

List of Professional Development Programs for Use of RSA Funds

To meet the requirements of 70 O.S. § 1210.508D, the OSDE has developed a list of professional development programs that are evidence-based and directly address the cognitive science of how students learn to read. Districts that receive more than \$2500 in RSA funding must spend at least 10% of that funding on professional development addressing instruction in the science of reading from the OSDE provided list below.

Process Used to Approve Professional Development Programs

A review team comprised of Oklahoma educators and administrators were identified to evaluate professional development programs based on the following criteria:

- Content focuses on one or more grade levels within the prekindergarten through grade 5 range.
- The primary focus of the content addresses instruction of literacy components as identified by the National Reading Panel or supporting documents from the Institute of Educational Sciences.
- The program strives to replace ineffective instructional practices for reading with evidence-informed literacy practices.
- The program addresses knowledge about the science of reading.

The review team members represented a diverse population and a variety of roles within districts across the state. Each member of the review team received prior training in the science of reading and were familiar with the core components needed in effective professional development for this topic.

The OSDE reached out to vendors identified by school districts as professional development providers in district Reading Sufficiency Act Annual District Reading Plans submitted in the 2021-22 school year. To the extent possible, vendors that provided professional development programs that address reading instruction were invited to submit any program(s) they felt appropriate for review. Other vendors that had previously reached out to the OSDE inquiring about approval for professional development were also invited to submit programs for review.

A Request for Information (RFI) will be conducted this fall to allow vendors an additional opportunity to submit their programs for review and evaluation. Any additional programs determined to meet these requirements will be added to the list and updated in January 2023.
