about ten miles from the nearest school with a program but they are full. We were advised to request a less than 10 student waiver just in case we do not have 10 students by September 1.

We have a strong Alternative Education program and we will continue to serve each student with our best means and intentions. Having fewer than 10 students in the program would mean more one on one time with each student.

Yes, we were part of a COOP several years back but they decided to begin their own Alternative Education program and we became a stand alone program. We have not had to request a waiver in the past (that I know of).
