## SUPPLEMENTAL PROGRAMS REPORTING CODES AND DEFINITIONS FOR MIGRANT EDUCATION

**Supplemental Programs are defined as services above and beyond the basic educational program provided by the local school district. The supplemental programs should reflect the current programs in which the student is participating.**

*NOTE: The supplemental program code 015 (Schoolwide) is no longer being used.  
If a student is served in special education please use code 021.*

### ***001 English as a Second Language***

Services designed to develop those English language experiences, language skills, and communicative competencies that are required to learn content in a classroom where English is the language used for instruction.

### ***002 Bilingual***

A structured program of services designed to provide content in a student's first language with special support in the transfer of learning skills and concepts from their first language to the English language.

### ***003 Tutorial Math***

Services in mathematics for individual students or pupils in a small group setting which is tutorial in nature.

### ***004 Tutorial Reading***

Services in reading for individual students or pupils in a small group setting which is tutorial in nature.

### ***005 Tutorial Secondary***

General services (other than those that can be coded to reading, math, and other language arts) provided for individuals or small groups of secondary students.

### ***006 Preschool***

Services designed to develop the psychomotor, cognitive, and affective skills of children (usually prekindergarten) through a wide range of educational and developmental activities.

### ***007 Vocational Education***

Services, including prevocational, designed to provide training and development of skills that are required for gainful employment in a skilled or technical occupation.

### ***008 Career Education***

Services designed to develop an awareness of career options, work values, work seeking, work getting skills, and career decision-making skills in relation to student ability and interest. These services may also include related "life skills" components.

**009 NOT USED**

**010 Work Study**

Programs which provide students with general and specific occupational skills through a combination of supervised employment in an occupational field and related classroom instruction.

**011 General Educational Development (GED)/High School Equivalency**

Services designed to assist students in obtaining the equivalent of a high school diploma.

**012 Reading**

Services in reading which are usually provided in a classroom setting.

**013 Mathematics**

Services in mathematics which are usually provided in a classroom setting.

**014 Other Language Arts**

Services designed to develop writing, speaking, and listening skills that are not offered as part of an ELL or Bilingual program.

**015 Schoolwide Program – NOT USED**

**016 Tutorial Elementary**

General services (other than reading, math, and other language arts) provided for individual or small groups of elementary students.

**017 Health Education/Safety**

Services designed to develop knowledge and awareness of physical, social, and environmental factors affecting health and safety of the individual student.

**018 Computer Literacy**

Services designed to develop skills in the operation and use of the computer.

**019 Multicultural**

Programs designed to provide awareness and create acceptance of national and ethnic cultures.

**020 Special Activities**

Short term activities which provide opportunities for student participation such as field trips, summer camp, music, arts and crafts, leadership and training, etc.

**021 Special Education (with IEP)**
