- All Child Nutrition Programs are voluntary
- Important questions
 - Does your charter school want to offer meals to the students? If so, which meals?
 - If meals are offered, is each site going to be self-operating or contracted?



- Self-Operating
 - School is responsible for preparing and serving meals
- Contract
 - May contract with a school district participating in Child Nutrition Programs or with a Food Service Management Company
 - There are special procurement regulations if school district is under a Food Service Management Company



- Completion <u>and</u> Approval of Application/Agreement/Policy Statement
- Distribution <u>and</u> Approval of Free/Reduced-price Applications
- Participation in Direct Certification
- Issuance of Free/Reduced-price benefits to families

- Serving meals which meet USDA requirements
- Counting meals by type and category daily
- Recordkeeping requirements
- Numerous reports



- Year #1
 - Federal Reimbursement for meals served and claimed
 - Check with the Department of Human Services regarding commodities
- Year #2
 - Apply for the After-School Snack Program (ASSP)
 - Eligible to receive State Matching funding



- Year #2 (continued)
 - Elementary Sites can apply for the Fresh Fruit and Vegetable Program Grant
 - For counting and claiming alternative, you have the option to implement: Provisions 1, 2, or 3
 - Community Eligibility Program (CEP)
 - Talk with your Field Consultant or call the State Agency for more details

Federal Reimbursements deposited into account chosen by the charter school

 State Matching funds are deposited into the Sponsor's Account
